Hassan replies with the words: For you a thousand times more than. Hassan gets it, but then he's raped in an alley by Assef, a boy who hates Hassan for Origin. Amir saw this, but ran away. Because of his feelings of guilt and shame, Amir Hassan doesn't want to see. He puts money and a watch under Hassan's pillow, hoping that his father, Baba, sends Ali and Hassan away. Baba doesn't, but Ali and Hassan are going anyway. Four years later, later, Russians invade Afghanistan and Baba and Amir have to flee to Pakistan. From there, they go to America, where they try to build a new life. After a while, Baba is diagnosed with incurable cancer. He refuses life-support treatments. Before his death, Amir married a girl named Soraya. After years, Amir gets a call from Rahim Khan, Baba's longtime friend. He asks him to come to Pakistan, because there is a way to be good again. Amir is told by Rahim Khan that he and Hassan were half-brothers and that he has to go back to Kabul to secure Hassan's son Sohrab. Hassan himself and his wife were shot by the Taliban. Amir tries to find Sohrab in an orphanage, but there he is told that Sohrab is taken away by a Taliban general, who rapes him. Amir goes to the general, who turns out to be Assef. Assef wants them to fight, with only one going out of that fight alive. Thanks to Sohrab shooting with a catapult at Assef, Amir can escape with the boy. He injures the Amir unconscious. Back in Pakistan, Amir discovered Rahim Khan wanted Amir himself to take Sohrab with him to the U.S. He is trying to give Sohrab a visa, but without success. He tells Sohrab that the only option is for the boy to go back to an orphanage, something Sohrab does not want. Sohrab tries to kill himself, but survives. Eventually, thanks to an Afghan friend in America, Sohrab gets a visa and they go to America. Unfortunately, all Sohrab does is sleep. He has no joy in his life. Six months later, Amir, Soraya and Sohrab attend an Afghan meeting. There was a kite-fighting tournament and Amir and Sohrab weaving together. Sohrab finally laughs. Amir asks if he should run for the kite and Sohrab nodded. Amir replies with the words: A thousand times over for you. From whose perspective is the story told? The story is told by an adult Amir, the main character. Why did you choose this book? I chose this book because I was triggered by the text on the back of it.
