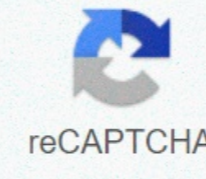




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## Ford dvd headrest manual

I guess most any year would help, but I have a 2014 specific. I would love to install them myself to save money. I have installed AMPs, stereos and speakers, so I have a very small piece of experience. I think I can thread the wires through the seat, but wonder about the best way to hide the control box and where to connect the power for the disconnected power. I did a search and read through the post, but did not find anything detailed. Some trial and error but really not difficult. Took about an hour and a half. I was never able to find detailed instructions for flex, but found bits of other installs to help with this one. You can find better ways to route wires and such, but this worked for me. These instructions are for a 2014 Flex Ltd. The difference from other years may be where the Smart Junction Block is or basically the fuse box is located. On any other Ford install SJB was on the passenger side under the dashboard. The set of DVD headrests I got was from eBay. They were marketed as compatible with a 2011-2015 Explorer. The set basically contained, the forehead support (pre-wired and color coded), control box (pre-wired and color coded), tie downscable ties, padding, lock holder connections, wire puller and user stuff. 1. For me the first step was to, off course remove the old headrest and conduct the wiring for DVD Headrest (HR). 2. The old HR comes out easy to press both buttons at base 3. To pull the wires from the DVD HR I had to open up seat covers at the bottom. The 2014 locations don't go full forward, but I tilted them as much as possible. There was a small flap on the underside of the seat seat any locks that come off easily. You can feel them quite easily. 4. Then there is a long lock of black plastic locking that holds the front and back of the seat cover together. This was a pain to get apart but can be done. 5. I didn't take the site cover all the way away. But by unlocking the long black locks it allowed just enough give to pull the wires from the DVD HR down through the back of the seat. Others might want to take it all the way away to better secure the threads but I felt ok just pulling them through. It was a pain to reach up to get the wires, I was able to do it by moving the seat all the way forward and sitting on the floor behind the seat. 6. DVD HR has different color threads. One with Red/White and the other with Blue/Black. HR with red/White is HR A. Meaning, what is played on this one can be seen on HR B at the same time. But I don't think it works the other way around. Just something to consider when deciding which side to put them on. 7. I left the DVD HR in the highest position to make sure there was enough stack on the wires. I made the threads through the openings near the bottom of the long black locks. 8. I used some of the cable ties to hold them together. 9. For me because the Smart Junction Block (SJB) is on the driver's side I put the DVD Control Box (CB) under the driver's seat. 10. To route the wires from the passenger side to the drivers, there is basically enough give under the center console to just power them under the console. 11. I first connected the DVD HR threads to CB Wires. Then they used the black lock holders to secure the connection. You get 4 of these. You should be able to tell me what they're for. Then use one of the padded sticky pads and wrap it around each connection. 12. Before securing the wires under the passenger seat, and it's up to you how to secure them, but I made sure they don't interfere with the seat. I left enough slack so that the seat could travel all the way back and forth, although the upper seat part could go all the way forward or backward. 13. I then repeated the process on the drive side. 14. Now I had to pull the power and ground cable to SJB. 15. The power cable is just a t-harness that you connect in line with the factory harness 16. This factor harness for me was located just below the fuse box as you can see in the photo. It's the only one that fits the t-harness. 17. I routed the cable from the DVD CB from under the seat to the side door trim. 18. Not the cleanest install, but still out of place. You can see the cable coming from under the seat in one of the picture below. 19. The door bottom trim or rocker panel I guess, just pulls up and is held on by clips. 20. I ran the thread under the rocker panel securing it with tape. I read an install guide for an expedition that ran the thread under the carpet. It's up to you. 21. If you take off the second of the door strip closet to the dash you will see a grounding place. 22. Next is the toughest part to get to, body wise. SBJ is below the line to the left of the steering wheel. 23. Under the fuse box is where the factory was located. You don't even need to open the fuse box. Just pop out the factory harness, connect the inline hardness and your good to go. 24. Test to make sure everything comes on. DVD HR should be switched power and only turn on with accessory power or with the car running. 25. If everything works only secure the wiring. I secured the DVD CB to the carpet on the floor. 26. You really can't see any of my wires with the seats back. (Excuse the dirty carpet). Contacts secured with clutch lock and padding. Contacts secured to the seat and under center console. Picture of where I drove the Sele line to the door panel. You can see it only in the middle of the image. Picture running wire in door seal. Image of Earth screw Image of t-harness connected to factor harness. Picture of harness plugged in. For me, it was just under the fuse box. The back of the seats. Wires that are not displayed. Dirty carpets, blame the kids. Finished installing AS2000 option for about \$500, installed.
