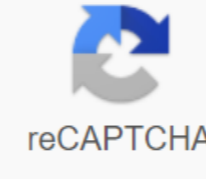

It was released in November 1980 as the second single from his album *Horizon*. It reached number one in the Hot Country Singles charts, [2] on the Billboard Hot 100 and Adult Contemporary Singles [3] charts in early 1981. It was written by Rabbitt, Even Stevens and David Malloy. Song history According to Music historian Fred Bronson, I love the night of the rain for 12 years. Rabbitt had a collection of old tapes he kept in the basement of his home. While rummaging through tapes one day in the 1980s, he heard a fragment of the song he had recorded on one rainy night in the late 1960s. He sang his voice recorder: I love a rainy night, I love a rainy night. After rediscovering the old lyrics, Rabbitt finished the song (with the help of frequent songwriting partners Even Stevens and David Malloy) and recorded it. The result was vivid descriptions of a man's fondness for thunderstorms and the peace it brings him (I'd love to hear thunder/watch lightning when it lights up the sky / you know it makes me feel good) and a renewed sense of hope storms to bring (Showers wash all my troubles away / I wake up until a sunny day). Another characteristic feature of the song is its rhythmic pattern of intermittent finger snaps and hand claps, which was attached with the help of percussionist Farrell Morris, who, according to the *Billboard Book of Number One Country Hits*, mixed two tracks each to finish the record. Chart performance February 28th, a song succeeded by Dolly Parton's hit, a film theme-song 9-5 number one position on the Billboard Hot 100 pop singles chart, two weeks later on March 14, the Parton song would be back in the top spot - the last time to date that the pop chart featured back-to-back country singles in the number one position. I love Rainy Night came amid Rabbitt's peak popularity as a crossover artist. A follow-up to *Drivin's My Life Away* (number one in the country, number five in the Hot 100), the song was Rabbitt's only Hot 100 number one. But his crossover success continued with the follow-up *Step by Step* and *You and Me* (the last duet with Crystal Gayle). *Billboard's Hot Country* charted, it was his eighth out of 17 career chart-toppers, dating back to 1976-1990. I Love a Rainy Night was certified for gold sales of half a million units by the Recording Industry Association of America. It was originally released by White for his 1969 album, *Continued*, on Monument Records, just before Benton's hit single was released. Writing a song on 17 December 2005 When I got out of high school, I went to Marietta, Georgia, and my sister lived. I went there to get a job and I played guitar in the house and so on. I drove a garbage truck to the highway department, and when it rained, you didn't have to go to work. You can stay home and play your guitar and hang out all night. So these thoughts came back to me when I moved to Texas about three months later. I heard an ode to Billie Joe on the radio, and I thought, how real, because I'm Billie Joe. I know this life. I've been in cotton fields. So I thought that if I ever tried to write, I'll write something that I know. At the time, I did a lot of Elvis and John Lee Hooker on stage with my drummer. No original songs, and I hadn't thought about it. But when I heard Bobbie Gentry I sat down and thought ... Well I know Polk because I had ate a bunch of it and I knew about rainy nights because I spent a lot of rainy nights in Marietta, Georgia. So I was really happy with my first attempts to write something that was not only real and hit a pretty close bone, but lasted so long. So it was such a guide for me then through life always try to write what I know. [3] Brook Benton's version in 1969, after several years without a big hit, Benton was signed to a new record label, Cotillion Records (a subsidiary of Atlantic Records), labeled by A&R chief executive and producer Jerry Wexler. Benton recorded the song in November 1969 with organizer/producer Arif Mardin. Session staff on the plate had Billy Carter on the organ, Dave Crawford on piano, Cornell Dupree and Jimmy O'Rourke on guitar, Harold Cowart on bass, Tubby Ziegler on drums and Toots Thielemans on the harmonica. Added to her come-back album *Brook Benton Today*, the melancholy song became an instant hit. In the spring of 1970, the song was topped the *Billboard Best Selling Soul Singles* chart. It also reached number four on the *Billboard Hot 100*. [4] and number two in the *Adult Modern* Rankings. David Ruffin recorded the cover version of the song with Benton the same year, but Motown didn't release the album until 2004. [7] B.J. Thomas recorded the song the same year as Benton for his album *Most of All*. [8] Several reggae covers have been recorded, including Ken Parker, Lord Tanamo, Nicky Thomas, John Holt and reggae bands Gladiators, Manna and Congo. In 1967 Prince Buster rewritten the lyrics and recorded a sexually explicit reggae version of this song called the Big Five, usually found with certain words bleeped out. Gregory Isaacs made a dancehall-style version in the early 90s. Newer covers include these indie folk-rock band Hem from their album *No Word from Tom* (2006) and Boz Scaggs' album *Memphis* (2013). Australian band Ross Hannford Trio recorded the cover of the song in 1994. In 2006, Boozoo Bajou and Tony Joe White recorded a version of drop/cold with electronic effect. Rod Stewart added a song from his 2009 album *Soulbook*. Singer Frank Shiner released the song's first single and video for his 2017 album *Loney Town, Loney Street*.
