Sign in here. One reason Gatsby has become so famous around New York is that he throws elaborate parties every weekend at his mansion, lavish spectacles to which people will long be invited. One day, Gatsby's chauffeur brings Nick an invitation to one of these parties. At the appointed time, Nick makes a short walk to Gatsby's house and joins the festivities, feeling somewhat out of place amid the searing of jubilant strangers. Guests mill around sharing rumors about their master - no one seems to know the truth about Gatsby's wealth or personal history. Nick runs into Jordan Baker, whose friend, Lucille, suggests that Gatsby is an Oxford graduate and that he once killed a man cold-bloodedly. Gatsby's party is almost incredibly luxurious: guests marvel at his Rolls-Royce, its swimming pool, its beach, crates of fresh oranges and lemons, buffet tents in crowded gardens and a live orchestra playing under the stars. Liquor flows freely, and the crowd grows rowdier and louder as more and more guests get drunk. In this atmosphere of scarecrow and fun, Nick and Jordan, interested in their master, set about finding Gatsby. Instead, they ran over a middle-aged man with huge, owl-eyed spectacles (whom Nick dubs Owl's Eyes), who sits poring over unread books at the Gatsby Library. At midnight, Nick and Jordan go outside to watch the entertainment. They sit at a table with a handsome young man who says Nick looks familiar to him; they realize that they served in the same division during the war. A man presents himself as no other than Jay Gatsby. Gatsby's speech is complex and formal, and he has a habit of calling everyone an old sport. As the party progresses, Nick increasingly admires Gatsby. He notices that Gatsby doesn't drink and that he keeps himself apart from the party, standing alone on the marble steps, watching his guests in silence. At 2 a.m., as husbands and wives argue about whether to leave, a butler tells Jordan that Gatsby would like to see her. Jordan comes out of her meeting with Gatsby, saying she just heard something extraordinary. Nick bids farewell to Gatsby, who walks inside to call from Philadelphia. Nick starts walking home. Along the way, he sees Owl Eyes struggling to get his car out of a ditch. Owl Eyes drunkenly declares that it washes its hands throughout the business. Nick then proceeds to describe his daily life to prove he is doing more with his time than just attending parties. He works in New York, through which he also takes long walks, and he meets women. After a brief relationship with a girl from Jersey City, Nick follows Daisy and Tom's advice and starts seeing Jordan Baker. Nick says Jordan is a fundamentally dishonest man; he even knows she cheated in his first golf tournament. Nick feels attracted to her despite her dishonesty, although he himself claims to be one of those rare smiles with the quality of eternal reassurance in her that you could stumble four or five times in life. See Important Quotes explained analysis At the beginning of this chapter, Gatsby's party brings 1920s wealth and glamour into full focus, featuring the upper class at its most lavish lush. The rich, both socialists from the Eastern Egg, and their rough counterparts from the Western Egg, are without restrictions. As evidenced by his portrayal of the differences between East Egg and West Egg, Fitzgerald became fascinated by America's social hierarchy and mood in the 1920s, when a large group of industrialists, speculators and businessmen with brand new fortunes joined the old, family at the top of the economic ladder. The new rich lack the sophistication, manner and taste of the old rich, but long to break into the polite society of east Eggers. In this case, Gatsby is again a mystery-although he lives in a beautiful West Egg mansion, East Eggers freely attends his parties. Despite tensions between the two groups, the Mix of East and West Egg creates a distinctly American mood. While The Americans at the party have a brute of vitality, the British there dramatically champion the seemingly desperate and predatory, hoping to make connections that will make them rich.
