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Send in the clowns sheet music

The advent of digital music files revolutionized the music industry. With such files, you can make perfect copies of your favorite songs, which can be easily purchased and downloaded from websites. Due to their relatively small size - anywhere from 1 megabyte to 10 megabytes per song depending on length and sound quality - digital music files can be easily linked to emails that can be shared. Open your web browser and surf to Apple.com/itunes. Click the Free Download button and follow the instructions to install the latest version of iTunes on your computer. The program will work on both PCs and Macs. Open iTunes and click the iTunes Store link in the column to the left of the iTunes Main Library window. The link is just below the store heading. Clicking this link opens a connection to the Apple Computer iTunes Music Store. Browse the artists and music types that can be downloaded from the iTunes Music Store, and try tracks from albums and collections until you find music you'd like to buy. Click the Buy button to the right of the song you'd like to buy, and the download process will begin. Open your email program, or access your web-based email account, start writing a new email, and then attach the digital audio file to the email. This can often be done by clicking a button marked with Attach in your e-mail program or web-based service, and by using the included search window that appears to find your digital audio file. Once the file is attached to the e-mail message, simply send the e-mail and the file will accompany it. Open your web browser and surf to Amazon.com. In the list of links in the upper-left corner of the site, hover the mouse pointer over the Digital Downloads link, and then select MP3 downloads from the list of options that appear. Browse music selection by clicking categories listed in the column along the left side of the page, or search for specific titles or artists by entering a name in the search window near the top of the page (just to the left of the orange Go button). Click the Buy MP3 button next to the track you want to buy to start downloading the process. If you want to download an entire album of songs, click the orange Buy MP3 album with the 1-Click button to the right of the album art. Follow the instructions in step 4 of section 1 to attach the file to an e-mail message. Open your web browser and surf to Amiestreet.com. Click the Sign Up Now for Free button to begin the free process of joining Amie Street. This will allow a user to purchase tracks from the website. Browse the website to find a track you'd like to download by hovering over the Browse music link at the top of the site, and then select the style of music you'd like to browse by clicking it in the pop-up list that Search for specific artists by entering their names in the box near the top of the website on the right side. The field is filled with the phrase Find Music ... Click the blue Buy song button to the right of the song. You will be directed to a new screen to arrange payment. The minimum order on Amie Street is \$3, so you can keep adding songs until you reach that amount, or you can allow the balance to be saved on the site for future purchases. Follow the instructions in step 4 of section 1 to attach the file to an e-mail message. Sheet music is the format in which songs are written down. Notes begin with blank music loss paper consisting of graphs with five lines and four spaces, each representing a note. Songwriters who compose songs in standard musical notation use staff paper to create sheet music, which can then be passed on to musicians who interpret sheet music for a musical performance. Today, it's easier than ever to make your own sheet music. With notation software such as Finale, or the free web-based Noteflight service, anyone can turn their musical ideas into professional sheet music. Use Noteflight to get started (see Resources). Noteflight is a free web-based music notation service that allows you to write, print and even save your notes as music files for playback. Noteflight has a clean, easy-to-use interface that allows even a beginner to create a song in sheet music. Because Noteflight allows you to listen to what you've written, you can experiment with different notes until you create something that sounds good even if you're not familiar with music composition. Create a Noteflight account and sign in to start creating your notes. You can start writing your song right away. Click New Score at the top of the page located on a toolbar to create an empty note document. Select whether notes should be private or shared. Noteflight presents you with an empty note sheet in Key of C with a 4/4 time signature. Click Edit Title at the top of your sheet music, and type the name of your song, and then click Edit Composer and type your name. On the Score menu with the Change Time Signature or Change Key Signature command, make the necessary changes to your key signature or time signature. Add notes and rests to your notes by clicking on the blank music staff. A notehead appears, and you can drag and click where you want the note to appear. You can also use the floating palette to select different note durations. When you insert your notes, Noteflight automatically reformats notes to keep the correct number of beats per bar. To listen to what you typed at any time, go to the Play menu and select the playback option you want. Print sheet music when you're done composing your song. The result will be a professional of your song composition. You can also use Noteflight to create an audio file with your composition. With Noteflight, you can assign actual instrument sounds to the appropriate parts. Go to File and select Export to save the finished notes as an MP3 or wav file. When the phone is connected correctly, it must be recognized by the computer as a removable storage device. Go to My Computer and click the phone icon under the portable devices section that says Removable Storage Devices. Access your computer's music folder and go to the song files you want to move to your phone. Check, click each music file you want to send to your phone. Ctrl-clicking can be done by holding the CTRL command on the keyboard and clicking over each song file simultaneously. Maximize your phone's removable storage window. Drag and drop the highlighted song files to your phone's removable storage window.
