My request will be to share my heart openly about the concerns that have grown in some parts of the Body of Christ in recent months. From the beginning of this letter I want to clarify that I have no desire to attack anyone. This is not motivation. The desire to write this letter is to defend the truth and to let christ's body know that there is a completely different side to the debate that is currently taking place throughout Asia and in many places around the world. Edmund Burke once said that the only thing that is needed to win evil is for good people to do nothing. In a similar vein, the Bible says, Do not allow the good you speak evil (Rom. 14:16). This verse weighs on my heart. After consulting with close friends and advisers, I am convinced that now is the time for me to be vocal about the issues that are about to come. No one asked me to write this letter. I am not a member of the board or committee of the Return to Jerusalem movement, nor do I receive royalties from the Heavenly Man book, as I agreed before writing this book. I write this open letter simply as a friend who wants to testify on behalf of others. In 2001, I wrote a book called Man in Heaven. It is the testimony of the Chinese Christian brother Yun. To gather background information and confirm the testimonies contained in the book I interviewed many people in China who were eyewitnesses of the incident, as well as spending several weeks with the Yun brothers and going through his story. Even while writing the book, I knew two things were going to happen. First, I knew the book would touch and bless the lives of many, because Yun's testimony was amazing. I knew that despite his weaknesses and shortcomings, there was a man walking with God in a hungry way to see what Christians around the world were showing. Despair seemed to grow in the Western Church, especially among believers tired of tradition and status quo. Yun's life and testimony have examples of humility, faith, and patience that can speak to the lives of many Christians. The second thing I was sure of was that this book would bring great opposition from parts of the Christian world. There seems to be little change--perhaps--welcome to Church history has shown that it is easier for sleeping churches to attack the messengers of God's changes than to accept their teachings and possible corrections. This was the case with the Old Testament prophets god sent to Israel, and this was the same throughout the history of the Church. Even a few well-known Christian leaders were blessed with the book. Reinhard Bonke, a German minister, might start reading a book called Heaven's Man on the Couch, but he'll end up on his knees. This is what happened to me. People who read this page will not remain the same. Brother Yun's testimony awakens and shakes us. This is the message: In the most intense persecution, God's people, filled with the Holy Spirit, are invincible! They live, die enemies of God, and fill the world with the glorious gospel of Jesus Christ. We blame it on winning! This is true not only in China, but also around the world. This short testimony is a small sample of how thousands of people felt and how we thank the Lord for it. If He made it glorious! As these inspiring events unfolded, I watched a campaign that strongly attacked Brother Yun's integrity and testimony. At first, they didn't think too much of the attack, and they put them down to the constant opposition that anyone who serves God inevitably faces. I've known Brother Yun for many years, and I've seen the slurs and opposition he's endured. Some of them can be described as special. The main cause of these attacks is a website hosted by a Chinese man living in Hamburg, Germany. On the website he gives his name as Lynn Mush, but his real name is Titus Fan. This website is completely committed to destroying one person - the Yun brothers. It is chinese, English, German, and everything possible to make you look bad. It is full of outlying lies, slurs, half-truths, nonsense. It even went as far as publishing fake letters from Chinese believers denouncing the Yun brothers. When these people were contacted they were shocked and distressed that their names had been falsely used to defame a brother they loved and admired. Unfortunately, it is there, according to a statement released by eight respected Chinese pastors who investigated the claims on this website. He lives in Hamburg, Germany, where he continues to pour out accusations through the Internet, emails, letters, cassette tapes and CDs, discrediting brother Yun's reputation. We thoroughly checked the accusations and found the accusations to be false, unfounded and a distortion of true facts. In addition, certain figures quoted in the accusations deny discrediting the Yun brothers anyway. They also express their distaste for being used falsely, in context, by distortion of true facts without their consent. Dennis Balcombe, a well-known figure in Chinese ministry and pastor of Hong Kong's Heung-heung Christian Church, knows titus fan's attack on brother Yun and why. From the beginning I took a strong stance against these malicious attacks and told titus fans many times my position. It is sad and regrettable that the enemies of the Church have been able to work through him in this way. Everything he says and says is completely false. We sincerely pray that God will work in the hearts of the people so that he can see and support the truth of Brother Yun, who grew up. As bizarre as these accusations are, many Christians (especially Chinese believers living outside China) believed these accusations. Surprisingly, even a few respected senior mission deputy leaders were taken away by them. Various critics and opponents have emerged, some intent on doing everything they can to destroy the Yun brothers and his reputation through gossip and innuendo, content to convey false information as facts without any effort to verify it. This false information jumped into the wagon, not only among Chinese Christians, but also among many Western missionaries and pastors, despite not know what they were saying and what they so confidently affirmed (Team 1:7). Almost every day I receive emails from people who have heard something through others, and who in turn met people who read it on the internet! This kind of reasoning is completely biblical and very dangerous for God's people to indulge. All Satan has to do to destroy the reputation of one of God's children is to start some rumors. He knows

everything he needs to do and put it there and the believers will do the rest of the work for him! For Brother Yun, this is what is happening. In China, for whatever reason, these sins tend to be particularly prevalent. It's sometimes difficult to find someone who says something good about someone else. I believe it is one of the greatest weaknesses of the Church in China and one of the major threats to the tremendous revival that God has blessed them with in this generation. Part of the problem is that chinese house churches around the world are usually presented in all their glory, as the great men and women of God who live Perfect harmony. Some leaders have suffered in prison for too long and are thought to be practically innocent! The reality is a little more earthly. The Church in China has New Testament Christianity. I agree! But in the New Testament we read not only miracles and revivals, but also personal conflicts, jealousy, opposition, and false brothers. A glance at Lyzen Christ's message to the seven churches in the early chapters of revelation will reveal that early Christians were like us, and many weaknesses and failures were revealed. Many people practice a kind of theology that if there is smoke, there should be fire. If there is any controversy about my brother, it is the idea that the accusations are true, at least in part. This kind of theology is completely biblical and dangerous. If it is true, Jesus will be a sinner! He was strongly accused of all kinds of sins by the Pharisees and others. He was a very controversial figure. There was a lot of 'smoke' around Jesus, but there was no fire other than burning in his heart for what was lost. Many other Biblical figures, including Moses, Aaron, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Nehemiah, Joshua, Joseph, and the Apostle Paul, have been accused of many dirty and evil things that are not true. Just give it a few names. In recent years, soldiers fighting in Iraq have used new expressions to describe the worst ways to die or be injured in combat. Explain that if they were killed or injured by enemy bullets, they would be a great honor, but the worst insult they could experience was being hurt by a 'friendly fire'. It's a terrible feeling to be shot by fellow soldiers who thought they were on the same side! Unfortunately, and tragically, the 'friendly fire' is alive and well among God's people today. Christians like Brother Yun will think it is a great honor to be killed by Muslims or to tribesmen, who are preaching the gospel in far corners of the earth. But it is distressing and terrible to start a fire from fellow Christians who want to fight on your side. It is a sad commentary that some Christians assume is the worst about people they know nothing about. When a new preacher wanders around with a message to listen to, assumptions about his motives and integrity are often made, such as that they should be in it for money, and that He is deceiving people with his false messages. How sad and sad this is to the Holy Spirit! The term friendly fire is relatively new, but it has been done among believers since the church was born in saints. Throughout Christian history, we can see that the spark of God's revival is being soaked up by Church leaders, many of them in ignorance and passion to 'protect' the gospel. More often than not, They were persecuting what they didn't understand. Throughout history, many of the great Christian leaders have been the target of brutal attacks by other Christians. Journalist Alex Buchan commented on some of these in an article for Compass Direct on November 21, 1997. In fact, Buchan, a prominent Chinese house church leader who was an article about a slanderous attack on another church, probably meant more to me because he read about the church father because his response felt similar a few days ago. I am as angry as the great Tertulian lying in Praxeous, a heretic in the most charitable terms imaginable. I read with dismay the apparent disobedience of the so-called Dr. Grace, St. Augustine, who called for Donatijongfa to be punished by the military. Many of the great heroes of faith seem to be burning with hatred for those perceived as enemies of God, just as they have lit up with love for God. Sadly, 'friendly fire' is nothing new in China either. Recently, while researching a new book, I read how Nestorian Christians strongly attacked John of Montecorvino in Beijing in 1305. John has baptized 6,000 people over the past few years, but has been called a spy, magician, and short-story by a jealous Nettorian. John later said that if it wasn't for all the slurs, I should have baptized more than 30,000 people. During the Welsh Revival in the early 1900s, God used a young man named Evan Roberts as a major tool of blessing for a dry, thirsty country. At the time, however, most Welsh clergy strongly opposed Roberts' ministry and feared the impact he would have on their congregation. Several full-page ads were published in newspapers at the time accusing Welsh ministers of being heretical and con. Dozens of ministers signed the slanderous attack. Today, the name Evan Roberts is lovingly remembered around the world as the human vessel that God brought a revival to Wales 100 years ago. Few people can remember the name of one of his detractors. Revivalists like Charles Finney and D.L. Moody have also been strongly condemned by other Christian leaders. Even Billy Graham was strongly attacked during his faithful ministry to the Lord. His autobiography records how a series of early meetings in England were met with tremendous opposition from the Church, which opposed him and did everything he could to return the former to the United States. My friend, who attended the Billy Graham Crusade in the United States a few years ago, didn't listen to this man when he saw a group of Christians protesting outside the stadium. His teachings will send you to hell! The first thing we need to realize Who is really behind all the attacks on God's children. The Bible says that our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against rulers, authorities, against the power of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the realms of heaven (6:12). How blind we can be! Because we cannot fight the dark kingdom and each other at the same time, Satan knows if he can stand against a Christian, and he has already won the battle. Paul pointed this out to the Faithful a long time ago, and the fact that you filed a lawsuit among you means that you have already been completely defeated (1 Cor. 6:7). As mentioned earlier, titus Pan, a German-based Chinese man who calls himself 'Lynn Muche' on the Internet, founded the website. He bitterly declares the Yun brothers lies, liars, thieves. I would like to ask one simple question to get started. You may have heard the expression you can't see the forest for all the trees. If someone professing a Christian should have an entire website dedicated to destroying other Christians, are you clearly saying that Christians are strange and suspicious? There seems to be no limit to the different ways in which these attacks on brother Yun began. Internet, email campaigns, videos, cassette tapes, DVDs... All emitted from the same source. It's not worth guessing why the fans were so motivated. All my efforts to contact him were unanswered. In the late 1990s, Titus Fan was a strong advocate for The Yun Brothers and was even the first person in the West to publicly promote Yun and his testimony. All of these attacks only prompted minimal reaction until a German website convinced three Chinese church leaders - Samuel Lam, Moses Xie and Alan Yuan - to sign a counter-letter to Brother Yun, who said he should repent before it was too late. Samuel Lam even wrote a short article titled 'The Man of Heaven - China's Great Prisoner Man', which he distributes in Chinese and English to anyone visiting his church. Many say that if three elderly people from China say Yun is a liar, it should be true. After all, a young pastor has spent more than 20 years in prison for the gospel, and as a heroic statesman of the persecuted church, christians around the world look on. Surely someone like him would never issue accusations against another brother if that wasn't true? First, let me tell you that it is a good thing for the body of Christ to be on the lookout for charlatans, deceptions, and heretics. In fact, the Bible counsels us to do so, and such a fall is one of the signs that we are living in our last days (see, for example, 24:4-5). If you have a Yun brother, With only a small fraction of the terrible things that are said about him, it would be a duty to warn others about them. But the Bible also clearly suggests the way people should go in discovering whether a person is a mistake or at risk to others. If you don't adhere to these principles, all you have to do to destroy someone else's reputation is to create and deliver a few lies. Generally there is enough gossip around to help these lies get wider circulation. The first thing the Bible says in such a situation is that the accused must face it. If Jesus' brother sinned against you, go and show him his fault between the two men. If he listens to you, you beat your brother. But if he does not listen, say to the Church, if he does not listen to them, 'take one or two men so that all things may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.' And if he does not listen to the church, treat him like a pagan or tax collector (18:15-17). The Apostle Paul taught us what to do when a brother is in sin: Brother, if someone is caught up in sin, the spiritual man must gently restore him. But watch out for yourself, or you may also be tempted (Gal. 6:1). In this case, did the principles of confrontation follow against Brother Yun? Was Samuel Lamb or other old Chinese brothers trying to go to Brother Yun about the 'concerns' they may have? No! In fact, you might be surprised to learn that The Rev. Samuel Lam admits that he has never met Yun before, and that he doesn't even read his books in Chinese or English. In fact, Yang knows little about Yun's life or ministry except what Titus Fan (Lynn Mush) heard, and therefore his attacks are senseless and futile. Obviously these attacks on the integrity of one person by someone else who hasn't met him offer no trust at all! I personally picked up the Bible and met Samuel Lamb at his church at least 10 to 15 times since the late 1980s. I last talked to him on the morning of June 27, 2005. I found him as friendly and attractive as ever. He admitted that he had never met Yun, and that if he had the opportunity to do so, he would refuse because he was a bad person. Lam also said he learned this from a German 'Lynn Mush' (Titus fan). When I suggested that the source of his information could lie, Yang laughed but did not answer. When asked if he thought it was right to blame someone he had never met, the answer was once again a disarming laugh, and nothing else. He still gives his 'Con Man' articles to visitors to his church. Similarly, our colleagues have tried to talk to two other Beijing-based brothers, Moses Xie and Alan Yuan, but they are also very hesitant to explain. They signed a statement. These two beloved Christian men admit they met Yoon a few years ago, but never since. Even the secular world does not hear such testimonies. Can you imagine a scene in court where one person accuses you of another horrific crime? The judge leaned forward and asked the accuser, How long have you known this man? and asked. Accuser, red-faced, whispering, oh, actually I've never met him before your honor... This situation is less absurd, but many believers immediately assumed that the accusations against brother Yun were true because of the weight of these three men's reputations. Unfortunately, this kind of character assassination is so prevalent in China today. In December 2004, an American missionary, blessed by God throughout China, sent a lengthy email to various leaders of the Chinese ministry, scolding them for things like the spread of gossip and slander among the missionary community. The letter had absolutely nothing to do with Brother Yun's situation, but it was about similar accusations against another Church leader in China. Some of these brothers' papers said, some think it's their ministry to say what they think and repeat what they hear. I have been taught that we will explain to God every idle word we speak. Today, fear of God does not seem to be dangerous, especially with those in Chinese ministry... Some seem to thrive on negativity. Missions are a competitive field (some). We need to write a newsletter. We need to impress people and raise money. Often we feel we need a story. Or any case to fight against or against. All this can make us unreliable journalists. Why do people schedule meetings to fly to China to hear stories about their leaders? If the brothers are guilty, everything will come out in public. in this life or in the judgment seat of Christ. The Holy Spirit does not need you or I to be His voice in the world, and he warns us of the sins of our brethren... In fact, the accusations people make will not affect the life or ministry of any servant of the Lord. God did not give you or I that kind of power. He is the sovereign. The writer, who worked for many years in communist countries in Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union before coming to China, dealt another serious aspect of Christian business in the communist country - the fact that some church leaders compromised and became tools in the hands of the authorities. In fact, the government is mobilizing corrupt ministers and leaders to launch the most vicious attacks and smear campaigns. He doesn't matter that in a communist country, 100 trusted sources tell you something, it can still be a lie. That's why the Bible provides clear guidance on how to deal with them. There are many traitors in the Church of the Lower House of China. We would be naive to think otherwise. Throughout all these struggles, I watched Brother Yun closely and was amazed by his pious response to all the criticisms against him. Not only has he refused to go into public debate with anyone, he has completely forgiven all of the persecutors and has no grudges at all. How did Brother Yun respond to the three former patriarchs of the Church in China? Is he bitter and seeking revenge? Well, let's see what Yun says in a remarkable statement on the Return to Jerusalem website: In the presence of the Lord, I would say that I hold absolutely nothing against the people of God who wrote booklets about me, and I have completely forgiven them. In fact, the booklets did not diminish my deep respect for these people. One day we will hug before Our Heavenly Father, and we know that misunderstandings will be forgotten as we worship the Lamb of God together. If someone has any questions about my story, or any other inquiry, I am very willing to meet publicly or privately and answer any questions someone may have. Let's march our hands forward, aside from all obstructions, for the kingdom of God! God!

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
