the triangle and only 45 minutes from the Fayetteville area. The first emotion you're likely to experience at Raven Rock is one of renewals. Here, the timeless cycle of evolution as forest every year further heals the centuries-old lesions inflicted by man. Nature's triumph as plants compete in stages of forest succession
and woodlands are restored. The Raven Rock stands high above the Cape Fear River, a testament to its austere beauty forces that have shaped the land. As the river below rushes to join the sea, elements of nature continue to shape the surface of this natural monument. Spend some time at Raven Rock State Park and
let nature refresh your soul. Raven Rock State Park sits along the Fall Area, an area where the hard, resistant cliffs of the foothills gives way to soft cliffs Sediments of coastal plains. Over the centuries, flowing water and swirling winds gradually eroded land, carving and raven rock sculpture. This huge crystalline
structure rises to 150 feet and stretches for more than a mile along the Cape Fear River. The rock was originally called Patterson Rock for an early settler who found refuge there when his canoe sank nearby. In 1854, its name was changed to Raven Rock, formerly inspired by the sight of ravens roosted on rock leges.
Sioux and Tuscore Indians hunted the region until European settlers in the mid-1700s. Previously settler hunters and trappers were looking for similar areas of their native country, Scotland. Later, they built stores, mills and mines. Many woodlands were laid in the field, and as soon as the forest returned, most of the land
was harvested for wood. A road from Raleigh to Fayetteville crossed the Cape Fear River through the Northington Ferry and served as the region's premier transport route. Riverside locks and dams were built to facilitate navigation by boat, and the Raven Rock River became an important milestone for pilots. After a
storm destroyed locks and dams in 1859, structures were not replaced; Rail transport eliminated the need for river travel. As new roads were built, the yacht was closed and Raven Rock became a popular entertainment spot. The remains of the Northang lock and dam are seen in the park. In 1965, interest in preserving
the area as a state park grew, and local citizens organized support for the project. In 1969, a bill establishing Park was passed in the General Assembly. More than 220 acres of land were purchased and another 170 acres donated by Burlington Industries. Additional tracts have been purchased since then, bringing the
park to a current size of 4,684 acres. The new Moccasin Branch Campground at Raven Rock State Park is located at 814 Moccasin Branch Road, just before the main entrance to the park. This campground offers new opportunities for camp at Raven Rock. The campground is a bathroom with toilets and hot showers
available to all campers. There are also potable water spigots and garbage and recycling bins around the campground (\$5, cash only) is available for purchase. Nine RV sites (sites 11 to 18 and 22) provide full hook-ups with 50 amp, 30 amp, and a 20 amp outlet for all
RV needs, as well as full water and sewer. Long driveways can accommodate RV of all sizes. Each site has a campfire ring with a tent pad, a grill, a picnic table and lantern hooks. The site has 22 wheelchairs accessible. Fifteen additional sites (sites 1 to 10; 19 to 21; and 23 to 24) provide drive-to experiences for tent
and trailer campers. These sites each have a tent pad (25 ft x 25 ft) that includes space for two large tents, with one Ring, a picnic table, and a lantern hook. These sites do not have RV hookups. Please visit the campground directly and your site when you arrive. Staff will come around to check you in. > Moccasin
Branch Campground: Tourist Cabins Six rustic camper cabins offer the opportunity to get away from it all. Each cabin can accommodate up to six people; One bedroom has a queen bed (sleeps two) and the other room sleeps four with two sets of twin-sized bunk beds. Campers should bring their pillows and sleeping
bags or linen, as they are not provided. The cabin has electric outlets and heating and air conditioning units. There are no toilets inside the cabin, and water spigots. A tent pad with a picnic table, a fire ring, a charcoal grill, two Adirondack chairs, and a lantern hook are
provided in each cabin. Cabin 3 is wheelchair accessible. Smoking, cooking and open flames are not allowed inside any cabin. With the exception of service animals, pets are not allowed in the cabin. Each cabin has parking space for only two vehicles. The tourist cabin has a two-night minimum for rental. > Bag
Camping Raven Rock also offers a primitive backpacking experience in the park's main use. At the family's wilderness camp, there are five camps just off the Campbell Creek Loop Trail, about 2.5 miles from the parking lot and 0.5 miles from the river. The maximum number of campers for each site is six. Backpackers
can also use canoe camp located next to the closed river of the Little Creek Loop Trail in a lower area. The camping area has an increase of 1.7 miles from the park office. There are six camping, each adjusting to six campers. All supplies, including water, must be packaged for sites. Neither the family's wildness nor the
canoe camp is accessible by vehicle. Before camping, please check and register your vehicle at the visitor center. Both camping areas offer a vault toilet, and all sites include a fire ring with a grill. > Camping in paddle can paddle down the daring Cape Fear River Canoe Trail and spend a cozy evening at Raven Rock
Canoe Camp. There are six camping, each adjusting to six campers. This camping area offers a vault toilet, and includes a fire ring with grill in all sites. There is no kayak or canoe launch inside Raven Rock State Park. Please make a reservation before starting any paddling journey to assure that the camp is available.
Important information check-in and check-out bar check-in is 3p.m at Raven Rock State Park and check-out is at 12p.m. Bag campers should check in with park staff at Main Access no later than 6 p.m their reservation day. On reaching campers at the Moccasin Branch Campground can proceed directly to the
campground at 814 Moccasin Branch Road and set on them Staff will come around to check you in. Some parks may quickly adjust check-in or late check-outs depending on the reservation schedule and site availability. Please contact the park to make such arrangements: raven.rock@ncparks.gov or 910-893-4888.
Facilities are not all the same facilities of camping. Read camping information on the reservation website to view photos of camping; Check availability and fees; Find out whether a specific site is wheelchair accessible, has access to water, bathrooms or pit toilets, or has RV hookups; Learn more and other important
information. Gate Access Park gates are closed and closed at the closing time posted for your safety. After the time of closure, neither will it have to get out nor enter the gates. All visitors who spend the night need to be out by closing time. If you leave the park and do not return before closing time, you will not be able to
enter again. Check with The Park during office hours for emergency phone numbers after hours. Changes and cancellations you can now cancel online reservation website. Please note that there is a \$6 fee per night for cancellation of reservations. The fee will be deducted
from your refund. If you need to make changes to your reservation, please call reservation number 1-877-722-6762. You can't switch dates, camping or parks using your account online – you'll be charged a cancellation fee even if you book a new site. In case of closure for the campsite, campground or the entire park,
you will be automatically contacted by the reservation system to cancel or change your reservation. You will receive a full refund to cancel due to the park closure. Camping rates per night include a \$3 reservation fee at all rates listed above * Camper cabins require a minimum stay of two nights. To remain.
