The highest deer density is found in the northwest and southwest corners of the state, as well as along the Connecticut River. The high-sloped mountains that run from north to south and the northeastern quarter of the state have fewer deer, but further afield are the hunters who like to get into the larger forest. Vermont has a four-deer annual limit, only one of which can be legal money. Archery deer hunting opportunities have been expanded with the extended archery season and crossbow allowed, as well as the potential for more archery permits. Young people and beginner hunts take place before the 16-day regular rifle season. Mousses season is coming in December. The four-day snout-precious season can only be held for deer without antlers (with permits) 16 days before the regular season. Antlerless deer harvesting options for each WMU are determined in late spring or early summer. After public advertising and hearings, the Fish and Wildlife Board determines which Wildlife Management Units (WMU) will be open for antlerless deer hunting during archery season, and the number of unattended licenses available lotteries for use during the same and muzzle sufor seasons. Annual deer limit new this year A person may not take more than four deer in a calendar year, only one of which can be a legal buck (see below). Young people and novice hunters can take two legal money, provided that one is taken during the young or beginner period, it should not exceed the four deer annual limit. Hunting hours The hunting time is half an hour before sunrise – half an hour after sunset . (See sunrise/sunset tables.) Deer labelling must be labelled as a first-time tag when it is lost. The label shall be placed on the carcase in order to view and remain there until the carcase is cut for consumption. Deer notification A person picking up a deer shall report within 48 hours the taking of the carcass and its exhibition to the nearest ranger, the fish &amp; wildlife department reporting station, or the person designated by the Commissioner to receive the reports. New this year a deer needs to be field-clad before reporting. The hunter must take a director to the killing site of a deer, a director wants it. Deer carcasses cannot be transported outside the state without first being reported. Should. Information About Deer Hunters can contribute valuable information to the management of Vermont's deer herd by 1) completing the annual rifle season hunter effort surveys should they receive one in the mail, 2) report the deer to selected biological control stations during the youth and rifle season weekends, and 3) collecting the tooth of the deer during rifle season. This allows biologists to capture key information, such as age, antler characteristics, and the health of the harvested deer. Deer The transport of labelled deer may only be carried during the open period and for 20 days thereafter. Deer can be legally transported only under these conditions: The person who shot the deer. The deer was shot by a person (including the removal of the deer from the place of death to the camp or motor vehicle). A person with a mentored hunting permit, accompanied by a fully licensed adult hunter. When transported by a common carrier (e.g. a shipping company) and marked with the name of the consignor and consignee, the name and destination of the station transported. In such circumstances, the appropriate deer label must be securely attached to the deer. When transporting parts of deer, the parts or packaging must be marked with the name and address of the person who killed the deer. The deer need not be visible during transport. See also the Shipping and Import section of the Big Game and General Shipping section. Bait deer and deer decoys it is illegal to hunt or take all wild animals using bait during each deer hunting season, except that trappers can use bait to take furbearers. Bait is any animal, plant, fruit or mineral deposited with the intention of attracting wild animals. Artificial scents and baits are legal, provided they are not consumed by eating or licking. Deer lures containing deer urine, blood, gland oil, feces, or other bodily liquids, are illegal to use in Vermont. It is forbidden for deer to be taken using bait with the following exceptions: Accidental feeding of wild animals in active livestock operations; Plants planted and standing and standing as food parcels for wild animals; Cereals and other feedingsuffs which are only scattered or distributed as a result of normal agricultural, horticultural or soil stabilisation and logging practices; and vegetation or food/seeds are naturally deposited. Feeding Deer It is illegal to feed wild deer at any time except: License or permit issued by Fish &amp; Wildlife for scientific research, to mitigate the effects of damage or unpleasant problems, or wildlife population reduction programs; With agricultural practice, it is directly planting, growing or harvesting crops, including food parcels planted from wild animals. Swimming Deer Is forbidden to use a deer that is swimming in any lake, river or other body of water. Definitions of conditions for deer years Buck NEW THIS YEAR The Wildlife Management Units C, D1, D2 E1, E2, G, I, L, M, P, and Q legal buck should each deer have at least one antler three inches or longer. The Wildlife Management Units A, B, F1, F2, H, J1, J2, K, N, and O are the legal buck should each deer have at least one antler of two or more antlers to point to an inch in length or longer. Point An antler projection of at least an inch measured from the base of the driving beam to its tip. A broken driving beam is considered a point regardless of its length. Antlerless Deer They are deer without antlers or antlers less than three (3) inches long. Archery Deer Season - October 1 - December 15 NEW THIS YEAR Archery season has been extended, however, the season is closed in the regular season. Licences Any person who wishes to hunt with a bow and arrow or crossbow during the archery spawn season must have an archery licence/tag. In addition to the archery permit, hunting or combined hunting and fishing permits are required, except for a non-resident deer-only licence. Limit A legal buck (see Legal Buck on p. 26) can be taken during archery season anywhere in the state not exceeding the annual limit. Check Vermont's Fish &amp; Wildlife website [www.vtfishandwildlife.com](http://www.vtfishandwildlife.com) August to see which WMMs have opened for antlerless deer hunting archery season. Deer must be taken with a bow, arrow or crossbow. The arrowhead must be at least 7/8 inches wide with two or more cutting edges. It is forbidden to carry rifles, rifles or muffler loading while archery hunts deer during archery deer season. The hunter may possess a pistol or revolver while archery deer hunting. The pistol or revolver should not be used to play or give up the deer. Crossbow new this year the crossbow can be used by anyone to make a game that can be taken bow and arrow. Unless it is uncocked, it is prohibited to possess or transport a crossbow, or a motor vehicle, speedboat, airplane, snowmobile, or other motorized craft, or any vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle. Restoring Archery Deer hours after contacting a licensed leashed dog tracker to proceed and recover the deer wounded by an arrow after the close legal shooting time. In the alternative, the hunter should be provided with the opportunity to state ranger by calling the nearest state police, which will give you the exact location and conditions. All recovered deer must be marked, reported and made out to the nearest ranger. Youth Deer Weekend - October 24- 25, 2020 NEW THIS YEAR Vermont youth deer weekend on Saturday and Sunday three weeks before opening the regular November rifle deer season. A resident or non-resident young person, 15 years of age or younger on the weekend of hunting, who successfully completed the Safety course must obtain a free youth deer hunting tag to hunt this season. Season. young people must also purchase a Vermont youth hunting permit with a license agent or prove that the hunting safety course has been satisfactorily completed or that they have previously had a valid hunting permit. The parent or guardian of the youth hunter must sign the application for a hunting permit in the presence of the licence agent. When hunting, the youth hunter must be accompanied by an unarmed adult over the age of 18 with a Vermont hunting license. The adult can accompany up to two young hunters at a time. The adult should have direct control and supervision, including the possibility of seeing and communicating without young hunter craftsmanship devices such as radios or binoculars, except medically necessary devices such as hearing aids or glasses. Landowner's license is required by law in order to hunt on private land with a youth deer member during youth deer weekends. All applicable gaming laws and regulations, including a ban on baiting and road hunting, apply to the Youth Deer Weekend. Landowners are not exempt from the obligation to purchase labels for hunting on their own property on youth weekends. A Vermont youth deer hunting member applies to a deer youth deer hunt weekend under the rules of the Fish &amp; Wildlife Board annually announced. The fine doubles for violating Youth Deer Weekend, and the fine must be assessed against the licensed adult, who tailors the youth hunter at his expense. Starting weekend - October 24 - 25, 2020 NEW THIS YEAR (in tandem with Youth Deer Weekend) Beginner: The person who purchased the first hunting permit in the last 12 months and is 16 years or older. To participate in the starting period, the trained person must have a valid Vermont hunting permit and follow the requirements of the youth deer season. The novice hunter must be accompanied by an unarmed adult who holds a valid Vermont hunting license and who is 18 years of age or older. The adult accompanying the beginner may accompany up to two novice hunters at a time. Accompanying, accompanying or accompanying: direct control and supervision, including the possibility of seeing and communicating without artificial means of novice hunter, such as radios or binoculars, except medically necessary devices such as hearing aids or glasses. A novice hunter may not hunt on privately owned land under this section without the owner or tenant requesting permission. Limit A legal buck (see legal Buck on p. 26) can be taken this season or any deer if the board has authorized the buyer of the antlerless deer during youth hunting weekends. Muzzle antlerless Season new this year If antler-free licenses are available, the muzzle-less deer season will occur in four consecutive beginning of Thursday 16 days before the opening of the regular November rifle season (October 29 - November 1, 2020) - check our website in June for an announcement. A cheeky license and an antlerless license are required this season. If this 4-day season is held, the antler-free license can be used this season or in the regular cheekloader deer season. November Rifle Deer Season - November 14 - 29, 2020 Limit NEW THIS YEAR A legal buck (see Legal Buck of p. 26) can be taken anywhere in the state. A person may not take more than four white-tailed deer in a year during each deer hunting period, only one of which may be legal money. Muzzleloader

Deer Season - December 5 - 13, 2020 Licenses Muzzleloader license and hunting license required. Limit A legal buck (see Legal Buck on p. 26) can be taken anywhere in the state. Moreover, an antler-free license issued by the department, a person can take an antlerless deer licensed within WMU. Definition of Muzzleloading Firearm A single-shot, single-barrel rifle or smoothbore firearm with a minimum barrel length of 20 inches, designed to be fired from the shoulder or a single-shot pistol with a minimum barrel length of 10 inches. Both rifles and pistols must not be loaded from the gap without the use of tools and must have a hole diameter of at least 0.43 inches, as well as a traditional or modern firestone, caplock, matchlock, in-line or wheellock-style ignition system. Determination of ammo muzzleloaders Black powder or other suitable non-smokeless propellant, and a bullet or bullet. Determination of loaded mable The moussed firearm shall be deemed to have been loaded if it is filled with dust and projectiles and is filled or sealed. Special provisions A person purchasing a muzzle deer licence shall not carry a single firearm other than a single-barreled single-barreled muzzle during deer hunting during the muzzle deer season.
