Religion[edit] Laila Law-Giver is experienced and possibly faithful. She wants to make a good Jarl and govern fair. Still, she seems unaware of the obvious corruption plastering her city. Furthermore, she believes Maven Black-Briar, a put-down business tycoon, to be an ideal citizen, further proving her ignorance about Riften's situation. Edit source as Jarl van Riften, she lives at her court in Mistveil Keep, where she holds court and eats rather enthusiastically. Laila has two children, Harrald, the older and Saerlund, the younger ones. Both differ in their opinions on who they should team up with in the Civil War. Because she supports the Stormcloaks, the Jarl believes that Saerlund has lost his mind or is owned, so she tells her Hofghoeroe, Wylandriah, to find a reason. She believes she has the Diewe Guild problem under control, and her advisers reinforce her faith. Her housecars are Unmid Snow-Shod and her steward is Anuriel. Although Laila supports the Stormcloaks, she agrees that Ulfric might just want to be crowned High King. Religion[edit] Skooma Trade[edit] She gives the Dragonborn pointers from where to search for the criminals. She later rewards the Dragonborn with the title of Thane as they are known throughout the hold and bought Honeyside in Riften. The Raid &edit [edit source] A conversation with Wujeeta makes the player aware that she is part of Riften's skooma ring and offers an option to tell Jarl Laila Law-Giver, she would still be in power. If this option is complete, the Jarl reveals that she is already well aware of the skooma dealers in the Riften Warehouse, and offers the task of suppressing the skooma operation. They have long tried to track down the elusive skooma of dealers. Alternatively, in the event of an Imperial victory, a similar take place, this time between Maven, Laila and Legate Legate (Oddly enough, Rikke's lines are pronounced and credited to Galmar.):[1] Maven: I think I'd love living here. Laila: So enter Maven Black-Briar, the glimmer of Imperial coin in her eyes. So tell me, what's the price for a woman's integrity these days? When you try to become Thane from Riften and after purchasing Honeyside, upgrading or entering home before returning to the Jarl will remove the dialog options needed to complete the quest. That permanently leaves 'Return to Jarl of Riften' in the player's quest journal. This error applies only if Laila Law-Giver Jarl of Riften is during the above quest. This error was not addressed in patch 1.3.10 and there is no known solution for consoles. Update: it was addressed and fixed in the latest patch (1.4). However, there is a new error that recently discovered. In one case (so far) Laila Law-Giver disappears from sight. According to the player, when she was his in the building in which Laila Law-Giver lives, Laila, without going on her own, holed up in the air, flew back and disappeared into a wall. The player then found her just outside the entrance to the same building with the same effect. As of yet, the developer and forums have not yet picked up this error. PC Solution: [player.setstage FreeformRiftenThane 200] will give you the Title Thane of Riften and the Reward for the Quest 'Return to Jarl van Riften' 360 PS3 Sometimes you don't get the option to buy a home and become Ase van Riften from Laila Law-Giver. This may be because you have a previous diverse quest that left the people of Riften incomplete. When you become Thane, she doesn't give you a sword of the split, but she gives you a randomly enthralling weapon without a unique name.
