Seeing stars hollywood

Child stars are a big part of Hollywood. Let's face it, not every film can contain a cast that is made entirely of adults. Despite child labor laws, children have been featured prominently in film and television throughout modern history. It includes networks like Nickelodeon, which is devoted entirely to child programming. But sometimes, these little kids stars hit big at an early age and then kind of disappear soon after. Let's watch a whole bunch of kids you might remember from your favorite movies and TV shows who either quietly settled down or walked away from Hollywood completely. 1. Daniel Tay James Caan, Will Ferrell, and Daniel Tay in Elf | New Line Cinema You will remember Daniel Tay as James Caan's son in Elf, or Will Ferrell's half-brother, Michael. Elf was Tay's first major role, but he disappeared shortly thereafter. He has appeared here and there, playing the role of Max in the 2006 comedy Beer League, but has done little other than lend his voice in a handful of video games. Tay is currently in her 20s. Next: She appeared alongside many big stars. 2. Amber Scott Robin Williams, Charlie Korsmo, Caroline Goodall, and Amber Scott in Hook | TriStar Pictures Most people only know Amber Scott as Maggie, Peter Pan's daughter in the early '90s fantasy classic Hook. She was only 7 years old at the time, making her performance in the role somewhat impressive. It's hard to get a 7-year-old to sit still for five minutes, let alone remember lines and film a big movie with Robin Williams, Dustin Hoffman and Julia Roberts. Scott appeared a few years later in a TV documentary titled American Experience and then dropped out of acting completely. She graduated from Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut in 2006. Next: She is very memorable from a handful of 90s movies. 3rd Mara Wilson Danny DeVito and Mara Wilson in Matilda | TriStar Pictures' Mara Wilson first appeared on the Hollywood radar in the remake of the Christmas classic Miracle on 34th Street, and later went on to star in the 1996 children's classic Matilda. But after a few small roles, Wilson pretty much disappeared from Hollywood for over a decade. This allowed the young actress to focus on education and simply just be a child. She has since appeared on social media and focuses on her writing, although she has made brief appearances on screen, such as in an episode of Broad City. Next: She appeared in a major Spielberg classic. 4. Ariana Richards Ariana Richards in Jurassic Park | Universal Pictures' Ariana Richards appeared in the 1990 film Tremors, and later became known as Lex in Jurassic Park. She reprised her role briefly in Jurassic Park: The Lost World, and made a handful of other notable appearances on television. But in 2001, she walked away from the Hollywood lifestyle at the age of 22. Richards graduated in and Art from Skidmore College in New York and is a very talented portrait artist. Next: One of Richard's most prominent co-stars. 5. Joseph Mazzello Joseph Mazzello in Jurassic Park | Universal Pictures' Richard's co-star in Jurassic Park, Joseph Mazzello, also dropped out of the big movie scene shortly after The Lost World. Although it is not entirely fair to say that he left for good. Mazzello stayed somewhat active in acting, even earning a degree from USC in Cinema and Television Production. But most of Mazzello's work in recent years is just short appearances in TV shows or made-for-TV movies. His biggest gig since Jurassic Park came in 2013, when he had a minor role in G.I. Joe: Retaliation. Next: Son of Dan and Roseanne. 6. Michael Fishman John Goodman, Roseanne Barr, Sara Gilbert, Michael Fishman, and Alicia Góranson at Roseanne | ABC's Michael Fishman was never a movie star, although he was an extremely prominent child actor. Although he was absent from the pilot episode, Fishman appeared in 220 episodes of the hit, 1990s blue collar TV show, Roseanne, as the youngest son, DJ It began in 1988, which he was only seven years old, and ran until 1997. After the show ended, he made a handful of minor appearances, including an episode of Seinfeld. He stopped acting to pursue a career in baseball, and eventually ended up coaching high school ball. Fishman has since returned to acting, and will appear in an upcoming baseball movie titled Undrafted. He is also reprising his role as DJ Conner on the Roseanne revival. Next: From Tom Hanks and Meg Ryan to cars. 7. Ross Malinger Meg Ryan, Tom Hanks, and Ross Malinger in Sleepless in Seattle | TriStar Pictures' Ross Malinger first came to Hollywood fame with the role of Harvey in Kindergarten Cop, and then went on to have an important role in Sleepless in Seattle with Meg Ryan and Tom Hanks. But as he grew up, the main roles became fewer and fewer for Malinger. He had recurring roles on several television series, including The Simple Life and Reccess, but was functionally finished acting at the age of 17. Malinger now runs Automotive Legends in Malibu, California. Next: This former child star earned his JD from Yale. 8. Charlie Korsmo Bill Murray and Charlie Korsmo in What About Bob? | Touchstone Pictures Charlie Korsmo hit big at an early age, appearing in Dick Tracy in 1990 and then the Bill Murray comedy What About Bob? a year later. But Korsmo's greatest role came as Peter Pan's son, Jack, in Hook. But like his younger sibling Ammy Gibler, Korsmo disappeared from Hollywood shortly afterwards. He appeared in a minor role in the 1998 teen film Can't Hardly Wait, but that's it. At least Korsmo has a solid reason, though. He stopped acting to get a bachelor's degree in physics from MIT, and later his JD at Yale. He is now Professor of Law at Case Western Western University of Law. Next: Remember this annoying red-head? 9. Jason Zimber Jason Zimber and Melissa Joan Hart on Clarissa Explain Everything | Nickelodeon Jason Zimber is another former child star who comes from the television world. He was the red-haired, annoying little brother at Clarissa Explains Everything, a Nickelodeon show from the early 90s featuring Melissa Joan Hart. The show only ran for three years, but it was very popular among its audience during that time. Zimber has zero act credits since the final of Clarissa, but graduated from Notre Dame in 1998 and went on to work for HBO. He actually established a support group for former child actors, called Been There, Done That. Next, he's unfairly blamed for a horrible movie. 10th Jake Lloyd Jake Lloyd in Star Wars: The Phantom Threat | Lucasfilm Although the big problem with Star Wars: The Phantom Menace was the wrongful Jar Jar Binks, a lot of the fans' anger was taken out on poor Jake Lloyd. Of course, no one has ever asked to see Darth Vader as a little boy who often screamed, Yippee! But remember that Lloyd was only 10 years old at the time. Despite a solid acting career that boasts a stint on ER and holiday hit Jingle all the way, Lloyd appeared in just one film after The Phantom Menace. He was arrested on several counts in 2015, which was apparently related to a schizophrenia diagnosis. Next: He formed a good relationship with Will Smith at the right time. 11. Ross Bagley Ross Bagley on Independence Day | Twentieth Century Fox's Ross Bagley hit it big at an early age, which was cast in the 1994 children's classic, Little Rascals, and later as Nicky on the 90s hit TV show, The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air. His chemistry with co-star Will Smith helped him land a role in the 1996 blockbuster Independence Day, but it was pretty much the last we heard about Bagley. He made a handful of minor appearances on TV shows, and then stopped acting altogether. Bagley graduated from California State University in 2012 and completed an internship at Overbrook Productions, owned by Will and Jada Pinkett-Smith. Next: She made a movie, and that's it. 12th Carrie Henn Sigourney Weaver and Carrie Henn in Aliens | Twentieth Century Fox's Carrie Henn played Newt in Aliens at the age of 10, but that's all. She literally has no other acting credits, others appearing as herself in several documentaries about the film. Henn went on to graduate from California State University with a bachelor's degree in 2000, and has a job in California working as an elementary teacher. She certainly may not have wanted to act to have walked away from it, despite a solid performance in Aliens. Next: Truffle shuffle! 13th Jeff Cohen Jeff Cohen in The Goonies | Warner Bros. Jeff Cohen is best remembered as Chunk from The Goonies, but he made appearances in a handful of other notable He had a recurring role on Family Ties, and also lent his voice to the comic strip Popeye and Son. But that was pretty much it for Cohen, who stopped acting in 1991 at the age of 17. Cohen graduated from UC Berkeley and now works as an entertainment lawyer. It's far from doing truffle shuffle. Next: After a long acting break, she recently returned. 14th Andrea Barber Andrea Barber on Full House | ABC's Andrea Barber got her start in acting with a recurring role as Carrie Brady on Days of Our Lives, but she is best remembered for her role as annoying neighbor and DJ Tanner's best friend, Kimmy Gibbler, on the 90s hit sitcom, Full House. When the show ended in 1995, barber's acting career was made. She received her bachelor's degree from Whittier College and then went to grad school at the University of York in England. Barber worked at Whittier College in their Office of International Programs for a while, but recently got sucked back into acting with full house reboot, Fuller House. She has reprised her role as Kimmy Gibbler, who now lives with DJ and Stephanie Tanner. Next: She went from a family TV show to. 15. Jaimee Foxworth Jaimee Foxworth and Kellie Shanygne Williams on Family Issues | ABC's Jaimee Foxworth was the adorable little sister on the 1990s hit series, Family Matters. Her character was called Judy Winslow, but as the show went on it became less and less screen time for Judy. With Steve Urkel dominating the pop culture world, Foxworth's character was cut from the show after four years. She left the map for seven years before resurfacing with a brand new person. Foxworth was now known as Crave, appearing in a handful of pornographic films. Next: No, this child star is not Marilyn Manson. 16th Josh Saviano Josh Saviano and Fred Savage on The Wonder Years | ABC's Josh Saviano has had to deal with strange rumors in his post-acting life, but mostly remains hidden from the public eye. He played the nerdy best friend, Paul Pfeiffer, on The Wonder Years. Saviano appeared in nearly 100 episodes of the show, which ran for six seasons and was a popular coming-of-age sitcom based in the 1960s. While Fred Savage has gone on to enjoy a moderate acting career, Saviano went 11 years before popping up again on TV. He appeared in three episodes of Law & Order: SVU from 2014-2016. The strangest note about Saviano is the persistent rumor that he grew up to be Marilyn Manson, which is obviously untrue. Saviano graduated from Yale in 1998 and lives in New York City, where he works as a lawyer. Next: This child actor was written out of his own show and never returned. 17th Josh Byrne Josh Byrne on Step by Step | ABC Another TV star who disappeared when his show ended. Josh Byrne played the youngest son, Brendan, on ABC's 1990s hit Step by Step. The show had a seven-season run featured major stars, such as Patrick Duffy and Suzanne Somers, but it failed to vault any of the children on a larger career in acting. In 1997, the show printed Out Brendan in favor of the younger, cuter Lilly. Since then, Byrne has disappeared into the airwaves. Next: This young starlet went completely off the rails. 18th Amanda Bynes Amanda Bynes in What a Girl Wants | Warner Bros. There are few stories about former child stars that are as weird as Amanda Bynes. She got her big break on a Nickelodeon show, All That, and went on to play the lead role on her own series, The Amanda Show. Bynes eventually began making films, including titles such as What a Girl Wants, She's the Man and Hairspray. But at the peak of his popularity, Bynes was pretty much done in Hollywood. Drugs, alcohol, social media implisions and other issues stopped her career before she even turned 30. Next: He was the biggest tween heartthrob of the '90s. 19. Jonathan Taylor Thomas Jonathan Taylor Thomas in I'll Be Home for Christmas | Disney's Jonathan Taylor Thomas got his start as one of Tim Allen's three rowdy boys on the 1990s sitcom, Home Improvement. The middle child on the show, Thomas grew to popularity as the series went on until eventually, he chose to leave and seek a film career. Thomas' most famous roles include Simba in The Lion King and Tom Sawyer in Tom and Huck. But Thomas' film career didn't really take off, and he had sporadic roles in film and in tv cameos until 2006, when he actually stopped acting. Since then, Thomas has only been seen a handful of times on Allen's latest show, Last Man Standing. Next: He had one of the most famous acting performances of any child star. 20. Danny Lloyd Shelley Duvall and Danny Lloyd in The Shining | Warner Bros. Better known as the kid from The Shining. At the age of seven, Danny Lloyd made his

film debut with Stanley Kubrick's classic in 1980. The redrum, redrum, thing is just one of Danny's many memorable moments in the film, and it was overall a great achievement from a child who had little (if any) acting experience. But beyond The Shining, Danny appeared briefly in a TV movie in 1982 and that was it for his acting career.
