Director - NA4MManager notes Christian morality is not only based on the Ten Commandments (see Exodus 20 and Deut 5), but also traditionally focuses on the so-called seven deadly sins of capital or sins, often pairing and contrasting those with seven main virtues:The sins of capital (or at least the idea of registering seven major sins) are based in part on a passage from the book of proverbs of the Hebrew Bible/Bible: There are six things For they are an abomination to him: the eyes of the love, the tongue of a liar, and hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that makes evil plans, legs will rush to run to evil, until a liar who testifies falsely, and one who sows controversy in the family (Prov 6:16-19). The main virtues discussed in Christian moral theology are often detailed differently, not in direct contrast to the seven deadly sins, but as a combination of the three theological virtues (faith, hope and love; as discussed by the church fathers and the various theologians). These virtues are discussed in the catachism of the Catholic Church, articles 1805-1845, while the sins of capital are detailed in Article 1866. Furthermore, the spetoagint and walgate version of Isaiah 11:1-3 lists seven items traditionally referred to as gifts of the spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, courage, knowledge, piety and fear of God (see CCC, Section 1831). The Hebrew Bible contains very few extended lists of virtues and/or sins, apart from the Ten Commandments and related transfers, presumably since the ethical debate over virtues and sins did not become popular until the Hellenistic period (3rd century BC and later). In contrast, many New Testament reporters contain shortlists or more extended discussions of sins and/or virtues, standard actions, and approaches that should be avoided and/or practiced, respectively. One of the most recognizable short moral lists is what Folk himself calls the fruits of the spirit, which include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, loyalty, tenderness and self-control (Wave 5:22-23; the Walgate translation also includes kindness, modesty and modesty, a total of 12). It is important not to take such texts out of context, but to read and understand them in the historical and historical contexts of the Bibles in which they are located. Therefore, I encourage you to study the following passages in your Bible, read and consider the literary contexts even more broadly than provided here.
