Literary critics often refer to a piece of writing literature - not pulp fiction - if it attempts to describe this human condition. We are a species that, regardless of our individual differences, shares common challenges, questions and characters. Essentially, the discussion of the human condition is any thematic concern about human nature, human society or how we live our lives. In other words, these are the fundamental questions of human existence. One of the main concerns of the literature is to comment on these issues; it might be better to it than psychology or philosophy! If you are asked to make a thematic statement about a piece of writing, the best way to identify a theme is to seek a challenge to the human condition. Look for common problems or conflicts that anyone might face in their lives. So let's be more specific. What kind of issues are we talking about about human nature, human society or how we live our lives - What is the good life? -How do parents act towards their children? -How can we cope with death? -How can we cope with the alienation of those around us? -Should we comply or be original? -How to deal with poverty or excessive wealth? Human Nature - Are we naturally bad or good? -Are we born with inherited traits or are we a virgin slate? What is more important for human beings? Law, order or freedom? -Are we determined by our genetic structure, our environment, etc., or do we have free will? -Are we naturally naturally or are we individuals first? -Can we know the universal truths? -Are we selfish or altruistic? Human Society - What is a natural society: equality or hierarchy? -Is civilization positive or negative? -How should society treat the environment?
