How to make crossbow minecraft

This is a simple crossbow with triggers made of Lego pieces powered by rubber bands. It can fire LEGO beams. One of the best ways to collect supplies is to kill and harvest mobs. Iron ore is the most common mineral in Minecraft, so you can find it here and there. Look underground from above sea to bedrock. If it happens in a village, base, mine shaft, tower or across a sunken ship, you can also find an iron bar on your chest. Drag the iron bar into stock. Once you've built your shield, you can quickly equip it and start using it like any other instrument. You can also decorate your shield to visually customize it.
