Showing 13 frontline candidate tracking items - Lexington School District 4 at Lexington County County School District One, we hope to make your child's school bus experience safe, pleasant and efficient. Every school has a list of school buses that serve this school. Get the list from your child's school page here. Before the first day, make sure your child knows their home address (street name and home number, not bus lane number), phone number and school bus number. Please help your child understand and comply with all school bus rules. These rules are listed in your child's student guide available on our website. Here are some of the most important information to keep in mind. On the first day of school, your child has to wait outside your house for a bus. The bus driver will tell your child where to wait for the bus afterwards. Your kid needs to start taking the bus right away. We need to know exactly how many students will be traveling on each bus as soon as possible. For example, new students may have moved to your area during the summer. As a result, we may need to adjust bus pick-up times, drop-off times or even the route itself to make your child's journey shorter and more convenient. We also use this information to justify additional routes or buses. Your child's bus line will be on in two weeks. Once this happens, there should be more than 10 minutes fluctuations in times from day to day. After the first 20 days of school, state laws prohibit the district from running overloaded school buses. However, if we have to make a different kind of adjustment, we will do so after the first two weeks of school and let you know accordingly. If your child needs to be dropped off elsewhere than your home (a neighbor's house or also in a day hotel for example), you must apply for an exception. You can do this by filling out the special application form for available transportation at your student's home school. This form must be submitted, signed and approved by a school principal at your child's school before the Department of Transportation can make any changes to the route. This process may take between three and five days. We only transfer students for childcare purposes if we have the free space and only within your child's attendance area. We'll let you know by the third week of the school year, if we can grant your request. Once school starts, if your child wants to go home one afternoon with another child being run on another school bus, you should check with the appropriate official (usually assistant principal) at your child's school. Please do not send your child to school with permission to give him/her permission to travel on another bus without first checking with the same school clerk. The 5-year-old kindergartners take the regular primary school buses that serve your street. They These buses are at the regular bus stations. However, a parent/guardian or adult qualified by a parent/guardian must accompany kindergarten student 12 to the bus stop and put this garden on the school bus each morning and meet the school bus at the bus stop when it returns. Be sure to apply for lunchtime transfer at your child's school by filling out the new student's transport request form and information (kindergarten only). 4-year-old kindergartners If your student is in the 4-year-old kindergarten program in the morning, your student will ride the regular school buses on the elementary route that serve your street and take those buses at the regular bus stops. In the afternoon, the district provides a back-and-forth door-to-door service for 4-year-old kindergarten students participating in the morning program and a collection of 4-year-old kindergarten students participating in the afternoon program as long as the bus can get down the street, turn around and get out safely. A parent/guardian or adult certified by a parent/guardian must put the student on the school bus daily and meet the school bus when they return. The 4-year-old kindergarten track driver will contact each student's parent/guardian before school starts to arrange pick-up and drop-off times during the afternoon. Be sure to apply for a midday transfer at your student's school by filling out the new student's transport request form and information (kindergarten only). How to contact us is not unusual for pick-up and drop-off times to vary by five to 10 minutes. Because of this, please wait until your child's bus is more than 10 minutes late before calling the appropriate transport inspector. If you need answers to any other question, it would be helpful if you call after the morning bus lines finish at 8:30 a.m. .m.
