The city of Boonton Recycling, located in Boonton, NJ, is a recycling center that collects and accepts recycling materials. The recycling center prevents recycling materials from entering the waste water currents, limiting the amount of waste produced by Boonton residents. In Boonton, recycling programs include recycling services from residential properties, inspection collections in apartments and commercial properties, and station transfer stations that accept recycling.
