Fayette County Public Schools serves over 42,000 students with just over 8,000 employees so there are so many things to consider as they plan for what schools will look like this fall during the COVID-19 pandemic. They take into account the surveys of completed parents as well as staff and all state and national guidelines. These guidelines are constantly changing and will continue to change as the weeks go by. Update 11/15/20 Per District Email from James McMillin, HEAD of FCPS High School and Tracy Bruno, FCPS High School Head:|We are writing today to announce that our district pauses all additional athletic and co-curricular activities except for the six secondary school football teams entering KHSA We will re-evaluate this decision after Thanksgiving. Our students, families, coaches and sponsors have done an amazing job of following the safety precautions and we are grateful for your support. This is not a response to problems on our team, it is not responsible for ignoring the fact that the COVID-19 case hits the highest record in our communities and the state's growing positive rate. Knowing these results may be frustrating for many of you, we want to reassure you that this is not end of everything. As we said, we will re-expedition the situation in two weeks. This just hits the pause button to allow our community to get COVID-19 under control. The only reason we let football go ahead is because to do otherwise will prevent them from the chance to run for the state championship and will take the last chance of our seniors to play at high school level. Target Service Update 11/12/20 in all schools (except for some special education assistance) will end with a Thanksgiving break. Each school will determine how to handle their last target service session. Update 10/21/20 At the end of tonight's board meeting it was determined that students would remain in the NTI 2DL for the remainder of the semester (winter break). Targeted services will continue and can grow based on public health conditions. The update from the Superintendent is below Following tonight's Fayette County Board of Education meeting, we have unanimous input from our board members to move forward with a safe return to learning in person in January. To summarize: · We will continue to offer Non-Traditional Instructions: Different Distance Learning (NTI: 2DL) for the remainder of the fall semester. · Our schools will continue to provide targeted services for small groups of students and will look at the possibility of expanding the offering. We will also see how best to support our preschool students. · FCPS will be preparing to return to study in person five days a week in January, provided the virus is safe. Families will have the option of sending their children to campus five days a week or opting for remote instructions. Employees also have the opportunity to share their plans ahead of returning to learning in person. Family interest and staff availability will help schools draft the best lesson plans for students in both cohorts. · Families whose children are now enrolled in the Virtual Learning Academy will have the opportunity to remain with the VLA, or choose either learning far or in person for the second semester. · The registration window opens for the second semester of the Virtual Learning Academy will start from 2 Nov to 16 Nov. Those interested in the ability to learn anytime, anywhere at their own pace during the second semester will be able to apply for that option. Update 10/20/20 Update 10/12/20 Fayette County School Board meets to discuss targeted services. The board determines no votes are needed and schools can start targeted services on schools by school or after 10/19/20. This means that every school will determine how they will bring their students to feel in need of service personally back into the building. Watch communication from your school about how they will provide Service. The Board will meet on 10/26/20 to review the hybrid model as an option to bring students back to learning in person. Update 09/28/20 Fayette County School Board meets and asks for a plan for targeted instructions that will begin on October 19, 2020. The plan will be tabled on 12 October 2020. This plan will detail what targeted services will be provided for students. The board also requested that the plan be tabled at a meeting of October 26, 2020 which will detail what hybrid instructions will look like. During the Targeted Services phase, all Safety Expectations and Best Practices for Kentucky Schools (K-12) will be followed, including social distancing, temperature checks, and mask requirements. Schools are restricted to bringing in no more than 15 percent of the student population, 15 or fewer people can be in each classroom, and sessions should be no more than two hours. Targeted services can include activities such as assessment, hands needed in experience (career and technical education), mental health or academic counseling, occupation, physical or speech therapy, or targeted rehabilitation or tutoring. Board members also voted to target the November 2 week for the possibility of launching a hybrid command model, if the situation with a COVID-19 warrant and the board accepts district plans no later than Oct 26. Under a hybrid model: Superintendents mention more surveys for families can be offered. Covid Reported State Regulations As of Sept 28, 2020, Emergency Regulation 902 KAR 2:220E requires families to inform their child's school within 24 hours of learning the child has tested positive for COVID-19. FCPS employees who make positive tests should also inform the district. Fayette County Public Schools has set up a COVID-19 Hotline to process this notification, which must be forwarded to the Kentucky Department for Public Health. The hotline is open Monday to Saturday from .m to 5 .m. Please select one of these three ways to alert FCPS: Families and staff can also send an email to the COVID-19 team for follow-up phone contacts to collect additional information or to deal with any questions. To offer COVID-19 related feedback, please email the superintendent and the school board. FIND COVID TEST LOCATION Update 08/12/2020 Fayette County School Board will meet TONIGHT at 5:30 p.m. to discuss the Virtual Learning Academy. The academy is the preferred parent rather than the ongoing NTI 2DL plan. There are very few firm details about what VLA looks like for this coming year this meeting should offer several answers. You can watch board meetings at this link Update 07/27/2020 Fayette County School Board meet virtually and discuss the dates and procedures of reopening. They share a calendar draft 2020-2021. 2020-2021. school days will be August 26, 2020 and the last day is set on 13 May 2021. Students will have a regular holiday (Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Winter, spring holidays, etc.) as well as falling breaks. The choice of NTI 2DL virtual learning students will begin with re-evaluation on various dates throughout the year. The first date they will check the conversion instructions is the week of September 28 - October 2. Read the new FCPS – 2020 – Review and Renewal of Download Guide (PDF, 2.49MB) Update 07/24/2020 Fayette County School Board meets virtually and discusses various options for the start of school year 2020-2021. The board voted 5-0 to adopt a virtual start to the school year. Through the discussion it was clear that this decision could be changed throughout the year. They address the needs of teachers and parental support for online learning as well as how to meet the needs of students with IPP, 504s, GT services, etc. The currently planned virtual learning programme is planned in contrast to the NTI FCPS program provided from March 13 – the end of the 2020 school year. Certain calendars and dates for virtual and tentative start-ups and learning measures in person will be discussed at a board meeting scheduled for Monday, July 27, 2020 at 6 p.m. To Update 07/20/2020 The Kentucky Education Department (KDE) issued three new COVID-19 reopening guidance documents on July 20 on special education and preschool students, compensation education and student participation for non-traditional directives (NTI). One of the documents, COVID-19 CONSIDERATION to Reopen Schools for Extraordinary Students and Preschool Students provides guidelines and recommendations for the health and safety of special education and preschool students. The document includes guidance on things like social distancing, classroom environment, food distribution and masks. Another document, COVID-19 Consideration for Reopening Schools: Compensation Education and Advanced School Year Services explains the difference between compensation education and extended school year services. It also provides guidance on how to provide such services during the COVID-19 pandemic as well as through NTI. Final document, COVID-19 CONSIDERATION to Reopen Schools: Daily Participation and Non-Traditional Instruction explains the various types of daily student participation, NTI type and use and how the district will record daily participation for the school year 2020-2021. Update 07/17/2020 Superintendent Caulk issued an email to the family and shared that a specially called meeting will be held on July 24, 2020 at 2:30 p.m. Board members will discuss options in this meeting. Virtual meeting links Nothing is more important to me than the lives of our students, employees and families, and security will direct each of our decisions. Regardless of the chosen teaching model, please understand that our plans are subject to change as cases increase or decrease not only in Fayette County, but across Kentucky, the country and the world. The status of COVID-19 changes daily, with each test taken, a diagnosis made, or scientific findings announced, and our response must be nimble enough to change quickly to keep our students, employees and families safe. Updated 07/13/2020 The school board meets and sets the agenda for future meetings. They also have special meetings set for the week of 07/20/2020 to discuss the calendar for the next school year. In a note from school board member Stephanie Spires, she stated Tonight I shared that I would not vote for plans that sent our children and employees back into the classroom until the case diminished and our community had increased access to rapid testing. We all want our kids back in the classroom. As a self-employed mother with children with IPP and 504s, I understand the challenges facing many of our families. I also understand that in order to fully open our economy, our children need to be in school. Our family needs a plan. Our family is anxious and worried about childcare and employment. He mentioned that they had 33,000 surveys collected from the family. Fayette County Public Schools is looking at welcoming students back to school august weeks. 24 with a new model on campus, face-to-face instructions, Fayette County Public Schools Superintendent Manny Caulk announced July 1. This is late than our school district usually begins, but these changes allow us to take advantage of the flexibilities given in state law to have a shorter year of schooling, which can prove crucial if intermittent closures are needed, Caulk said. With every passing day, it seems that the only thing we can be sure is that the circumstances we face with the COVID-19 pandemic will continue to grow when scientists learn more about the virus, public health officials revise their guidance, and cases increase or decrease not only in Fayette County, but across Kentucky, the country, and the world, he said. Personal uncertainty and learning disorders since Last March continued to be a challenge for all of us. I am concerned not only about the teaching time we have lost with our students, but also about their social and emotional well-being and this pandemic toll has been taken on our family. Caulk said the district's reopening plan would: Prioritize health and safety. Clean responsive and individual circumstances faced by students, families, and employees. Maximize opportunities for personal instructions. Reflect the best practices about wearing masks, practicing social distancing, sanitising hands and surfaces, health checks and temperature checks, and contact detection. Provide flexibility to accommodate changes in conditions with the pandemic. Every decision made is in line with the requirements of federal, state, and local health authorities including the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Kentucky Governor's Office, the Kentucky Department for Public Health, and the Lexington-Fayette County Department of Health. Staying up to date with school board meetings education is only available virtually during pandemic restrictions. They are broadcast live to local cable channels as usual and also available on the district's FCPS Video on Demand service.
