Although they may look confusing, QR codes are ridiculously easy to use. Follow the steps below to turn your phone into an instant QR code scanner that uses nothing but the default camera app. Related black friday 1 sales step: Open the camera app. Apple's iPhones have built-in QR code scanning capabilities right in the camera app itself, so there's no need to download a separate scanning app if you really want to. In addition, iOS 12 has even a direct QR code reader in Control Center, so you can run it even faster. If the QR code icon doesn't come to an end in control center in iOS, simply go to the Settings app, tap Control Center, and then tap Customize Controls. Then search for the QR code reader under More controls and tap the green -icon to add it. Now it's easy to access whenever you need it right from iOS Control Center, which you can access by swiping down from the upper-right corner of the screen. Step 2: Position your phone so that the QR code appears in the digital viewfinder. The camera app should automatically recognize the QR code. Of course, the right distance and angle can help. The QR code may not fill the entire screen, but all four corners should be visible. If the camera is too hooked, the app might have problems recognizing the code, so direct access is best. Image stabilization technology helps a lot with shaking, but try to avoid moving too much so the code square remains visible. Step 3: Run the code. If you scan a QR code using a QR code reader located in Control Center, it automatically starts the app or website. However, if you use the camera app for iOS to scan a QR code, your iPhone doesn't automatically activate QR code activity. Instead, a notification bar appears at the top of the screen that shows that QR has been understood, usually with a handy brief description of what the QR code will do – for example, by opening a specific webpage. If you think the QR code is secure, tap the notification bar to start the code activity. How to scan a QR code on your Android phone Step 1: Make sure your Android phone supports QR code scanning. Not all Android phones will be added with this capability yet, so you may need to take some extra steps before scanning. However, the Google Assistant can detect QR codes. Simply press the Home icon for a long time or say OK, Google, and then tap Google lens in the lower right corner. If you have a Samsung phone with Bixby options, Bixby can also automatically detect QR QR Otherwise, you might need to add an app. We recommend downloading QR Code Reader, which is a simple and highly effective option (although one that comes with ads). Step 2: Open the scanning application. Open the app, whether it's Bixby, QR Code Reader, Samsung Optical Reader, or any option is installed on your Android phone. These apps should have a scan feature that you can choose from immediately, or open directly into the scan window through your camera. Step 3: Place the QR code. Remember that code corners should be fully visible in the scan window, and the camera should be more or less directly above the code for it to work. Hold your phone firmly until it identifies the code. Step 4: Select the correct option. The app should then provide the ability to pop-up hours for a QR-based action. After a quick internet search, I found that I definitely wasn't alone in having this problem. Luckily, I was able to find a way around it. Here's a way: As always, this is not a way to bypass activation if your UDID is not in the file, nor will it work that way. This is a solution if you're having trouble activating a device that wasn't previously beta but that's legitimately registered to your developer account. Restore to iOS 6 Before you can fix an activation error, you'll need to bring your iPhone that's having activation problems back to iOS 6. In order to do this, you can follow our guide to downgrade. As you downgrade the iOS 7 beta back to iOS 6, proceed in order to complete the iOS 7 beta installation. Update to iOS 7 If you're having trouble activating, chances are you probably clicked Refresh in iTunes when installing iOS 7 beta instead of Update. Normally this is not a problem, but lately it seems that they do not want to play nice with activation. This is what seems to be causing problems recently with the installation of the new iOS 7 beta. Follow these steps: If your device isn't there yet, connect it to your Mac or PC. Start iTunes. Under Device options, on your Mac keyboard (Shift for Windows users), hold alt+option, and instead of restoring, click Update. Go to and select the current iOS 7 beta file that you downloaded from the developer portal. Let iTunes do your thing update your device. That's all there is to it. This should solve the activation problem and the device should start as normal and be able to activate this time. If you have no reason to install the beta, stay away until it's published. It should also never be installed on the user's primary device. If you're already updated to iOS 6 but find yourself missing your jailbreak, dev team redsn0w development tool that has already been released allows you to get your jailbreak on right now. Before we proceed, please note this jailbreak is tethered and you will also need to manually install Cydia. If you just can't wait for the unstethered or more stable version, keep going. If you can, we recommend that you wait. Supported devices If your device isn't supported, don't try jailbreak. It won't work and you can potentially brick your device or even lose data. Currently, only A4 devices, the iPhone 4 and 4, are supported. If you've picked up an iPhone 5 or iPhone 4S, 3G, or 3GS - you'll need to hold off for a while. What you need You will need to download redsn0w 0.9.13 dev 4 and iOS firmware files in order to jailbreak iOS 6. In the main menu redsn0w select Extras again and then click the Just Boot option. The device should start now. Install Cydia Now that you have your phone booted we need to install Cydia because this version redsn0w does not include it. Find the Wi-Fi address of your device in settings and make a note of it. Now open Terminal on Mac with connected device and enter ssh root@[youraddress] You will be prompted for a password password Connection. The default password is Alpine if you have not changed the SSH password. Now type the following - wget -q -O /tmp/cyinstall.sh &chmod 755 /tmp/cyinstall.sh & /tmp/cyinstall.sh and wait. You will notice the terminal running some scripts. Be patient and eventually the device will restart. After doing this, you should see Cydia installed.
