[1] It is the first in a series of novels by Amelia Peabody and takes place between 1884-1885. [2] A summary of Amelia Peabody's plot is left to a wealthy orphan after the death of her diligent father, who left her everything in his will because she is the only one of his children who shared his interests, namely history and archaeology. Heritage allows her to travel abroad so she can follow her passion for antiques. Amelia, a determined and unorthodox English woman, supports women's suffrage and believes she will never marry. (She believes that she is unattractive and will neither submit to men nor submit.) In Rome, she meets the depraved Evelyn Forbes, whose family rejected her after she ran off with an Italian art teacher. Amelia takes Evelyn under her wing and employs her as a companion. They travel together to Egypt, where they meet the Emerson brothers, Radcliffe and Walter, an archaeologist and philologist, and where Amelia falls in love with the pyramids. Amelia and Evelyn decide to travel around the Nile and stop at different places along the way. When they get to Amarna, they discover the Emersons digging up a city that was for a while the capital of Egypt under the mysterious Achnaton. Amelia and Radcliffe Emerson hate each other, but after being sick and she helps keep his digs going, they reluctantly begin to respect each other. Evelyn is attracted to Walter, but she's convinced she'll never get married because of her dirty reputation. Things get complicated when Evelyn's cousin Lucas appears in a remote location with a story about his grandfather's death, his (Lucas') inheritance, and a marriage proposal. Between romantic entching and attempts to continue digging, Emerson and Amelia also have to deal with night visits to the mummy that passes through the desert. Once the mystery is solved, Amelia plans to stay in Egypt and conduct her own archaeological expeditions, with Emerson by her side... as her advisor and as her husband. The tone of the novel (like the rest of the series) is witty to the point of parody and pokes fun at the many periods of mores and stereotypes, as well as sensationalized novels popular at the time. Elizabeth Peters' background of Egyptology lends authenticity to settings and history in the novel, especially the way of traveling by boat (dahabeeyah) along the Nile, which was popular at the time, as well as the customs of different cultures. Title The title of the book, like many novels by Amelia Peabody, comes from an ancient Egyptian text: The love of my beloved is on the other side the width of the water is between us and the crocodile is waiting on the sandy shore. It gives a great background to this fabulous woman who will knock socks off anyone who loves a strong female protagonist.
