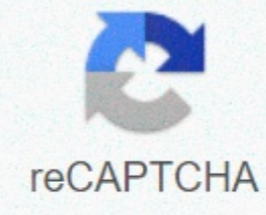

This office reviews erosion control plans for construction sites of 1 acre or more and issues land disturbing permits for sites of 12,000 square feet or more.
