It's interesting how some things come full circle. In the early days of the web, browsers would automatically download links to files other than a web page, such as images, PDF files, and documents. Then, the browsers became so advanced that they were able to open almost any file in real time. This created a problem for developers, however. How would you force a browser to download a file, instead of opening it? A lot of hacks and solutions came up to solve the problem, but none was a real solution. That all changed with HTML5 when the Download attribute was introduced. Developers can now add a special download attribute to their HTML anchor tags to tell browsers to treat a link as a download, rather than opening the target file. There are a few different ways you can use the Download attribute to control how browsers manage download links. Even better, all modern browsers support the Download attribute, so you shouldn't see any problems with compatibility or the need for a backspace. There are some different ways to manage the Download attribute. Each has its own benefit, and all of them work smoothly through different browsers. The easiest way to use the Download attribute is just to include it in its most basic form in anchor labels. You do not need to include an additional filename or support information. In this case, the browser will download the file as it is with the same name. What if you really want to the name. There are a lot of times I would like to do that. Automatically generated filenames are a good example. They usually have ridiculously long names with strings of garbage characters. This is not the experience you want for your visitors. You can standardize things with the Download attribute. To specify a file name, set the download attribute equal to it. Exclude the file extension. The browser cannot and will not convert the file type, so there is no point in trying. Download now!> Visitors will download the file as a file.pdf. Along with this comes a simplified way to let your users download images directly. This is not revolutionary, and you can probably put it together yourself, but you can use the download attribute to create a downloadable image link. Start by configuring an image as you normally do on your page. This, of course, will be the image that is available for download. >Then encapsulate all of this in an anchor tag, linking to the image path. > > > Finally, add the download attribute to the anchor tag. You can rename the image if you want. > > > Now, when a visitor clicks on the image, they will automatically download it directly from the server. It's not necessary, and may seem like an exaggeration for a developer, but how many site visitors would think right-clicking on an image to view or download it? This?
