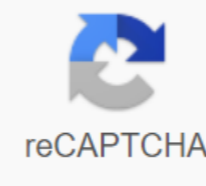

## Hoover middle school bell schedule

The safety of Hoover students is of paramount importance to all of us. Therefore, parents are asked to follow traffic patterns (shown by arrows in the parking lot) when leaving and picking up their children both morning and afternoon. Please DO NOT park along the yellow sidewalk in front of the school in Tivoli. The FIRE LANE (red area) in front of the school is an AREA WITHOUT PARKING or STOPPING. There is no parking on the bus lane at any time. Students should not be on our campus by 8:00 a.m. This request is made for safety reasons as there is no supervision on the school grounds up to this point. Students are allowed in the cafeteria or northwest courtyard after 8:00 a.m. and cannot enter the hallways/classrooms until the first bell at 8:15 a.m. School is fired at 3:05 p.m. Students must leave campus as soon as the school is fired unless they are participating in an activity. Students can leave the school through the basketball courts or the pacifier on the southeast side of campus. According to APS policy, delays are only excused for medical appointments. All other delays are not justified. When a student is late for school, they must be logged in by a parent. The late policy will be reviewed with students earlier this year. Regular delays will be handled through the APS Support Procedure. Parents, Guardians and Emergency Contacts: The security protocol for student collection during regular school hours requires the person who logs off the student to be at the signature/contact card and a current photo ID is presented for verification to office staff before allowing the student to leave campus. Students will not be called to the office until this verification process is complete. Thank you for helping us maintain the safety and well-being of our students!
