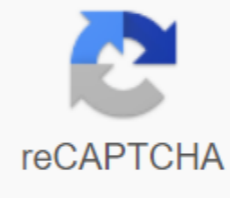

Photo The Special Olympics in Indiana, (Indianapolis, Ind.) - As the Indiana Special Olympics continues to prioritize the health and safety of all athletes, volunteers and families during this near-unprecedented pandemic, in-person competition and events remain limited even as government restrictions begin to ease. The special Olympics in Indiana's annual EKS Games scheduled for September will not continue as planned. Instead, building on the momentum generated by successful virtual summer games, you are invited to be #UnifiedByHope again for a similar event this fall: the 2020 Fall Games Sports and Fitness Challenge, promoting continued at-home exercise and hydration. For every day in September, Athletes and Unified Partners have two (2) problems: 1) being active for 30 minutes each day (a specific sport or fitness exercise before an athlete/single partner, But the selected exercises should raise your heart rate. 30 minutes of exercise should not be all at a time. 2) Drink five (5) bottles of water every day. Participants will receive one (1) point for each call completes every day, a maximum of two (2) points earned per day during the month of September. The ideal score at the end of the day would be sixty (60) points. Earn bonus points (10) per per in Lilly 1000 miles Challenge. A small fee does apply. Download the score table cl More from local news Free Covid 19 testing FREE COVID-19 TESTING SITE The City of Madison offers COVID-19 testing at the Senior Center starting July 21. This site will provide testing to 132 people per day for free without an appointment, symptoms, insurance, or a doctor's note. Details of the testing will take place at the Senior Center located at 208 N. Main St. The site will be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday to Friday, at least until mid-August. However, the site will close every day from 12:00 p.m. to 12.30pm and from 4.30pm to 5:00 p.m. to provide staff with a break for meals. The test site is operated by OptumServe and complies with all recommendations of the CDC and Indiana CoVID-19. Thus, only two people will be allowed into the building for testing at a time. While walking in is accepted, residents are advised to register for online testing. LHI. Care/co-location is the preferred method of registering and requesting appointments. It is available 24/7.
