The New Mexico Intestacy Act gives your property to the closest relatives, starting with your spouse and children. If you don't have a spouse or children, your grandchildren or parents will get your property. This list continues with increasingly distant relatives, including siblings, grandparents, aunts and uncles, excellent aunts and uncles, nieces and nephews, cousins of any degree, and descendants of the spouse who dies before you.
