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The first day back-to-school often looks very different for arizona students who see friends with many students and do it with online connection with teachers via video conferencing. Earlier this summer, many schools asked parents to choose whether their students should attend classes in person when COVID-19 cases decline, or whether they want their students to attend school online all year long. Most students start with online classes, a data set the Arizona Department of Health Services will provide by August 7 until school districts determine when they can safely bring students and school staff to campus. Leticia Padilla's three children will attend full-time online school in the Dysart Unified School District this year because two of them have asthma. Even for my daughter who doesn't have asthma, if she gets it, I send her to school, we bring her home, so we're all exposed. It was a major concern, Padilla told Fox 10 News. On the other side, we were worried about what they were miss. They miss social interaction with other children, they just miss school functions, classes they miss because some classes are not given. For dysart Unified School District high school students, remote learning will begin with video conferencing on one side and a split screen with course material on the other, said Michelle Feist, a 9th grade English teacher at Shadow Ridge High School District (@DysartUSD) August 3, 2020 Students will be working on courses adapting to online
learning or schoology will be working on virtual course material in Florida for this course, Feist said a student would go to a subject unit with weeks and dates to find part of the unit they were working on. Feist said students can work as the teacher speaks in a section of an interactive workbook online or be sent to work for 20 minutes on their own. Feist, every week the parent will be able to see an agenda for that week and what will happen. Said. Feist said each student's daily routine will be different from subject to subject, teacher to teacher, and grade level to grade level. Learning looks different for students in elementary, secondary and high schools. Brynn Porter, who goes to the Queen Creek Unified School District with her children, said she created a spreadsheet for each of her children because their learning schedules are different every day.
