Middle school is approaching fast; here are some questions often asked of our parents and students. SpringView Middle School adheres to an school within a school model in which students share the same core academic teachers. Throughout the year there has been a strong emphasis on events and initiatives that encourage the spirit and pride of the whole school. By doing so, our goal is to make all students feel included and united as part of the larger spring community observing eagle. K-K! All major educational teams (consisting of 2-4 teachers) show a diverse and balanced mix between 70 and 140 students. In this environment, teachers are better able to work together to help students who may need extra help and support. During the seven-day course, students rotate between their different teachers' classrooms. Each student is assigned a home teacher. Students report to this designated classroom for the first seven minutes each day; During this time, notifications will be made and any materials sent home will be distributed. Looking home, students go to the first course, which, depending on the rotation of their dedicated team, can be physical education, choice, or major academic classes (language arts, math, science, and social studies). During the week, time blocks may be planned by mainstream teachers rather than better training. Each student has a 5-course plus course. This course is the opposite of the student's

lunch course (whether before or after lunch). In addition, the course is an opportunity for students to participate in courses that support academic subject areas, exploration, and enrichment throughout the year. Course durations may be a quarter, semester, or one year. All students will be provided with a plus course description and asked to complete a survey to help the government put in the most useful. The remaining two courses of the seven-course day are devoted to physical education and selectors. Each student has a physical education course and a selective course. The selections currently available in Springview for both grades include the band, orchestra, arts, family and consumer science (formerly known as home economics, computer science, and Spanish, for the most part, the selections are one semester long. Cafeteria offers numerous selections of entrees every day! Are there after-school sports? Yes - there are autumn, winter and spring sports as well as clubs - we strongly encourage all students to get involved! When do we know our class schedules? This spring, sixth-grade students from SpringView Elementary Feeder Schools (Antelope Creek, Parker Whitney, Rock Creek, Rocklin Elementary, Roh Kala and Sierra) will be sent an information email that includes a Google-selected form. The Google form will be sent to middle school for placement. In early August before school starts, your student will be invited to participate in the web (where everyone belongs), an orientation designed to transition to spring-view positive middle school. This year, web orientation will be crucial to attending since it will be the first on campus for most students. We will notify you once the date is in place, please keep this date in mind when planning a summer holiday. Eighth-grade students will serve as leaders and educators to new students. Small and large group activities are designed to address the needs and concerns of students in an enjoyable atmosphere. Seventh-grade opt-out program usually occurs Friday after the web. During this time, students will also have the opportunity to buy PE clothes and take their school photos and walk around campus to see where their classrooms are located. \*NOTE: In order to select the scheduled class, data verification must be completed in the Aeries mother portal, and all documents requiring signature must be printed and returned. For all seventh grade students entering and new eighth grade, proof of Tdap immunization is required to pick up the class schedule and start school. Please be aware - if your child had the safety of Tdap before the age of 7, they needed a radiation vaccine booster. What time does middle school start? Spring Middle School Show begins at 8.30pm .m - Sharp! The school day ends at 3:10 .m after Friday night. Every Monday the school was closed at 1:56 p..m. Please help ensure that your student is on time every day. If your child is Taard, they may end up having to serve lunchtime detention, even if it is your fault that they are late. What are the merits? The competency system is the middle school behavior system. Each student begins with 100 merits - this means they stand out in behaviour, attitude and respect for others. Losing merits is relatively hard, but disrespecting a guest teacher, breaking any major school rules, or continual class disruption can lead to a loss of merit. At the beginning of each quarter, all students start with 100 new competencies). Can I check homework and grades online? Completely! In fact if you've developed that habit Year, you need to do this for next year's school. Teachers regularly update Schoology; Here you will find weekly agendas, relevant class materials and grades. Parents are strongly encouraged to review Schoology regularly as to which academic achievement will provide their most current student. Always feel free to reach out directly to a teacher with questions or concerns. For the fastest response, email is the best form of communication. Is there a dress code? Yes and runs. All students will be given a guidebook on the first day of school, which includes specific instructions for proper clothing. Teachers will review this information during the first few days of school. Students are expected to change their inappropriate dressing and may be asked to wear their PE clothes for the remainder of the day. Clothes that violate the dress code can be picked up after school at student services. The following guidelines are intended to define suitable student clothing and personal grooming. The purpose of our dress code is to enhance classroom space, encourage clothes suitable for the workplace, and minimize student distraction, so as not to interfere with the educational process. It is also intended to help protect the health, safety, and well-being of the individual student. (Board Policy 5132) 1. No hats or bandanas. 2. No hood in the classroom. In addition, no outside hood on hot days. 3. Safety dictates that no high heels or platform shoes or shoes are to be worn with mill plates. Wallet chains are not suitable. 4. Clothing and jewelry shall be suggested without writing, images, or any other badge that is raw, vulgar, cussed, or sexual or who advocates racial, ethnic, or religious prejudice or use of drugs or alcohol. 5. Inappropriate letters, prints, message patches, or messages on clothing, backpacks, binders, and other personal items are prohibited. 6. Any apparel, accessories, school materials, or manner of grooming that is prohibited due to its color, makeup, or any other feature determines gang membership. 7. Dangling earrings can be dangerous for wearers. Use common sense. 8. Students are allowed to wear shorts of mid-thigh length. Shorts, running or running shorts, and unscathed shorts/pants (and torn apparel) are not acceptable. Pants should be worn at or above the thigh point and be able to stay up without a belt, without SAGGING. 9. No bare midriffs are allowed and not low-cut or revealing tops. The blouse or sunglasses are not supposed to be worn off-the-shoulder. Clothes and skirts should be fingertip length or longer. Clothing should be enough to hide underwear. No pajamas. 12. All clothing should be within the limits of decency and good taste. Students are expected to go to school in clean, neat clothes. The government reserves the right to decide w which student clothing is appropriate. Students are expected to change their inappropriate clothing. What parents can do: Please take a moment to discuss the dress code with their student. Some students are dressing for work after leaving parents, while others are bringing clothes changes in backpacks.
