The legislative authority is invested in a seven-member municipal council. All members are generally elected for four-year terms. The Council establishes the compensation of municipal employees and employees and regulation of money, licensing and regulation of companies and trades and other municipal purposes. The president is the mayor, who has no vote unless there is a tie vote of the members of the Council. The mayor is elected by voters specifically for this office for a four-year term. Page 10 Situated on the banks of the Maumee River at the foot of the rapids, it was the site of several significant military clashes between British, Native American forces. The victory of General Mad Anthony Wayne at the Battle of Fallen Timbers in the summer of 1794 secured the area for the Americans. The location eventually attracted speculators and eastern settlers in search of opportunities in the west and a city was in 1817. In the beginning, the Maumee River was the focus of economic activity and Maumee soon emerged as a major center of ship building and river port. In 1837, construction was begun on the Wabash Canal and Erie and Maumee was designated as a termite. The Canal was located where the Anthony Wayne Trail is now. Historical Landmarks Wolcott House was built in 1827 by James Wolcott, a Connecticut businessman and his wife, Mary Wells, daughter of the noted Indian Scout, William Wells and granddaughter of Chief Turtle. The house overlooks the Maumee River, where Wolcott's shipbuilding and staining activity took place. Wolcott was one of the first mayors and community leader in Maumee. Today, the Wolcott House complex contains seven 19th-century buildings, peppering the area from the 1800s. Fort Miamis The first fort established on the Maumee River, the fort was originally built by the British on the possible site of a trading post. Eventually, the British took control and turned it into a fort during the Indian Wars of the early 1790s. It is located on River Road on Michigan Street. The British eventually surrendered Fort Miamis to the United States in 1796, and is now a city park. Massacre of It was the fifth of May 1813 that the Americans suffered a one bloody and unnecessary defeat known as Dudley's Defeat. It occurred during the first seige of Fort Meigs during the War of 1812. A historical marker was placed in front of the Maumee Library on River Road. House reputedly provided refuge for runaway slaves who made their way to the Maumee River and through a deep ravine that led to the basement. Arthur Henry, editor of the Toledo Blade and his wife, Maude, a pioneering reporter, briefly owns the house in the 1890s. The house is on the National Register of Historic Places.
