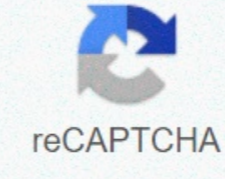




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Palm beach clerk of court forms

Domestic Violence Project The Domestic Violence Project provides representation for victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual violence and stalking in Palm Beach County. Lawyers represent survivors in hearings for injunctive relief, protection orders, parenting plans, timeshare and child or spousal support. Representation can also be provided in related family court matters. The Domestic Violence Project's Injury Initiation Project could also help survivors submit a petition for an injunction for protection and related documents. Injury project lawyers are staffed in the DVRV clerk's offices in the Main Courthouse at 205 North Dixie Highway, West Palm Beach, Florida, and in the South County Courthouse at 200 E. The Survey Department records a variety of documents, including but not limited to: Deeds Bills of Sale Agreements Mortgage Notices or claims of lien Other instruments relating to the transfer, ownership, incumbent of or claims against property or any interest therein. Your document must be formatted correctly. An empty space must be available on the top right corner of each page of your document for the Clerk and Comptroller's official Recording Stamp. The first page should have a 3 inch by 3 inch space. All other pages must have a 1 inch by 3 inch space. A self-addressed postage paid envelope must be provided if hard copy documents recordings are compiled. It is not necessary to provide one envelope per document if all documents must be returned to the same address, provided envelopes and postal members comply with U.S. Postal Service guidelines. Documents will only be distributed to other parties if a self-addressed, postal paid envelope for each party is included in the request. Otherwise, all documents will be returned to the party submitting the document for recording. You'll have to pay the required fees. See Fees and Costs. The Clerk & Comptroller's office cannot obtain certified copies of any document for re-recording. We won't an uncertified copy of any document, with or without changes. If you need to adopt a document that has changes from the original, please provide either a new document or make the change to the original document. Can the Clerk & Comptroller reject a document? Yes. Documents that can be rejected include: Florida Statutes specifying which documents can be recorded and the legal requirements for documents (such as signatures requiring notarization). Why didn't I get my documents back after they were recorded? Self-addressed, stamped envelopes are required for hard copy documents submitted for recording. See the postal fees chart for more information. What is a Notice of E-operation and who should sign it? Florida law requires a Notice of Ing intosion to be recorded by the county and/or city before activities begin (such as renovations, building a pool, etc.). Only the owner can sign this document for recording. What is a Sale/Transfer of Property DR-219 form? Effective June 1, 2008, customers will no longer complete the DR-219 Form (Return for Transfers of Interest in Real Property) when submitting a document for recording. What documents require state documentary stamps? Bonds Deeds / all transportation on notes and written obligations to pay money mortgage, liens and other evidence of debt Additional information is available online from the Florida Department of Revenue. When is intangible taxes required? Obligations to pay money involving real estate. What documents can be logged?
