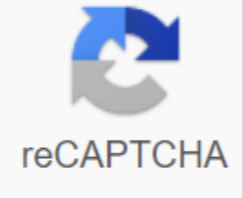

While some may mourn the loss of material in our daily lives, online film-watching eliminates problems with losing or damaging fragile discs and makes movies available on different platforms so you can watch movies they own anywhere and anytime without having to remember to grab your DVDs. Of course illegal downloading and streaming is very popular, but it deprives many people who have worked to make a movie about the compensation they deserve for their blood, sweat and tears. In addition, the options available can often be of low quality, and you run the risk of infecting your PC or mobile device with a virus if you don't know what you're doing. Here's a guide to many different legal ways to watch movies online for those who aren't familiar with the process who are eager to break free from scratched-DVD hell. Yes, it will cost you a little money, but there are many advantages over both traditional DVDs and illegal downloads. Streaming services There is a litany of options for watching content online. One of the most popular methods is to use online streaming services such as Netflix, Hulu Plus or Amazon Prime Instant Video. These services charge either a monthly or annual fee and give you access to tons of content, although there's always a chance that the specific movie you're looking for won't be on any streaming service you have. The content these services have access to is constantly changing as they close new offers, so you're not stuck with the same options month after month. The above services are also great for watching TV and have started making their own original shows to compete in the TV market. Many of these shows, such as Netflix House of Cards and Orange is the New Black, have received glowing reviews. There are some limited options for streaming online that are legal and free. Crackle is a website that offers movies and TV shows for free streaming, but it's ad-supported and you'll end up seeing about as many ads as you'd watch programming on cable. The amount of content Crackle offers is also a slimmer choice than subscription services because the site doesn't have the financial muscle to make giant content purchases like larger sites, so it can be harder to find your favorite movie. The downside of the online streaming service is that you are at the mercy of the content that the company offers; You can't just pick out some movie under the sun and be guaranteed to be able to watch it. You also don't own movies, so if Netflix gets rid of your favorite movie, you'll find you can't watch it. Downloading One Way to Own Movies and Watch download them online. Whether you're a fan of Google or Apple, both iTunes and the Google Play Store offer movies to buy through accounts that become yours. New versions cost around \$20; approximately the same price as a DVD would cost, even if the digital copy cannot be lost or damaged. Of course, buying individual titles to own is more expensive than paying a small fee for streaming services and getting access to oodles content. Both iTunes and Google Play also offer movies for rent at a lower price. Renting gives you the opportunity to watch a movie once every 30-day period and 24 hours to finish after you've clicked to play. These options are also great for switching between devices, as iTunes and Google Play remember where you are in your movie if you're interrupted and want to switch from TV to tablet or smartphone. Amazon offers movies to buy or rent at similar prices to Apple and Google, and you don't need a Prime membership to access the service. Other Guides Great Players Sony Crackle, Crackle, or Crackle Plus Once known simply as Crackle, this free streaming site has undergone almost as many name changes as P. Diddy. Originally controlled by Sony, it's now a joint-venture between Sony and Chicken Soup for Soul Entertainment (CSS). This partnership created a new entity called Crackle Plus and it was believed that it would also become the name of the streaming service. However, one look at the site and it's clear that simplicity won: It's just called Crackle. Whatever you call it, the service includes content from six ad-supported CSS streaming services (Popcornflix, Popcornflix Kids, Popcornflix Comedy, Frightpix, Españolflix and Truji), as well as some Sony movies and TV shows. You'll find a good number of blockbusters like Speed, Transporter and Close Encounters of the Third Kind, and a generous round of obscure but interesting B-movies. Cracking is a great resource, although constant interruptions from advertisers can grow old quite The service is offered in 21 countries, but has ended its Canadian, Latin American and Australian offerings. IMDb TV Newer to this roundup is amazon-owned IMDb TV (formerly known as Freedive). It has free, ad-supported TV shows and movies. In February 2020, the service acquired the rights to more than 20 Disney-owned series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Malcolm in the Middle and My So-Called Life. It's also the only site that lets you stream Lost and Malcolm on Wednesdays for free. Other TV shows in its relatively small library include Fringe, Heroes, Quantum Leap and Forensic Files. Films include Memento, La La Land, Drive, Monster, Donnie Darko, Dune, Illusionist, Zodiac, Clue and more. You can watch IMDb TV on the web, Amazon Fire devices and Apple TV, and through the Amazon Prime app, which you can find on many smart TVs, tablets and phones. IMDb TV is U.S.-only for now, though European expansion is in the works. Vudu Walmart-owned Vudu might be better known for its subscription streaming service, but the platform also has an impressive and free ad-supported content section. Titles like The Escort, 10,000 Days and The Offering are a good example of what you'll find. If you sail through a place choosing 4K/HDR titles, there are even one or two free-to-watch options. You'll still need a Vudu account, but you can create one for free. The Vudu app is already supported by many platforms, including Roku, Apple TV, game consoles, and more. In addition, an app is available for most mobile devices. Vudu is only available in THE US Hoopla As it is at a good price: Sign up for the library card and get free downloads or streams of movies, no ads at all. This is the solution when you use Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that works with local libraries to give members access to borrowable content online. It's similar to Overdrive, but with more than just ebooks and audiobooks. The availability of any title will depend on your location and the number of copies available for download, but when checking in August 2020 we found surprisingly decent movies. Streaming will work on any device with a browser, while downloading requires the Hoopla app on a mobile device. Not every library currently supports Hoopla, so be sure to ask. Meanwhile, libraries in the U.S. and Canada have access to Hoopla. YouTube This is a no-brainer. Everyone knows YouTube is the biggest video-hosting service online, and probably already use the site for silly cat videos and footage of people getting hit with workout balls. But YouTube has a sizable collection of feature films at its free level as well. It's true that most of them are B-list news, but there are a few quality flicks hiding there. In addition to free, Google-curated movies, there are thousands of movies on pages that don't appear unless you're looking for them directly. If you're looking for a specific title, especially an older one, it's worth doing a quick YouTube search to see if someone posted it. These are not always recorded by movie rights holders and many of them are divided into episodes and playlists, but as they say, beggars can not choose. Finding free movies on YouTube has become more difficult recently, as more rights holders have decided to offer their movies for rent through the service, and YouTube also has subscription levels such as YouTube Premium and its live TV service, YouTube TV. Still, you'll find plenty to watch, especially if your standards aren't too high in terms of current quality. Vimeo YouTube may be the biggest video-hosting site, but Vimeo is probably the best. yes, they're fighting words, but Vimeo has the muscle to support them. The site has a clean layout that lacks ads and benefits from an active user community that is widely considered more professional and constructive than YouTube. Many great original short and feature films will emerge from this community. Vimeo also has an on-demand section where users can purchase full-length movies and TV shows. Most of them are independently produced by Vimeo users, but some offers are also produced by large studios. Either way, Vimeo is a great place to find free, high quality movies. Roku Channel When Roku initially launched its free, ad-supported Roku channel, it wasn't technically eligible for this roundup because you had to have one of the company's streaming media devices to see it. Roku's device won't break the bank, but it's not free. Now, however, the Roku channel is available to everyone, through the web, as well as through the company's free apps for iOS and Android. The service boasts more than 10,000 titles to choose from, including old favorites such as Con Air, Boyz n Hood, Must Love Dogs, and the Police Academy. You'll need to create a free Roku account before you can watch, but this is a quick and painless process. If you ever decide to expand your options, the roku channel is now home to several premium subscription options, including Showtime, Epix and Starz. Roku Channel is available in the US and Canada. Plex Free Movies and TV Shows Plex is best known as a versatile and easy way to manage and watch your private collection of movies, music, photos and other media. In 2019, however, the company launched its own free ad-supported streaming service with a collection of movies and TV shows from studios such as MGM, Warner, Lionsgate and Legendary. It is available globally, although title selection will vary widely from region to region. You can access a collection of movies and shows from your browser or on any huge number of devices plex client software such as Apple TV, Roku, smart TVs, etc. All you need is a free Plex account and you are good to go. For those who already use Plex as their media server, free ad-supported options can be added to existing server categories, so the experience is seamless. Pluto TV Although it may not be as well-known as the above services, Pluto TV is still worthy of your attention. Not only does it host free movies on demand, but it's also a free live TV streaming service that hosts curated content from around the web. While the channels are wildly different, we focus here on movies. Pluto TV currently offers more live movie channels, perfect if you want to watch something but don't know what. There are two universal movie channels, the rest being focused on specific genres or categories, including Action Movies, Flicks of Fury, Horror 24/7, Classic Movies, Black Cinema, Gravitas Movies and The Asylum. The service works in the US as well as in many international locations. Pluto's library of on-demand movies is relatively small and often rotates, but offers as much diversity as its live film channels. It is also available on tons of devices in addition to computers, including Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Roku devices, and more. To learn more about Pluto TV, check out our full guide to the service. Tubi TV Another up-and-comer, Tubi is very similar to Sony Crackle, in that it offers both free movies and TV episodes. No matter which device you're using, chances are you'll be able to watch Tubi as it's available on Android, iOS, Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Samsung Smart TV, Sony Smart TV, PlayStation 4, Xbox One and the web. As with the vast majority of services on this list, you'll need to watch a few ads, but that's what keeps the service free. Tubi has content from more than 200 partners, including NBCUniversal, which brings with it nearly 400 classic titles such as Kena: Warrior Princess, Hercules: The Legendary Journeys, A-Team, Punky Brewster and original versions of Magnum, P.I., The Bionic Woman and Transformers. Cult classics such as Assault on Precinct 13, Sleepaway Camp and C.H.U.D., along with soon-to-be cult classics such as 10 Cloverfield Lane and No Country for Old Men, can also be found in the growing catalog. If you're using this service to complement Netflix rather than replace it, the No section on Netflix will help you find new and interesting movies to watch. Independent and documentary film's SnagFilms Snagfilms is a video-on-demand site that sports a selection of movies that you can't find anywhere else on the web. Founded in 2008, it's amassed about 10,000 independent documentaries and narrative films. There are plenty of rare gems to watch here, and since the founders have worked to create dozens of partnerships, there are also streaming devices that support free SnagFilms. The service is currently available as a free app for iOS and Android, but is also compatible with various Roku devices, Kindles and a number of other streaming devices. The main website is also a breeze for navigation. Snagfilms is available internationally, but some titles are only available in the US and Canada. Kanopy like Hoopla, Kanopy is not only free to use, but it's also commercial-free if you have a library card. Originally founded in 2008 in Australia as an educational tool, Kanopy now offers a library of more than 30,000 films through partnerships with more than 200 libraries. There is a heavy focus on free independent movies and documentaries (the company even has access to many recent films from the A24 catalog), but you will find all kinds of movies available, and even more are on the way thanks to an agreement that will see the entire catalog of filmmaker Fred Wiseman coming into service. Canopy is available internationally, but content may vary by location. Top Documentaries Love Documentaries? So are we. You know what they say, truth is stranger than fiction. Apty titled Top Documentaries is, hands down, the best place for documentaries. Not every selection is film-length, but a good documentary may not be long – some of the best are below the 60-minute mark. Boasting a library of over 3000 movies, the site also has a simple and straightforward layout and categorizes all your movies based on the subject, making it easy to find something you're interested in right away. The content is not hosted by the site, but rather curated and embedded from other sites such as YouTube, Vimeo, Daily Motion etc. It is available internationally, but not all content will work in all locations. Resources for classic movies Archive.org chances are, you are reading this article because you are looking for a place where you can watch newly released movies online. While there is nothing wrong with this, you certainly shouldn't ignore all the fantastic older movies the internet has to offer. Archive.org offers a true treasure trove of old movies you've probably never heard of, as well as a handful you'll recognize. The archive - which is also home to the famous Wayback Machine, which will show you how the internet used to be - has silent movies, black and white horror movies, obscure sci-fi movies and an assortment of other films. They

may not have all the CGI fantasies we're all used to, but the occasional return is a great way to mix things up. Open Culture Open Culture is designed to be your one-stop shop for all things free and cultured. The site offers hundreds of free online classes to enroll, thousands of free ebooks to read, and hours after hours of lectures from prominent figures such as Carl Sagan and Bernstein. It also offers a ton of free movies. Here you'll find everything from silent movies and Hitchcock-helmed projects to westerns and film noir. The site even houses some early shorts by legends such as Quentin Tarantino and Stanley Kubrick. Open culture can be difficult to navigate, but with over 1000 free movies available, it's definitely worth the hard work. Big Five Glories If the title seems a little banal, it's because the people behind the project spent their time compiling hundreds of free movies from the 1920s to the '50s – a.s. golden age from Hollywood – instead of coming up with hip and edgy names. (If you're curious, this is a reference to the former big five movie houses: 20th Century Fox, RKO Pictures, Paramount Pictures, Warner Bros., and Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer.) If your idea of a fun weekend is kicking back and watching Turner Classic Movies, you'll be kicking big five glories. All movies are considered public domain, so there is no availability restriction. Retrovision Retrovision is another public domain site that contains hundreds of classic movies from several different epochs. Word classics might be for interpretation – there are some movies here that have been made as recently as last year, and not all Retrovision movies are high-quality – but there's still a lot of good stuff here. Retrovision is also a well designed site that allows users to filter based on genre. It's not limited to feature films as there's a robust collection of classic TV shows to choose from. Shocker Internet Drive-In Shame Internet Drive-In is a bit of a niche, and its website looks like it was made in the '90s, but it's a great resource. This page is updated every week with featured horror classics that are then available for free download as WMV files on the Snack Bar website. The place is a fun little blast from the past, with weekly performances framed in a digital drive-in. Users can also purchase DVD copies of any movie on the website for as much as \$3. If you miss the old days on the internet when it was more like the Wild West and everything was less polished, this could be for you. The downside of so many different services available is that if you have a movie in mind but don't know where to watch it, you have a lot of different catalogs to chew through in the hope of finding it. Fortunately, if you have a smartphone, you probably have access to a tool that can help you. The Apple TV app, which is available on iOS, as well as several other platforms, including Apple TV, Roku, Amazon Fire TV and smart TVs LG and Samsung, allows you to search on more than 50 different streaming services. For Android users, the Google Play Movies & TV app offers similar features, although the number of connected services is smaller. Roku devices now have A free section that offers a curated selection of the best free content on the platform, whether you have a specific channel installed or not. This is in addition to its existing cross-service search, although most of what you find will either be available to buy or rent, or will be on a service that requires a subscription.
