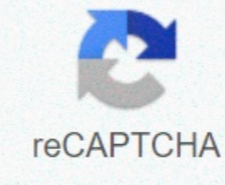

For the past 10 years, the Gay & Lesbian section of Netflix is an all-too-familiar place. A very significant percentage of those seekers found the affirmation they were looking for after donna Deitch's streaming lesbians from 1985 lesbians *Desert Hearts*. Three decades after it was made, This special lesbian novel - about Vivian, a 35-year-old English professor from New York, to be born in 1959. The film, based on Jane Rule's novel *The Desert of the Heart*, has had a spiritual second life, boosted by streaming opportunities such as Netflix and Amazon Prime. Young women make incisions from fans on YouTube, reblog GIF sets on Tumblr, and reach out to the director, Deitch, with their stories. This week, *Desert Hearts* has returned to a special screening in 35mm at BFI Flare: London's LGBT Film Festival. When the flare (formerly known as the London Lesbian and Gay Film Festival) began in 1986, *Desert Hearts* was on the starting list, at a time when lesbian stories were barely working, let alone being watched by mainstream audiences. People will come to me after the festivals, Deitch told BuzzFeed News over coffee at the BFI Southbank theatre. They say, Can I tell you what happened to me when I saw *The Desert Hearts*? I came out after that. At this week's review, she announced that she would start asking people to record their revelations. So many people have told me these stories over the years - I've decided it's time to start collecting them. These days, the upcoming epiphany can be attributed to a wide variety of pieces of pop culture. Sometimes movies happen when the world ends, so you have to sit there and mentally create your own list for the end of the world along with the characters. Sometimes it's already extinction, and you wonder if you could break it with other survivors. And sometimes, the movie takes place somehow in between, so you can panic when you watch how society is being ed out in real time. Global films are also a mirror that reflects the greatest paranoia of society back at us. For the '50s movies, it was relentless about the dawn of the atomic age. In the 1980s, catastrophe was almost always the result of an almost always pre-nuclear war between the US and Russia. And there are always everable doubts about what exists in the universe and whether the pristine forces of nature can end us at any moment – be it through the comets that have set themselves up for collision with Earth, the sun, which is ready to expand its boundaries in our solar system (or stop working fully), or, you know, aliens. These previous disaster films go back decades, so you can take on the different neuroses we've had over time. *Wandering Earth* (2019) These last hours (2015) In this coma, it manages to collide with Earth because it threatens to do so many times before (see also: *Armageddon* and *Deep Impact*). The film takes place 10 minutes after the collision, when Australia has about 12 hours before a firestorm arrives in the country. He follows James, who wants to spend his remaining time at the party to finish all the fun, but is found to be dragged in other directions. *WATCH NOW This is the End* (2013) Is it possible to do a comedy about the apocalypse? Seth Rogen tries in a film where people like James Franco, Jonah Hill and Jay Baruchel play exaggerated versions of themselves amid an exhilarating catastrophe. *WATCH NOW Seeking a Friend for the End of the World* (2012) An asteroid heads for Earth, and Dodge (Steve Carrell) and Penny (Keira Knightly) decide to try to combine Dodge with lost love before it hits. Along the way, they meet others who deal with the previous suing in their own unique ways. *WATCH NOW Melancholia* (2011) Kirsten Dunst plays a bride whose wedding reception is interrupted by the discovery of a planet called Melancholia – the one that is on the path of colliding with Earth. What follows is a film that apparently speaks of the end of the world, but is also a swallow about chronic depression. *WATCH NOW Take Shelter* (2011) What if the end of the world is on the way, and you were the only one who knew? In such a shelter Curtis LaForche (Michael Shannon) holds a preview of what's coming, and gets into trouble when he becomes obsessed with building a storm to prepare. *SEE NOW* (2011) A married couple looking for a reconnected relationship decide to go on holiday to a remote island off the coast of Scotland. Their holiday is interrupted by a soldier who appears on their doorstep and says that the outside world has been decimated by an outbreak of disease that has been aired and must hide together until it is safe to go back to the outside world. But is he telling the truth? *WATCH NOW Legion* (2010) This one talks about the end of the world in more biblical terms. In it, Paul Bettany plays archangel Michael, who wants to stop the evil forces from ing the apocalypse. *WATCH NOW The Road* (2009) According to Corm McCarthy's book, this film follows a man and his son trying to survive in a post-apocalyptic world. They avoid violent vultures and other evils as they turn down the road, trying to head for the coastline where it could be warmer. *WATCH NOW Daybreakers* (2009) In this film plague turns people into blood-bingo vampires – and is so prevalent that few people need to be fed. Maybe there's a cure out there if someone can stay alive long enough to spread it. *WATCH NOW Knowing* (2009) The professor (played by Nic Cage) acquires a code that was buried in an elementary school time capsule, and believes he broke it - and that's the message about the end of the world. He needs to find out if he's right and whether previous catastrophes can be stopped. *WATCH NOW Sunshine* (2007) This is another where the sun is the main culprit that causes the end of the world. This time, the sun is dying, and a team of scientists is going on a space mission to try and re-start it with a bomb. (What could have gone wrong?) *WATCH NOW Children of Men* (2006) In this film, civilisation is at last ed out as a pandemic that somehow caused a global infertility crisis. But when they discover that a woman is pregnant, she needs to be safely transported to a group of scientists working on the drug without her secret coming out. *WATCH NOW RIGHT AT YOUR DOOR* (2006) A man sits at home after hearing over the radio that it's possible that dirty bombs have exploded in Los Angeles. We advise everyone to seal their doors and windows and quarantine themselves. The man listens - and then the wife returns from work. You want him to risk contamination to let her in? *WATCH NOW The Day After Tomorrow* (2004) In a film embodying the term climate crisis, extreme weather is threeed across the country - from tornadoes to deep freezes. In New York, a group of survivors at the New York Public Library began working toward the rescue. *SEE NOW LAST NIGHT* (1998) It's never explained why the world ends up in this Canadian film, but it's clear that it's only one day left. All the characters need to figure out what they want to do on their last night (celebrating Christmas, perhaps), and who they want to share their last Z. *WATCH NOW 12 Monkeys* (1996) The deadly virus wipes out the world, causing some survivors to go underground. Bruce Willis has a mission to travel back in time to find the source of the epidemic in the hope that it could be reversed. If you like this movie, you could also try *La Jetée*, the French film that was based. *WATCH NOW The Rapture* (1991) David Duchovny and Mimi Rogers star in a film about a woman who abandons her own way of life and turns toward religion as she begins to see signs that Rapture is on the way. Could you be right? *WATCH NOW Miracle Mile* (1988) Anthony Edwards and Mare Winningham star as Harry and Julie, who suffer a delayed connection at the worst possible time - right before the collapse of the nuclear war between the US and the Soviet Union. The film follows Harry as he tries to find Julie before the end of the world. *WATCH NOW The Quiet Earth* (1985) For Fans of *The Remains*, this is a film about a scientist (Bruno Lawrence) waking up and realms that people on Earth have all gone - and thinks it may have been the energy project he was working on. Then he goes looking for other survivors. *WATCH NOW Mad Max* (1979) The *Mad Max* franchise takes place amid a social collapse where global flaws have caused everyone to turn into violent gangs. In the first film in the series, Max presents some whiff of law and order as a police officer off to catch a deadly biker gang. *WATCH NOW The Last Wave* (1977) Richard Chamberlain stars as an Australian lawyer taking the case, defending a local Aboriginal tribe who killed one of their own. As he becomes more entangled with the nobility, he learns more about their prophecies and becomes extensive with apocalyptic visions of water. See now *Dr. Strangelove* This Stanley Kubrick-directed masterpiece takes place on the brink of nuclear war, and government agencies (and egos) sent to stop it. In the meantime, he was nominated for an Oscar for Best Picture, Best Director, Best Adapted Screenplay and Best Actor for Peter Sellers, although he finally left empty-handed. *WATCH NOW On the Beach* (1959) Gregory Peck, Ava Gardner and Fred Astaire star in this film that takes place after a nuclear war has wiped out all but a few. Once it's clear that the radiation clouds will be finished with the rest, the survivors will have to adapt to the som news in their own way. *WATCH NOW War of the Worlds* (1953) This is a free film adaptation of H.G. Wells's story, which is about Martians attacking Earth.
