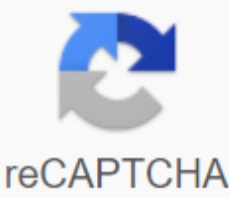

In February 2020, the service acquired rights to more than 20 Disney-owned series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Middle Malcolm and My So-Called Life. It is also the only site where you can stream Malcolm for free with lost in the middle. Other TV shows in a relatively small library include fringes, heroes, quantum leaps and forensic files. Movies include Memento, La La Land, Drive, Monsters, Donny Daco, Dunes, Illusionists, Zodiac, Clues and more. You can watch IMDB TV on the web, Amazon Fire devices, Apple TV, through the Amazon Prime app that you can find on many smart TVs, tablets, and mobile phones. IMDb TV is currently only in the United States, but european expansions are in the works. Vudu Wal-Mart-owned Vudu may be better known as a subscription streaming service, but the platform has an impressive, free ad-supported content section. Titles like escorts, 10,000 days, and offers are good examples of what you can find. If you're cruising with the site's 4K/HDR title selection, there's also one or two free viewing options. You still need a Vudu account, but you can create one for free. The Vudu app is already supported by plenty of platforms, such as Loku, Apple TV, game consoles, and more. Vudu is only available in the United States. This is the deal when using Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that partners with local libraries to allow members to access content that can be borrowed online. It's similar to overdrive, but it's more than an e-book and an audiobook. The site is a fun little explosion of the past, with weekly screenings framed on digital drive-ins. Users can also purchase dvd copies of any movie on the website for just \$3.
