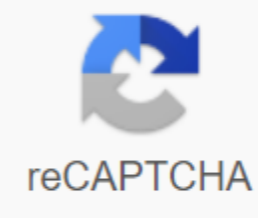

The film was released on May 6, 2016, to be the lead single for the soundtrack of trolls (2016), in which Timberlake voiced the character Branch and served as executive music producer. The film was written and produced by Timberlake, Max Martin, and Shellback. Musically, this is a disco-pop uptempo number, soul-pop with funk influences. The song was released as a single on May 6, 2016,[1] six months before the film debuted, and was served to contemporary hit radio on May 10, 2016. [2] Timberlake gave his first televised appearance from Can't Stop the Feeling! during the eurovision song contest 2016 grand final interval action. Directed by Mark Romanek, the music video was released on May 16, 2016, and follows Timberlake on a tour of everyday venues as he dances through what may be an ordinary day. It accumulated over 1 billion views. A large number of fan-generated videos followed the release of the song's video. The single debuted atop the US Billboard Hot 100, opening with 379,000 downloads in its first week, marking Timberlake's fifth number one single in the country, and making it the 26th song in Hot 100 history to start at the top of the charts. [3] In addition, it became the second song to spend its first ten weeks a top of the Digital Songs chart. The single marked her fifth number one single on the Radio Songs chart and her eighth in the Mainstream Top 40. It is one of the twenty longest-running number one singles on the Adult Contemporary chart. Internationally, it topped the charts in Argentina, Brazil, Belgium, Canada, czech republic, France, Germany, Hungary, Israel, Mexico, Netherlands, Russia, Scotland, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, Sweden, and Switzerland, and the top five in most of Europe. Can't Stop the Feeling! is the best-selling song of 2016 in the US. [4] As of 2017[update], it has sold 3.3 million downloads in the country. [5] For Apple Music, it was the second best performing song of the year. [6] The Official Charts Company of england named it Timberlake's biggest song in the country, with over a million units sold. [7] The song received several awards and such as his nomination for the Academy Award for Best Original Song at the 89th annual ceremony[8] (where performed the song as the opening number), the Golden Globe Award for Best Original Song[9] and the Critics' Choice Award for Best Song,[10] and won the Grammy Award for Best Song Written for Visual Media. [11] It was the 41st Hot 100 number one song nominated for an Academy Award. [12] The background and composition cannot stop the feeling! In the early stages of recording his fifth studio album,[13] Timberlake also served as executive music producer for the trolls film soundtrack. [14] The disco-pop song uptempo was written and produced by Timberlake, Max Martin and Shellback. [16] Entertainment Weekly described the song as a funky mix of disco and pop. [18] For The A.V. Club, it was a soul-pop sugar fever tweaked for maximum dance grooves. [19] Can't Stop the Feeling! written in key C major with a tempo of 113 denyk per minute. The song follows the progression of the C – Am7 – Fmaj9 – Am7 chords, and Timberlake's vocals cover two octaves, from E3 to E5. [20] The song features jazzy, uptempo beats, and falsetto choirs. [21] The film feels like a great and trippy disco experience. But we don't have disco songs, says Timberlake of the Trolls soundtrack. We have 'September' [by Earth, Wind & Fire], but we thought this was a great opportunity to do a modern disco song. I think disco is a really underappreciated genre. [22] Can't Stop the Feeling! appeared in the denouement of the film, conceived with the idea of covering the disco genre inspired by the situation of the last scene. [23] Timberlake commented the song was inspired by Bill Withers' Lovely Day. [24] What's different about this is that it's not even like writing just a song for a movie, it's writing a song for a character who's going to sing it in a movie. That's the part that makes it a task that none of us have ever done. It's a modern animated musical, and we wanted to encourage ourselves to do something that worked that way. I'm glad we did, but nothing came easily.— Timberlake's reply to a question on The Wrap, which said: Are there more constraints to writing songs for movies you don't get when you write yourself? [23] Billboard's critical acclaimed writers,[15] Rolling Stone,[25] Fuse[17] and USA Today[26] highlighted its appeal for the summer. Billboard's Adelle Platon called it fun and jam that tasted good. [15] Nate Chinen of The New York Times wrote Timberlake was on a strong footing here, gliding over disco-pop beats and urging all comers to capture the spirit. Jon Niles of Music Times The song brings out a feeling of pure joy that only a talent as big as Timberlake can bring to the table. [28] For CNN CNN's Lisa Respers France If Friday had a vote, it would be Can't Stop the Feeling! Justin Timberlake. [29] Ed Masley wrote in AZCentral the lyrics sounded like they were specially made to be the soundtrack for your favorite summer memories. [30] For The A.V. Club, Annie Zaleski wrote the perfect summer song that I could blast while driving in a car with the window down. The tone doesn't have to be meaningful—in fact, the lighter, the better—and should offer a few minutes of unplanned escape. This year, I can already say that Can't Stop The Feeling! is my hot weather jam. [19] A.V. Club included it in the top 40 songs of 2016 (first half). [31] Billboard critics rated Can't Stop the Feeling! at number 33 on the list of the 100 Best Pop Songs of 2016, adding rhythm will finally make you dance. [32] Digital Spy considered it the 19th best pop song of the year,[33] while Idolator named it the 20th best song of the year,[34] for feel-good and infectious. Instead, contributors to Time and Spin gave him unfavorable reviews, with the first naming him the worst song of 2016 and the latter stating, There are certain songs that are famous not only for their popularity, but for their irresistible repetition. [36] The Can't Stop the Feeling Award! won the Grammy Award for Best Song Written for Visual Media at the 59th annual Grammy Awards. [11] Timberlake received the Hollywood Song Award for Can't Stop the Feeling! at the 2016 Hollywood Film Awards[37] and won the award for Best Song Written for an Animated Film at the 2016 Hollywood Music in Media Awards. [38] The song was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Original Song,[8] the Golden Globe Award for Best Original Song,[9] the Critics' Choice Award for Best Song,[10] the Satellite Award for Best Original Song,[39] and by the Guild of Music Supervisors Awards for Best Song/Record Made for a Film. [40] Can't Stop the Feeling! won the award for Song of the Year at the 2017 iHeartRadio Music Awards[41] and Favorite Song of the Summer at the 43rd People's Choice Awards. [42] The former was also nominated for Best Song from a Film. For the Teen Choice Awards 2016, she received nominations for Choice Summer Song, Choice Party Song and Choice Song from Film or TV Show. [43] The song received nominations for Song of the Summer at the 2016 MTV Video Music Awards,[44] for International Song of the Year at the 2016 NRJ Music Awards,[45] and for Favorite Song at the 2017 Kids' Choice Awards. [46] The 2016 BBC Music Awards made the Song of the Year nominees list. [47] Among other international awards, he was nominated at the Australian APRA Music Awards in the International Work of the Year category,[48] at the Hungarian Music Awards in Pop-Rock Album/Record of the Year,[49] dan di Mexican Telehit Awards di Song of the Year. [53] The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP) recognized it as one of the most performed songs of 2016 and 2017. [54] The song was also nominated for the World Soundtrack Award for Best Original Song Written Directly for a Film. [56] Instead of Timberlake's solo version, the film version of the song was submitted to the general field and visual media categories, eventually earning nominations only in the latter and winning. The Recording Academy changed some of the rules[which?] for the next award. Grammy SVP Bill Freimuth explained to Variety: 'An easy way to understand this is to call it The Justin Timberlake Rule or The 'Trolls' Rule. Last year, what I thought pushed the proposal was we had a rule that only one version of the song could be delivered in a given year, and in this case, it [Timberlake's] 'Can't Stop the Feeling.' They sent out a version of the soundtrack because they thought it had the best chance for recognition, but that version had Anna Kendrick and James Corden and basically the whole cast sang it. It worked great for the film, but it wasn't the one that got the radio screening - it was a Justin Timberlake track, and they weren't allowed to send it for Record of the Year. So having given more thought to it, it seems that music for visual media is so specific that it makes sense to allow [change]. [57] North American commercial performance counted the first three days of its run, Can't Stop the Feeling! debuted at number 24 in the US Mainstream Top 40 and started at number 19 in the adult top 40, both for the chart on May 21, 2016. [58] Can't Stop the Feeling! became the first song in Mediabase Top 40 history to close the entire panel of Top 40 radio stations in its first week, becoming the most added song in all 186 of them. [59] Can't Stop the Feeling! becoming the 26th song to debut at number one on the US Billboard Hot 100 in the chart edition on May 28, 2016,[3] marking Justin Timberlake's fifth single to top the charts in the country. The song started at the Hot 100 Summit most buoyed by its number one debut on the Digital Songs sales chart (where it was Timberlake's sixth leader), after selling 379,000 downloads in its first week (ending May 12), according to Nielsen Music. Timberlake scored his highest weekly sales total for a song, best 315,000 units starting for Suit & amp; Tie on 2013. The song entered Streaming Songs at number six with 15.6 million US streams in its first full week. On Radio Songs, the song went up from 27-9 after its first full week of airplay (83 (83) in the audience), became the first song to reach the top 10 Radio Songs in just two weeks of the chart since Adele's Hello (November 14, 2015). With Give It to Me the last hot 100 lead dated April 28, 2007, Timberlake returned to number one after nine years and one month, the longest span between the leaders since Christina Aguilera waited 10 years, two months and one week between Lady Marmalade in 2001 and her turn featured on Maroon 5 Moves like Jagger in 2011. Among men, he saw Timberlake end the longest break between hot 100 number one since Dr. Dre went 12 years, two months and three weeks between No Diggity (by Blackstreet featuring Dr. Dre) and Crack a Bottle, his collaborations with Eminem and 50 Cent. [3] The song spent 52 weeks on the Billboard Hot 100, becoming one of the few singles to have spent at least a year on the charts,[60] and 62 weeks on the Digital Songs chart. [61] Can't Stop the Feeling! reached number one on Radio Songs in just its fifth week, marking the fastest sprint to the top since Hello Adele took just four weeks in November 2015. Among male artists, the single made the fastest rise to number one on Radio Songs in nearly 25 years, since Michael Jackson's Black or White set a record with a three-week ascent in 1991. Mariah Carey's I'll Be There tied the knot in 1992. [62] The single also tied Hello Adele for the fastest rise to the top of the Adult Top 40. Among men, Feeling gave Pharrell Williams an eight-week journey to the top with Happy, which reached number one in April 2014, for the fastest climb to the top spot by a solo male artist. Can't Stop the Feeling! also reached the top of the Mainstream Top 40, where Timberlake passed Bruno Mars for the most number one among men. [63] With Can't Stop the Feeling! spending the sixth week a top of Digital Songs, the song became Timberlake's longest lead on the charts, passing SexyBack. In addition, it marked Timberlake's best weekly audience for the song with 163 million, passing the 159 million that Mirrors pictures at its peak. [64] The following week, it became Timberlake's first number one solo on Adult Contemporary. Reaching the top of ac in just his eighth week, Feeling completed the fastest run to number one for a song (non-holiday) by a male artist in 17 years, since Phil Collins's You'll Be in My Heart took just six weeks in 1999. Among all the songs, Feeling made its fastest journey to number one on AC since Adele's Hello: four weeks, in November 2015. [65] Timberlake also earned his sixth number one on Dance Club Songs with Can't Stop the Feeling!. He reached the top of the charts without the help of a commissioned remix However, versions of Barry Harris, Fenix and Erick Decks, among others, have helped bring the song to the club crowd. [66] Can't Stop the Feeling! became the eighth song to top Digital Songs for at least 10 10 and the first since Mark Ronson's Uptown Funk led for a record-tying 13 weeks in 2015; Low flo Rida first set the mark with 13 weeks at number one in Digital Songs in 2007–08. Feeling was the second song to spend its first 10 weeks on Digital Songs at number one, joining Boom Boom Pow by The Black Eyed Peas, who recorded its first 10 weeks at the top of the charts in 2009. [67] In the US it was the best-selling song of the summer, while listed at number 2 on Billboard's seasonal rankings. [68] Spotify named it the fifth most streamed song of the summer globally. [69] As of December 2016[update], the song has sold 2.495 million downloads in the country, making it the best-selling song of the year according to Nielsen Music. [4] It was also the third most-heard song on US radio in 2016, with 3.422 billion views for the year. It was the second most played song in terms of total drama, with 587,000. [4] Can't Stop the Feeling! is one of the 20 longest-running number one singles on the Adult Contemporary chart. It is also one of only eight singles in the Billboard Hot 100's 58-year history to spend its first 40 weeks or so in the top 40. [70] The film reached the top spot of the Canadian Hot 100 in its fifth week,[71] after spending its first four weeks at number 2. [72] In September 2016, quadruple platinum was certified by the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA)[73] and platinum sextuple by Music Canada. [74] As of 2018[update], the song has amassed 7.6 million units in the US, combining sales (3.3 million downloads) and equivalent streams. [75] In 2016, Can't Stop the Feeling! it ranked 9th most popular song of the year on the Billboard Hot 100. [76] One year after
