The network had its head office in New Albany, Indiana, located across the Ohio River from Louisville, Kentucky. In November 2012, Alliance Entertainment (the parent company of Great Escape) sold its film portfolio (except Princess 4 in Oxford, Ohio) to Regal Entertainment Group. [2] The company's history was operated by Alliance Entertainment. The chain's first theater opened in Bedford, Indiana, in May 1997. The company subsequently opened locations in Indiana, Kentucky, Illinois, Ohio, Tennessee, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Nebraska, Missouri, and Georgia. A statement on the company's website noted that they focused on midsize market areas, composed of populations between 100,000 and 400,000 people. Great Escape Theatres was sold to Regal Cinemas for approximately \$91 million in December 2012. The company operated 305 screens in 26 locations. [4] Thirty-eight additional canvases were planned for construction in 2009 and 2010. The network employed a workforce of more than 500 people. The location in Fenton, Missouri, won the Award for Best Theater in the St. Louis, Missouri area in the July 2009 issue of St. Louis Magazine. [citation required] A location was opened in Simpsonville, South Carolina, in early 2010 and Dickson City, Pennsylvania, in late 2010. Great Escape Theatres also offered an incentive program known as the Critics Choice card. The Critics Choice card is a loyalty card program that allows members to earn points for free grants and other items.
