American Tragedy was the third episode of the fifteenth season, and the rest of the season continued with challenging episodes that attracted and protected the audience. This episode of 'Abomination' in 2003 was a turning point for the show as Law & Order: SVU began actively using real-life issues from the news as the springboard for many episodes in a season. Abomination was the eighth episode of season five and was centered around a gay inn that had recently undergone conversion therapy at a church-sponsored camp. This episode has a place folded into surprise and returns ultimately kept viewers talking for weeks when it first aired before ending with a show-stop revelation.
