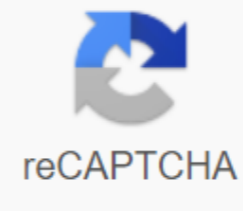

Registration begins on a specific date for autumn and spring. All finalists arriving on a first-served basis are registered. Students who have submitted their applications and final documents well before the deadline for applications are given priority registration. Once the class reaches its capacity, the class is closed and students have to choose a different course. Students currently enrolled in the program are given a pre-date date for the registration date posted at their CUNYFirst student center. All students must have a CUNYFirst account to be able to enroll in courses. A list of program courses is added to the CUNYFirst portal before the registration date. Students have the opportunity to browse the courses offered in that semester and plan the semester before enrolling in the courses.
