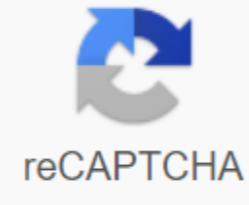




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This second edition of the useful Power Basics series is stronger and easier to use. Aiming for an audience of students, which is usually discouraged by the length and complexity of traditional textbooks, this series offers the essentials of a high junior or senior curriculum (content level), with legibility below the level (4th grade). Students build literacy and critical thinking skills as they interpret, evaluate, analyze and synthesize scientific information. They also apply these skills in their daily lives. Step-by-step lessons can be managed with examples Defined. Workbook activities provide frequent practices and reviews, while supporting different learning styles. Traditional manuals are usually written for an above-average reader, cover a wide range of content and are filled with photos, illustrations and other For some students the amount of material is overwhelming, the visual elements are distracting and the fast pace is unnerving. Power Basics has simplified the manual approach while presenting essential content (adherence to NSE standards) that allows students to succeed. The program has four components: student card, workbook, teacher's guide, and test package. Unique packages containing all four components for a slightly discounted price are also available. Repeatable, recognized icons are used throughout the series. Each student book (of different lengths) is divided into units each of which has a series of lessons on related topics, with a lesson for each subject. Each lesson begins with a clear, student-centered goal and a list of words to know entered into lessons. (The definitions of words in vocabulary are included in the glossary found in both the teacher's guide and the student book.) There is a brief introduction to the subject, followed by an instructive text presenting essential information in short, easy-to-understand sections. This is followed by a practical activity (set of questions) that allows students to apply what they have just learned. Each unit ends with a review (multiple-choice questions) and several application activities. Student text has several special features: Think about it - ask students to use critical thinking skills, Tip - useful suggestions to help memorize certain information and Real-Life showing the material connects to their own lives. Although I save, graphics & charts are interspersed throughout the text, which also has an accent color. A summary of the rules and other important information, a pronunciation-guided glossary and an index make up the reference section that accompanies each student text. Some examples of application activities in the text of World Geography: reading maps in newspapers; learning European customs, languages, phrases; scanning newspapers and news for a week for stories about Russia, Central Asia and the Middle East; or pretending that you are on a panel to decide whether Antarctica should be considered a continent. For each lesson, the consumable workbook offers a variety of practice and extension activities, especially geared towards different learning styles.

Answers are provided in a separate key. Some of the activities in the World Geography series: learn the location & time zones, read the passage and the complete diagram on changes over time, do a crossword puzzle (a frequent activity) about political division in Europe, read the diagram and answer questions, read the tour description and write research the Volga River and some cities it passes through, choose a city and create a advertising poster. , create a climatograph by tracing the precipitation and temperature in the chart, and then answer the questions. The teacher's guide provides an overview of each unit with suggestions for expansion as well as a fully key response to all practice activities & unit reviews. A chart is also provided that shows that the material is correlated manually with the tasks of the workbook. The guide includes duplicates of the glossary and annexes in the student's text. Reproducible graphic organizers (web information, Venn charts and a comparison matrix) are useful homeschool tools, but Record-Keeper is more class-oriented. I particularly liked the generic classification section for the application activities. His determination to grade projects always seemed to derail me. Some examples of expansion activities at World Geography include: internet search to learn about sports in South and East Asia, read the general article about the aspect of African life and write report to share with class, study weather maps and consider how geography affects the weather. The test package includes a pre-test and post-test test, as well as a unit test for each unit in the student's text. This package also includes suggestions for testing students who don't test well with testing strategies for both the Power Basics series and standardized testing. Out of curiosity I took the pre-test with the Geography series score 90%. It showed a hole in my knowledge - almost all my longing were from the Eastern European area. Although not as powerful or as challenging as some of our history-based literature studies or our textbook courses, these courses tend to be from Christian publishers and include a biblical view of the world. This series from a secular editor provides a complete course that can be strengthened for a grade-level reader by adding appropriate reading and research projects while using the course as a framework for study. ~ Janice World History Manual Solutions Thanks!
