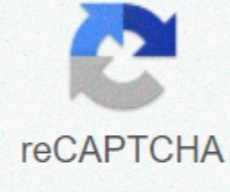

It was named after Sir Thomas Dale, the 17th century leader of the Virginia Colony. The high school is run by a local school division, Chesterfield County Public Schools. The story of Thomas Dale High School was named after Sir Thomas Dale, an English navy commander who served as colonial deputy governor of the Virginia Colony. The buildings and names of the school were built in 1906 and are named chester agricultural high school. In 1917, it was renamed Chester High School. In 1942, she was given the current name of Tom Dale High School. In the early 1940s, a new building was built on the western side of the original building. This building, formerly known as Chester High School, stands today as a town of Thomas Dale's ninth grade. In 1906, the structure was later demolished. In 1964, another alternate device opened less than a mile east of state route 10. In the mid-1980s, the building developed a little, and in the early 1990s there was some kind of internal renovation and addition of air conditioning. In 1997, an annex known as the Thomas Dale West campus was opened in the former Carver High School building on Branders Bridge Road to facilitate overcrowding. This facility was the 9th class. Between 1999 and 2001, the building was massively expanded and completely renovated in interior and exterior. Thomas Dale West Campus closed after completion of this project. Thomas Dale West campus was later converted to what is now Carver College and Career Center (formerly Community High School). Although the 2001 expansion was predicted to accommodate the school population for decades, the student population grew rapidly. It was decided that the neighbouring Chester High School would be closed due to budget cuts and overcrowding Dale, so high school annexed Chester Middle. Ninth graders are currently based in the former Chester High School, now known as Thomas Dale's ninth-grade town, and pupils in grades 10-12 are in the main town. Baseball: After the 2007 District Tournament Championship, the 2008 team went 20-3 en route to the regular season and tournament crown. In 2009, the team won the regular season championship again and advanced to the regional semifinals against a close deep run loss. [quote required] Football: Thomas Dale won his first state football championship on December 12, 2009, defeating Lake Braddock. [quote required] Football: In 2005, the Knights varsity boys' soccer team won the Virginia State AAA Football Championship. They successfully defended this title in 2006. [quote required] Tennis: The Thomas Dale Boys tennis team claimed five titles in 2010: Coach of the Year, Player of the Year and Boys Singles titles, Boys Doubles title, and team district champions. The 2011 season gave the Knights its 3rd straight title, ending the year with a 14-0 record. [quote required] Volleyball: Thomas Dale's 2007 boys volley went 26-0, losing only three sets all season, en route to Thomas Dale's third team state title in three years (Boys Soccer 2005, 2006). The participation of the college admission testing is both higher than Virginia's median rate of 33% and the top 28% participation. Thomas Dale High offers 15 AP courses. 13 percent of grades nine to twelve are included in at least one AP class. The AP participation rate is 37% percentile and slightly below the median AP enrollment rate in all Virginia schools at 17%. Thomas Dale High had 216 taking AP exams with 133 to pass at least one exam. The AP pass rate is 53% percentile and roughly equal to the Virginia state median of 58 percent.
