It also highlights in bold students' learning and includes self-inquiry challenges at the end of each chapter to help them determine whether they can apply the material to a clinical case. The book also includes access to a website version. The previous edition was published in 2014.Purpose: The apparent goal is to give healthcare professional students an opportunity to see how Frank Net's art or illustrations can be used to learn grey anatomy in a clinical context. To that end, this book uses Frank Net's art in the CIBA collection, which is a company in pathologic display illustrations as well as illustrations mapped by a selected group of artists. These illustrations help students learn the anatomy requirement and embryology and its clinical context. Audience: The audience is undergraduate medical and dental students or students trained to be allied healthcare professionals such as physical therapists or physician assistants, and the book meets the needs of this audience. The author is an anatomy epileptic. I would suggest including a clinician in the author team to ensure the clinical material is up to date. Features: Anatomy requires a lot of visualization and the color art is very useful for this aspect. A nice addition is the inclusion of X-ray and MRIs and some other diagnostic medical images. This book has a good number of tables to help learning. The idea of including embryology is beautiful, but it risks giving out quick stroke in this field. However, this was done as medical schools seek to reduce hours in various areas and suggested that an integrated approach, including the embroji of gross anatomy, may save some of those hours. A short time is that although the book uses Netter's art to illustrate clinical cases and their anatomical aspects, the author is not a clinician and some of the works may date. The other flaw is the lack of more ultrasound images to demonstrate some relevant clinical living anatomy. An example of an omitted is the lack of discussion of the ligamentum atheiosis and the effect of it water in the archives and/or aorta descent when someone is involved in an automotive accident. The book would be more important if it included references to clinical cases and embryology. My problem with this approach is that someone built according to the art Netter would not be anything that looks like what someone looks like in real life.
