The service is offered in 21 countries, but has closed its Canadian, Latin American and Australian offerings. IMDb TV Newer to this roundup is owned by Amazon IMDb TV (formerly known as Freedive). It offers free TV shows and movies In February 2020, the service acquired the rights to more than 20 Disney-owned series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Malcolm in the Middle and So-called life. It is also the only site that allows you to stream Lost and Malcolm inside for free. Other TV shows in the relatively small library include Psych, White Collar, 3rd Rock From the Sun and Schitt's Creek. Vudu Walmart-owned Vudu may be better known for its subscription streaming service, but the platform also has an impressive and free ad content section.
