For example, we were late arrivals to the pressure-washing machine party, but now that we've belied up to the bar, we have a blast... of water. Last year's purchase of a pressure washer has made our lives so much easier, in so many ways and so many places. But of course our introduction into the joys of pressure running began with a problem: we had some outdoor carpets that were turning green from algae growth, and none of our conventional cleaning methods would eliminate discoloration, especially on birdings. We tried to use a high-power nozzle on an ordinary garden hose, tried various spray-on cleaners and commercial spot-removers, and even brought our trusty carpet steamer outside—all to no avail. Some friends of ours suggested we try to use their pressure slice, and voila: stains removed, outdoor carpets saved! We immediately started looking for our own pressure washer (also known as a power washing machine), shopping at large home improvement stores, hardware stores, and garden centers. We found that there are countless models to choose from, at prices ranging from \$200 to \$2,000. Pressure washers are rated according to the water pressure that they produce. Most standard garden hoses deliver between 40 to 60 pounds per square inch (PSI), while pressure runs deliver from 1,400 to 4,000 PSI. A pressure washer takes the water from the garden hose and presses it through a small high-pressure nozzle, creating a pressure jet of water that can be used alone or combined with a detergent. Sears Craftsman 1700 PSI 1.3 GPM Electric Pressure Washer with Steam Cleaner Residential pressure discs typically are divided into three classifications: Light-duty pressure skiers are rated at 2,000 PSI or less and are suitable for cleaning cars, motorcycles, boats, bicycles and all-purpose cleaning. Medium-duty pressure runs produce 2,000 to 3,000 PSI and can be used to remove grease and gloom from concrete, sidewalks, tires and siding. Powerful pressure runs produce 3,000 PSI or more, and can be used to clean large areas quickly, remove stubborn stains or stains of rust, or to strip paint. There are also a number of commercial pressure runs on the market, but if you have a job that includes it, you'd probably be better off calling in a professional pressure wash. Another important factor in choosing a pressure washer is how much water it lays out, which is known as the flow rate and expressed as gallons per minute (GPM). The higher the flow rate the faster a pressure washer will clean a given area. Most residential pressure drivers have a flow rate of 2 to 4 GPM. Interestingly, using a pressure cleaner can actually save significantly on water consumption. A garden hose operating at 60 PSI uses about 900 gallons per hour while a pressure operating at 1,400 PSI uses only about 100 gallons per hour. We chose an electrically powered, medium-duty pressure washer rated at 2,000 PSI because we figured it would be the most versatile for home and garden use, and we've been quite happy with our choices. We have used the pressure washer to clean our tires, including railings and stairs; to remove stubborn stains from the driveway; to clean the siding and brick walls; to clean and rinse our gutters; as well as cleaning our cars, bicycles, lawnmower, snow blower and garden furniture. The pressure washer even removed baked grease from the cast iron grates on our grill. And of course, when these outdoor rugs start to look a little cuddly, we bring the trusty pressure washing machine. My only regret is that we didn't buy one before! Whether you buy your own pressure washer or rent one from the local hardware store, it's an undeniably powerful tool to remove built-up dirt and algae from your home's exterior and other outdoor surfaces. However, before using a pressure washer, always read the instructions carefully and use the appropriate nozzle for the job at hand. Ready to blow debris away? Just be sure to adjust the pressure cleaner to a lower psi (pound-force per square inch) so you don't accidentally damage your siding. You can also pressure wash wood or aluminum siding, but keep the pressure low to avoid denting aluminum siding or splintering or shards painting off wood siding. To get rid of accumulated dirt and oil, start pressure-washing on top of the driveway and work your way down to the apron. Give the floor a good cleaning by using the pressure washer in a low setting to apply a degreasing solution. Leave the solution for a few minutes (see manufacturer's instructions), then switch to a higher setting and rinse it off. Has dirt, dust and dirt diminished your tyre's appeal? Use a lower setting for softer wood to avoid splintering and other damage, hardwood and vinyl can stand up to more pressure. If you don't have room to store your outdoor furniture in the garage or a shed during the winter, come spring it's bound to look a little rough. Before the barbecue season starts in gear, reinvigorate your garden furniture with a pressure wash in a low environment – and be sure to test a small, discreet area first to make sure you don't damage the surface. All these meat residues, past-their-prime vegetables, and other smelly debris can really stink up your trash cans. While this task is tempting to put off, you eventually have to give them a good cleaning. Quickly work on the chord using a pressure washer – ideally one with a scrubbrush accessory – at a low setting to apply detergent and then rinse it off. A pressure washer is a tool that connects to your outdoor studs and delivers a powerful, high-pressure stream of water through a cleaning nozzle. These cleaning products provide a quick and efficient way to clean driveways, patios, tiles, concrete, cars, bicycles and more. The main advantage of using a pressure cleaner is that if you need to give a dirty, muddy or moldy area a deep clean, it is much faster and easier than a hose, bucket and scrub brush. Check the daily prices in your area before deciding whether renting a machine can be a more sensible option. If you only want a pressure cleaner for basic jobs, like blasting mud from your bike and making your outdoor furniture look new, an entry-level model for less than \$200 should have all the power you need. Electric models are usually a good choice for most homeowners because they are generally easier to use and maintain than gas-powered washers. They are affordable, don't require too much maintenance and have enough power to tackle a wide range of cleaning jobs around the home. But they plug into your home business, so you'll have to deal with the hassle of lugging around on a power cord and possibly an extension cord. If you want extra power to solve larger cleaning tasks, or you simply don't want to be tied to an extension cord, consider a gas-powered washing machine. They are suitable for hard work and use in remote areas because they are more portable and more durable than electric washers. But they are noisier and heavier than electric models, need fuel and require more maintenance. Although less popular than the first two options, a few manufacturers offer battery-powered models. They can be convenient and easy to use, and the battery may be able to run several other garden tools from the same manufacturer. However, battery-powered models often do not offer the same power as the other options. Cost is probably one of your best considerations when buying a pressure washing machine. You can pick up an entry-level electric model for about \$50, but most units sit within the \$100 to \$600 price range. As a general rule, the more money you spend, the more cleaning power you get. Gas-powered pressure runs start at \$300 and go up to about \$2,000 for an industrial-grade model. There are many additional factors you should take into account when buying a pressure cleaner. Here's what to consider: Some manufacturers provide an all-in-one adjustable nozzle to change the angle and force of the spray, while others provide a set of interchangeable nozzles. Check which nozzles and accessories are included and which surfaces they are best for cleaning. Regular options include locating spray, a wide fan nozzle and turbo nozzle. Also consider what brushes the pressure washer comes with to help you scrub your rear tires, wash your car, clean drains or perform other specialized tasks. For example, a patio cleaner attachment can be an extremely useful recording if you have a large outdoor area to clean. There are two factors that determine the cleaning effect of a pressure washing machine: water pressure and flow rate. Check the maximum water pressure for any device you are considering. For reference, 1,600 to 2,500 pounds per square inch (psi) is a common area for electrically powered pressure cleaners. Some models have an LED display so you can easily control the pressure setting you're using. Also check the maximum flow, measured in gallons per minute. Electrical units are usually between 1.5 and 2 gallons per minute. Check the length of the hose that runs from the body of the vacuum cleaner to the spray lance. The longer it is, the easier the machine will be to use. Also known as spray wand, this directs spray on whatever surface you are cleaning. Metal wands are more durable than plastic ones, and it is important that the stick is long enough for you to reach the ground without condescending. Some models come with extension wands for jobs like cleaning second-story windows, and angled wands that can work with an extension wand to clean gutters. Some models incorporate storage space for lance and hose in the device so they take up less space in your shed or garage. Most pressure drivers have some kind of detergent injection system for increased cleaning power. Most electric and battery-powered pressure runs weigh somewhere between 10 and 50 pounds, but gas-powered models are usually heavier. Check the weight quoted on the specs sheet to ensure that you will be able to comfortably maneuver the device around while you clean. A device with large, sturdy wheels will make it easier to move around and negotiate obstacles while cleaning. The longer the power cord on an electric model, the easier it is to clean without having to change the power outlet or fight an extension cord. Most wires run 15 feet or longer. This feature ensures that the washing machine only sprays water while pressing the trigger, so you can move from place to place and navigate obstacles without spraying water in this way and that. A safety lock on the trigger will also ensure that you do not accidentally start spraying. If you are considering a battery or gas-powered model, check how much cleaning you can expect to finish before you run out of juice. Check the length of the manufacturer's warranty and exactly what it covers. Most will offer at least two years of protection. Pressure scribbles are severely powerful machines and should always be used with caution. Getting in the way of a misdirected spray, especially when the nozzle is on the narrowest setting, could do serious damage and lead to a trip to the emergency room. Be careful with paint. When using a pressure cleaner on your home or car, be careful not to damage the paint. Follow the manufacturer's instructions and always fault on the side of caution when setting the water pressure. Investing in a pressure washer can make your daily cleaning much easier and maybe even a little more fun. Choose the model that best suits your cleaning needs by comparing size, weight, power and price before you buy. To select our list of the best pressure runs, we considered the price point, size, flow rate, water pressure and ease of use. We have also factored into third-party product reviews and our own online research. The higher the pounds per square inch, the more powerful the machine and the more careful you need to be when operating it. Pressure washers can range from about 1,200 pounds per square inch to 2,800 pounds per square inch. Yes, but with caution. Choose a low-pressure option - somewhere around 1,200 to 1,900 pounds per square inch - and a wide spray nozzle instead of a narrow, direct current.
