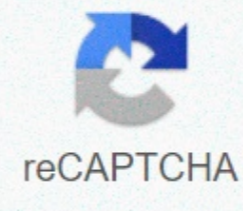

To install or update the MVC version, do the following: In Visual Studio, open Package Manager (use CTRL+Q and type Package Manager console) In the console that appears, type the console cursor that displays PM>: Install-Package Microsoft.AspNet.Mvc -Version 5.2.3 Note: Enter the version you want. In the example above, we used 5.2.3 (the latest version when these instructions were written) Verify the installation using the following command in the Package Manager console: Get-Package -ListAvailable -Filter mvc What's new in ASP.NET MVC 5 Verification Filters are a new type of filter added in ASP.NET MVC 5.0. They run before authorization filters on ASP.NET MVC and allow you to specify authentication logic for each action, controller, or globally for all controllers. Authentication filters process credentials in a request and provide the appropriate principal. Authentication filters can also add authentication prompts in response to unauthorized requests. 2. Override the filter Now you can override filters that are related to a particular method of action or controller by specifying an override filter.
