The original official flag has 13 stripes and 13 stars, both as symbols of the first colony. In 1794, Kentucky and Vermont were added to the Union, resulting in a 15-star flag, 15 stripes, which inspired Francis Scott Key, the Spangled Star Banner, which was written after the battle at Fort McHenry during the 1812 war. 4. There is no written record of Betsy Ross as the creator of the American flag. Most stories were unheard of until the 1870s, when Ross's nephew William Canby brought it up to the Historical Society of Pennsylvania. The family swore by oral history and government payment records to Betsy Ross seemed to suggest that what they were saying was true. 5. The color of the flag is a symbol of red stands for white courage, meaning purity and blue, stands for perseverance and justice. Most of us spend 30 seconds every day during our childhood, pledged to the flag, many of us don't know what it's like. It turns out that the red, white and blue symbols of our freedom have undergone a lot of changes over the years, and there are a lot of people giving credit for being the current staple. 1 in 13 designs today is our second flag. The first one was known as continental color and was used at the time of the Declaration of Independence in July 1776, rather than the star it featured with a small version of the British flag, 2 out of 13. That union is thirteen white stars in the blue field represented a new constellation of 3 out of 13 soldiers helping design the wood. When soldiers at Fort Schuyler heard about the first official flag adoption, they cut off their shirts to make white stripes, used their blue Union uniforms for squares and more to create their own versions to proudly wave, 4 of the 13 flags were first flown on August 3, 2014. It was during the battle at Fort Schuyler during the Siege of Fort Stanwix, above, a recreation of the Battle of Princeton, which took place a few months later in New Jersey on January 3, 1777, 5 of the 13 origins of the flag is unknown, although many believe that the 13-star historian (representing the original colony) and stripes were designed by New Jersey Congressman Francis Hopkinson and stitched by the Philadelphia seam, Betsy Ross. The 27-year-old is, of course, many times the stripes are included and taken away, and there is a star every time a new state is established. The latest update took place in the 1960s, when the 50th star was added to represent the state of Hawaii, 7 out of 13 days were designed by 17-year-old Robert G. Heft, credited with designing the current 50-star flag as a high school project, interesting enough that he received a B – but his teacher later raised it as an A after the design was selected by Congress 8. Of the 13 golden edges not used until 1800, the use of the edges was first recorded in 1835, but the Army did not use it until 1895. Of the 13 flags inspired our national anthem. Francis Scott Key was so inspired after seeing the American flag flying over Baltimore's Fort McHenry after the British bombing in 1814 that he wrote that the Star-Spangled Banner later became our national anthem in 1931, 10 out of 13 and its pledges. Similarly, James B. Upham and Francis Bellamy wrote allegiance's pledge to honor the flag in 1892, which was first published in a magazine called Companion Youth 11 of 13. Back in 1824, a sea captain named William Driver dubbed the 10-foot, 17-foot flag an old glory. After the Civil War, his daughter and niece were angry that they owned the original flag. So in 1922, the two flags were hung in the National Museum of American History, where they remained today, 12 of the 13 days the flag became a national holiday in 1949.
