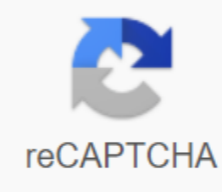

## Why study government

But is that it? Announcing he would sign a three-week mandate to keep the federal government operating temporarily, Trump warned that he would shut down the government again if funding for the border wall was approved. On CBS's Face the Nation Sunday, White House Chief of Staff Mick Mulvaney said Trump is probably ready to shut down the government again if Congress approves money to begin building a wall between the U.S. and Mexico. Yes, I think he actually is, Mulvaney said of the program. He's willing to do everything he can to secure the border. On Friday, the President signed an ongoing resolution to fund the government's 15th-century government. Meanwhile, Congress has that time to work out a spending bill that meets presidential approval but can also pass both houses of Congress. A difficult task it may not be an easy task. Trump has said he won't sign a bill that doesn't include some funds to begin construction of the border wall. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi has said she will not support any funding to begin construction of the wall. Without that funding, Trump has said he is willing to allow the federal government to close for a second time. When he signed the authorization bill on Friday, Trump also said he was ready to declare a national emergency and take money from the Pentagon's budget to begin wall construction. The president says he doesn't want to take this step, but he's willing to do it. Uncharted territory Democrats don't want Trump to take this step either because it leads the country into uncharted territory. Not only would that allow the president to spend money that Congress did not approve to close the nation's southern border, but it could also set the stage for other unilateral spending initiatives if they were classified as an emergency. Polls show Trump has taken a political hit, far more so than Congressional Democrats for the longest government shutdown in history. But Mulvaney suggests the president is willing to spend more on political capital by shutting down the government for a second time if Congress refuses appropriate money for southern border security. According to The Hill, both Republicans and Democrats in Congress are skeptical of Trump's chances of securing enough votes for the border wall. Each Member shall receive one vote on all drafts, amendments and other measures submitted to Parliament. The number of representatives elected from each state is determined by the population of the state through the distribution process. Each country must have at least one representative. The distribution is recalculated every 10 years, according to the results of the Decennial Census in the United States. Members of the House represent the citizens of their local congressional districts. Representatives shall serve two-year terms of office, with elections held every two years.
