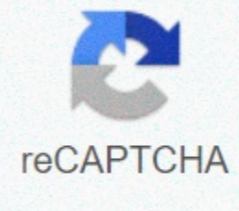

Tyler, creator, is an American rapper, musician, composer, producer, actor and visual artist. [3] [4] In early 2010, he became known as the co-founder and de facto leader of the alternative hip hop group Odd Future and performed and produced songs for almost every edition of Odd Future. [6] After making a great contribution to the early work of Odd Future, Tyler released his debut solo mixtape Bastard in 2009. After the release of his debut studio album Goblin via XL Recordings in April 2011, he signed a joint agreement with RED Distribution and Sony Music Entertainment for himself and his label Odd Future Records. [7] With his bold, horror messages, Tyler was often criticized for using homophobic and misogynistic slurs in his lyrics. He released the albums Wolf (2013) and Cherry Bomb (2015), the last of which was considered a contrast from his previous releases as he experimented with more melody-focused and jazz-fused sound. His fourth album, Flower Boy (2017), was met with widespread acclaim. His fifth album, Igor (2019), was also praised by critics, became Tyler's first number one album on the Billboard 200 and won best rap album at the 2020 Grammy Awards. [8] Tyler won a Grammy, a BRIT Award and an MTV Video Music Award. He created a cover for all versions of Odd Future,[2] and also designed clothing groups and more In 2011, she founded golf company Golf Wang. In 2012, he began hosting an annual music festival called Camp Flog Gnaw Carnival. He created his own streaming app called Golf Media, which ran from 2015 to 2018 and included the original script from Tyler and a live stream of each Camp Flog Gnaw Carnival. He was born on March 6, 1991 in Ladera Heights, California, the son of a Nigerian father with Igbo ancestry and an American mother of mixed African-American and European-Canadian descent. [11] He never met his father[13] and spent his early life in Ladera Heights and nearby Hawthorne. [2] [14] At the age of seven, he pulled the cover from the album's cover and created covers for his own imaginary albums – including a tracklist with song lengths – before he could even make music. They self-released their debut mixtape, Odd Future Tape, on November 25, 2009. Okonma self-released his first solo mixtape, Bastard. Mixtape was eventually ranked 32nd on Pitchfork Media's list of top albums of 2010. The video has gained the attention of several internet media outlets. [21] [22] [23] [24] The extended version with the third verse was made available on iTunes. Okonma won the Yonkers Award for Yonkers in 2011 at the MTV Video Music Awards. On August 26, 2015, Okonma revealed that he had been banned from visiting the UK for three to five years, forcing him to cancel a number of tours supporting the Cherry Bomb album, including Reading and Leeds Festivals. The reason for the ban comes from texts from 2009. His manager Christian Clancy said they had been informed of the ban via a letter from then Home Secretary Theresa May. May cited lyrics from the Bastard mixtape as the reason for the ban, although Okonma has travelled several times in the UK since its release. On July 6, 2017, he announced the title, tracklist and release date of his fourth album, Flower Boy,[56] which was released on July 21, 2017. [57] Several singles were released following the album's release date, including Boredom and I Ain't Got Time!. The album was released via iTunes, Spotify and other major music services. On September 14, 2017, Tyler, Creator announced his third TV show to date, Jelly. It premiered on October 22, 2017. [58] Flower Boy received rave reviews from critics and was nominated for best rap album at the 60th Annual Grammy Awards, giving Tyler his second Grammy nomination after contributing to the 2013 Channel Orange nomination, but was beaten by Kendrick Lamar's fourth studio album Damn. On March 29, 2018, Okonma released Okna,[59] among a number of freestyles and remixes. Okonma called it a single-use song,[60] which states that it will not be included on any upcoming album and does not indicate the sound of any future projects. On May 22, 2018, he released a 435.[62] sequel to this series of singles. On July 23, 2018, Okonma and ASAP Rocky announced a joint project, WANG\$AP, by releasing a music video for a remix of Monica Knock Knock called Potato Salad on AWGE DVD (Vol. 3), a video compilation of AWGE. asap Rocky's creative agency. [63] 2019-present: Igor Main article: Igor (album) May 6, 2019, Okonma released two short video clips on his online profiles that contained new music. The videos showed him dancing irregularly while wearing a long blonde wig, brightly colored suit, black sunglasses and a grill; dressed the same style for pictures on their social media and music videos for singles albums. He soon announced his fifth studio album, Igor, which was released on May 17, 2001, and became Tyler's first number one album in the United States. The album also includes the song Earquake, which peaked at number 13 on the Billboard Hot 100. December 23, 2019 released two songs Best Interest, a song that did not go through the editing of Igor, which was released with a music video, and Group B. [67] Igor won the award for best rap album at the 62nd Academy Awards. The art and impact of Okonma in September 2012 Okonma music is primarily rooted in alternative hip hop,[69] bedroom pop,[69] jazz rap,[69] R& amp; amp; amp; B,[70] and neo soul.[69][71] while his earlier music was considered a horror film. [72] Over the years, his production style has shifted from rough and dark in early projects to a jazzy and soulful approach with albums Cherry Bomb, Flower Boy and Igor. His lyrical themes have also evolved from horror subjects to opinions about love, sexuality, existence and nostalgia. [quote required] Okonma is known as the leader of Odd Future and the group as a whole has been likened to the influential hip hop group Wu-Tang Clan. Since the beginning of his career, Okonma has largely had his own compositions for his projects and other members of Odd Future. Musically, he was heavily influenced by N.E.R.D. and Neptunes member Pharrell Williams. Williams' debut solo album, In My Mind (2006), had a substantial impact on Okonma, inspiring him to co-found the Odd Future collective. [74] He also quoted his debut album, N.E.R.D. In Search of... He was also influenced by rapper Eminem, who called Eminem's album Relapse (2009) one of his favorite albums. [78] Among the artists who cited Okonma as influence are Billie Eilish[80] and Brockhampton member Kevin Abstract. [81] The Tyler controversy on the Showtime comedy-drama series Kidding, 2020 Okonma was criticized for his use of homophobic slurs, especially his frequent use of the adjective in his lyrics and on Twitter. [83] He denied the allegations of homophobia, saying: 'I am not homophobic. I just say and use gays as an adjective to describe stupid, [84][85] and I'm not homophobic. I just think a beats and hurts people. [86] However, he later said in an interview with MTV about swearing, Well, I have gay fans and they don't really take it offensive, so I don't know. If it offends you, it offends you. If you call me a nigger, I don't care, but it's just me, personally. Some people might take it differently. Personally, I don't give a shit. [87] Remarkably, Okonma was among the first to openly support odd future colleagues, Frank Ocean after Ocean, who publicly revealed a past relationship with another young man. [89] The lyrics on the album Flower Boy led to speculation that Okonma himself was coming out as gay. The tracks in question were Forew talk, Garden Shed, and I Ain't Got Time! [91] Okonma further intensified the debate when, in an August 2017 interview, he seemingly revealed that he had a boyfriend when he was 15 years old.[92] though he later tweeted that it was a rhetorical turn. [93] [third party source] Okonma has also been criticized for his graphic depictions of violence against women and texts that observers have called Brent DiCrescenzo of Time Out Chicago writes that rape is the predominant theme of Okonma Goblin's 2011 album [96] and Hermione Hoby of The Guardian writes that Okonma's rape and murder fantasies (are) graphic enough to send vomit soaring along with bile. [97] Fader counted 68 uses of the term whore over Goblin's 73 minutes. [98] Music critic Allison Stewart wrote that critics (read: mostly white guys) largely gave [Okonma] a pass for the album's many homophobic and misogynistic slurs and rape and murder fantasies. [99] An open letter outlining the lack of media condemnation of Okonma's lyrics,[100][101] written by Sara Quin of the Canadian pop duo Tegan and Sara shortly after the goblin's release, sparked further debate and provoked comments from supporting Quin's message to labeling it racist. [109] Commentator Emma Jane describes the harassment of two Australian activists critical of Okonma's lyrics, which were encouraged by Okonma, who named them on Twitter. Fans of the rapper targeted women with rape and death threats in response to reports that they were trying to have Okonma expelled from the country, in what Jane cites as an example of the way high profile characters are able to encourage - intentionally or otherwise - large fan bases to engage in a crowd of attacks on named women. [102] A series of three ads for Mountain Dew directed by Okonma sparked controversy in May 2013, which was accused of using racial stereotypes and trimming violence against women. In places of energy drink-loving goat character called Felicia goat is gradually a scapegoat in the bistro, in prison, and on the road. During a 60-second ad in prison, a battered white woman on crutches examines a police line-up consisting of several African-American men and one goat, while a goat antagonizes a woman. Syracuse professor and social critic Boyce Watkins said the ad was probably the most racist commercial in history. PepsiCo withdrew the ad and apologized. Okonma issued a statement claiming that the ad was not intended to spark a race dispute and that it was simply, again, an absurd story that should never have been taken seriously. [103] On March 15, 2014, he was arrested in Austin, Texas, for inciting unrest after he told fans to push past security guards during his South by Southwest performance. Because of this incident, Tyler faces up to one year in prison and a \$4,000 fine. [105] Tyler's lawyer, Perry Minton, argued that the riot charge was excessive and permeate misconceptions about his client, who had no prior arrests. Those charges were later dropped. On August 26, 2015, Okonma revealed that he had been banned from visiting the UK for three to five years, forcing him to cancel a number of tours supporting the album Cherry Bomb, including Festivals in Reading and Leeds. [54] According to the BBC, the ban is expected to be lifted in February 2019.[107] agreeing to a planned performance in London to promote its fifth studio album, Igor. However, this show was forcibly cancelled by police due to security concerns, the place was claimed to be overcrowded and too noisy. [107] Okonma's personal life identified himself as an atheist and he had explicitly anti-religious lyrics in his music, notably on mixtape, Bastard and the goblin album. Since 2002 he has been an avid skateboarder and collects BMX bikes. [109] [110] [111] [112] Okonma was the subject of speculation about his sexuality, and there were a number of direct references in texts and interviews to the fact that he had same-sex relationships or experienced same-sex attraction. [113] [114] In November 2018, Jaden Smith announced that he was in a relationship with Okonma, although Okonma himself denied the allegations. [116] Okonma does not drink alcohol or use any mind-altering substances, but admits that he has tried cannabis twice in his life.
