The faculty continues to place the highest priority on the health and safety of our students, faculty and staff and will follow the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Texas Higher Education Coordination Committee, the Governor's Office and local governments. Depending on the needs of the course and program, students can choose from options ranging from 100% online to 100% personally with social distancing, as well as combinations online and face-to-face. Students will choose between the available options at the time of registration. Students who have already applied should re-check their schedule starting on 13 October. As a safety precaution, appropriate face masks/covers necessary in all public spaces on our campuses, as well as in classrooms and laboratories. The National Convergence Center (CTC) helps colleges meet the fast-growing demand of businesses and industry looking for IT professionals (mobile networks, edge computing, private/public cloud computing, the Internet of Things, mobile device integration, all over a secure network). In particular, the National CTC is active: engages the Business and Industry Leadership Team (BILT) to identify the necessary skills to inform curriculum updates at national level. Invigorates Faculty to teach new technologies through professional development. It provides virtual lab capability.
