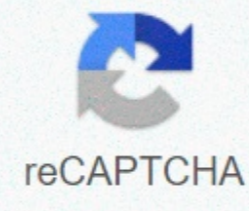

All SC students, including students who have received financial assistance or scholarships, must either pay tuition and balance the fees in full at the time of registration or register for the payment plan within 24 hours of enrolling in their classrooms or their classrooms will be dropped. Registration is now open for Kellogg Community College classes offered during the summer semester 2019, which begins may 13. The college offers hundreds of departments from about 140 different classes this summer at universities in Albion, Battle Creek, Coldwater and Hastings. Students can for classes online or in person on all campus sites. In addition, this summer, the college also offers dozens of training modules that are part of KCC's industrial craft programs, which are open to entry, meaning students can complete them on their own time on the college's regional manufacturing technology center campus at Fort Coster Industrial Park. The first semester of the KCC summer semester begins on Monday, May 13, and ends on Thursday, August 8. Students are encouraged to participate in the classroom as soon as possible after opening the registration door because the space is limited and many classes are filled at the beginning of the semester. Student registration information, including links to registration instructions, policies, tuition fees and other information, is available online www.kellogg.edu/registration. Specific KCC courses can be found during the summer semester by visiting www.kellogg.edu, clicking on classroom schedules at the top of the page and filtering results through the semester. Parents will be informed closer to time if any adjustments to the assessment process are required because of the recent closure of schools for most children. Read the KCC's AdmissionS Privacy Notice. Any request for special testing arrangements for children with special needs or disabilities is to be made by their school before July 10, 2020.If you moved to Kent after the Kent test, or if your child is not tested and you want to transfer him from his current high school to a secondary school, please read our information about moving to a different school. Your child must have been born between September 1, 2009 and August 31, 2010 to be tested in Kent 2020. If your child is out of this age But you still need an app please email kentonlineadmissions@kent.gov.uk.If you live outside KentMost years, many children living outside Kent register to take the test but do not show up today. Others take the test, but do not apply for Kent schools. With restrictions to limit the transmission of the virus it will be particularly difficult to arrange a test for thousands of visitors. Please register only if your child needs to take the Kent test because you intend to apply. The test is only valid for Kent Grammar Schools. Medway Council has its own Midway test and London Borough of Bexley has its own Bexley selection test. Many children will find it difficult to test. Grammar schools in Kent provide children at about 25% higher than the capacity range. In addition, some grammar schools in Kent - particularly those that are likely to provide places for children outside Kent - give priority to those with the highest grades. You may want to discuss your child's academic achievement with his primary school before deciding whether you want to enroll her in the Kent Test.The Kent Test does not guarantee your child a place in a secondary school in Kent. Make sure you know where kent grammar schools are, and what admission criteria for the school (s) you are interested in. You can search for Kent Grammar Schools while looking for Kent schools. Think about how likely your child is to get a place there, and how you can get to that school if a place is offered. If you need help with the cost of home-to-school transportation, check if your child is eligible for free transportation at school. School admissions are coordinated among local authorities. Even if your child is eligible for admission to a high school in more than one area, all your favorite schools must be included in the local authority application form in your home, and no more than one school place will be displayed. Independent schools have their own admissions processes. If your child is disabled or has special educational needs if your child has a disability or special educational need that may affect the way he or she takes the test, you need to discuss this with your current school's Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO) as soon as possible. When your child registers for the Kent online test, you will need to confirm whether you have discussed a request for access arrangements with your child's school.
