Mason City Economics has a very diverse employment base covering multiple sectors of the economy including manufacturing, healthcare, financial services, technology and education, with one sector or employer dominating the market. The largest employer is MercyOne Northern lowa, and before that as St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, is the largest hospital in the area. The facility serves 14 counties across northern lowa. In June 2019, the hospital opened a new behavioral center worth \$10.6 million. The new center will help MercyOne increase the number of behavioral health services it can offer to those in the community it serves who are struggling with mental illness and substance abuse issues. MercyOne open a \$10.6 million behavioral center and other major employers include door maker Curry/Graham Company, Woodhardbor Cabinets Manufacturers, Chief Financials, Cargill Kitchen Solutions and a Kraft Minus factory that produces all of the nation's supply of ready-to-eat refrigerated pudding snacks. Mason City is also a major manufacturing center for Portland Cement. In November 2007, Reyes Holding / Martin-Brower opened a distribution facility serving McDonald's in five states. In March 2016, North Carolina-based Prestage Farms proposed building a \$240 million pork processing plant or slaughterhouse in Mason City,[15] employing about 1,800 people. In May, Mason City Council voted on a standoff and rejected the proposed project. [16] Opponents of the plant raised environmental issues and expressed concern about possible harm to property values. Stockman House Architecture House on the Prairie Mason City is known for its collection of willow school architecture, the largest concentration of any city in Iowa. At least 32 homes and one commercial building were built in the Arava style between 1908 and 1922, 17 of which are listed on the National Register of Historic Places and eight more contribute properties to a historic district. [19] [20] The first two arava buildings, Beit der J. .C (1908) and the Park Inn hotel and bank, a mixed-use development on the corner of State and Federal Avenues was the first ordered by local lawyers James A. Merkley and James A. Blyth. Within a year, Wright was hired to design the Stockman House by Merkley's neighbor. The endangered historic Lan Juice Building, both the Park Inn and Stockman House was moved four blocks to prevent its demolition; It was then restored and opened to the public by the River City Society for Historic Preservation. [22] Also, Wright on the Park, Inc. began restoration at the Park Inn hotel in 2005 and in the city's former National Bank building in 2007. In August 2011, the organization reopened both buildings as a boutique hotel. [23] The Park Inn is the last remaining of the few hotels Wright has completed during his career and is considered a prototype of Wright's Imperial Hotel. IATR is one of the last surviving electric intercity railroads in the U.S., and the only one that still uses electric catalysts to transport cargo in regular service. The plane crashed a few miles west of the airport in a historic event he later called the day the music died. Holly, Vallance, Richardson and pilot Roger Peterson all died in the accident.
