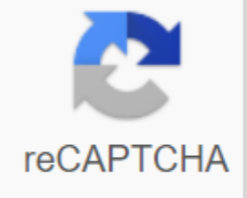




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Orono school boundary map

The Orono School District (ISD) #278 Minnesota County, located in the western metro area of Minneapolis, Minnesota, USA. The school district, organized in 1949, serves part or all of the following districts: Independence, Long Lake, Maple Plain, Medina, Minnetonka Beach and Orono. [1] (District Map.) District Superintendent - Dr. Karen Orkutt. Located in Long Lake, Minnesota, the district serves preschool classes until twelfth grade, in five different school buildings. The school district had a student population of 2,850 and 206 teachers during the 2005-2006 school year. [2] The schools are located on a 120-acre (0.49 km2) campus along Old Crystal Bay Road. [1] Orino's spartans are the mascot of the district, and the school's colors are dark red. The average number of study days in the district is 167 days. [3] The district calendar includes no school days for the Minnesota Education Association (MEA), Thanksgiving Break, Winter Break, Martin Luther King Jr., Summer Break, President's Day, Spring Break, Good Friday, Memorial Day and other professional days. The district consists of six main school buildings: Orino High School, Orino High School, Orono Activity Center, Orono High School and Schumann Elementary School. Other district facilities include a children's facility, swimming pool, Orono ice arena, stadium, tennis courts, many outdoor fields, and an entertainment center that includes indoor basketball and tennis courts, as well as weight and cardiovascular equipment. The Orono Discovery Center is located on the Maple Plains, but is still considered a community center provided by the district. In 2008, a \$39.4 million referendum was adopted from 1845 to 1713, which would help improve Schumann Elementary School, Orono High School and Orono High School. The referendum would raise house taxes at an estimated cost of \$300,000, by \$125 annually. This money will be suitable for both electrical and mechanical improvements, as well as improved interior and exterior to these schools. The air conditioning will be implemented in high school. [5] Along with the adoption of this referendum in 2008, seven Orono residents sued Orino schools, saying the referendum should have been conducted by mail, not by polling at the county's home office. [6] The lawsuit was dismissed by a Hennepin County Circuit Court judge. [7] Orino High School (OHS) was built in 1968.[8] is the only high school in orino school district, and serves a grade 9-12. Its director is Dr. Amy Steiner. Dr. Amy Steiner, who is now an assistant principal at Minnetonka High School, was named principal of Orono High School. She will succeed David Benson, who is retiring at the end of this school year after 25 years in the county as director of Orono Middle orino high school. Her appointment was approved by the school board at its April 9 meeting. Ohs starts at 7:50 a.m. and ends at 2:30 p.m. [10] There were 950 students in high school for 2019-2020. [11] The 91 percent of the student body was of Caucasian origin with the remaining 9 percent of American Indian/Alaskan, Asian, Black, Greek, and Hispanic origin, gaining 0.19 percent on the diversity scale. 5% of the student body are eligible for free or reduced lunch. The graduation rate is 96%, 91% of graduates study after secondary education. [10] The school has 51 teachers and an average class size of 18 with a teacher student ratio of 19:1. The school year begins in September and ends in June and is based on a semester schedule. The necessary curriculum consists of English, social research, science, mathematics, physical education/ health and fine arts. OHS offers about 60 elective courses, including fine arts, business/marketing education and world languages (German, Chinese and Spanish). The school has AP classes on the following subjects: English language and composition, English literature and composition, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Biology, Environmental Science, Psychology, Human Geography, Music Theory, World History, U.S. History, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science and Principles, Chinese, German and Spanish. Advanced and enriched courses are also offered. [14] The school has dual high school and college enrollment programs. [10] The GPA in high school is calculated on a weightless scale of 4.0. [14] The school's academic teams consist of: debate teams, DECA (Distribution Education Clubs of America), History Club, Literary Magazine, Math Team, Mock Trial, National Honor Society, Newspaper, Quiz Bowl team, Science Team, Speech Team, Student Senate and Yearbook Photoshop. The school has three bands: a concert band, a symphony band, a wind ensemble, and a jazz band, a pit orchestra, a march band and a pep band. The school also has four choirs: male choir, treble choir, concert choir, chamber choir. The drama department puts on three theatrical works a year: autumn musical, winter single-ideal play, spring play. Orino is a member of the Wright County Conference and the Minnesota State High School League. The maiden football team won the state title game in 2009, defeating Blake's school, and placed 2nd in 2017, 2018, & 2019 losing all three times to Mahtomey Senior High. The boys' golf team won three consecutive state titles in 2008, 2009 and 2010. In 2011, the Orono Boys basketball team won the Class 3A state championship, defeating Columbia Heights. In November 2016, the 200 Medley Relay relay from the Orono Girls Swim Team won 1st place on the state championship meeting and earned all the American time of consideration. Olono Orono High School (OMS) – school school on the county. It was built in 2000 and houses of 6-8 grades. Dr. Patricia Pinn is the director of OMS, and the associate director is Kimberly Van Eyll. [16] The Music Department consists of a band and choir for each class... The high school has special planning up and down homes for each grade level. Students seeking a higher level of curriculum may choose to take enriched courses in the following classes: Math English World Language School Orono Intermediate School and Schumann Orono Elementary School High School has 581 students in grades three to five. The student ratio is 19.0[20] and the average class size is 25. The director is Mrs. Marie Jodul. [21] The high school building, built in 1950, was a district junior and high school until 1968, when a new high school was built. she continued to serve as a high school for the district until 2000, when the new Orono High School was built and opened. [citation required] School hours from 9:10 to 15:40. [21] Schumann Elementary School, which houses classroom kindergartens through grade 2, and a multi-year class, is connected to high school. It is the only elementary school in the Orono School District and is the second oldest school building in the district, built in 1956. [8] Mr. Adam Lamparski is the director, and the team consists of 55 teachers. The average class size is 21. School hours from 7:10 a.m. to 7:15 a.m. The multi-sex class includes grades one and two and allows children in both classes to participate in classes together, as opposed to the same teacher option. [22] Orono Community College Starting in 2021, Orono Community College will offer courses for a wide variety of students and community members to enrich their higher education. Community college courses can be further completed by students enrolled in Orono High School over certain periods of the day, and allow students to earn college loans during their school tuition period. Students are given pre-owned Chromebooks or Eee PC, for which they are responsible during the school year. Chromebooks Orono PLUS software runs ChromeOS, with additional secure web filtering installed on them. School-owned Eee computers are equipped with Windows. The school uses a combination of cloud G-Suite for education and on-premises Microsoft Office programs for their educational use. They also use a service called Schoology, which for the 3rd time Orono has changed online learning in 3 years. EOL Service Due to the slow and old age of Eee PC school netbooks, they are phased out, deemed unable to perform the tasks required for education. By 2020, the school expects to have an all-Chromebook fixture, with the previous generation of Eee PCs being redecast and forgotten. A 2008 lawsuit (2008) Seven orono school district residents filed a lawsuit against the school district after approving a \$39 million bond referendum. Residents argue that this should have been completed through the Postal Service, however the school district completed it through the district office. [6] This vote was to spend this connection on improving the quality of school district buildings. Schools Superintendent Karen Orkutt responded to the resident's concerns: We are confident that we have done everything right. We turn this over to our lawyers. [6] The lawsuit was concluded, as decided by Minnesota Education Commissioner Alice Seagren, who said the referendum was educationally and economically appropriate.
