High School Codes are explained below: Correct mention of the CEEB Code is extremely important for the accurate and timely processing of the application you submitted. A student must provide not only the name and address of the university, but also the CEEB code, to ensure that his or her transcript is sent correctly. The College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) code numbers are required to register for any ACT or SAT program tests and to send your score reports to colleges and scholarship programs. CEEB code is also called ATP code. A CEEB code is a standardized ID number assigned to a high school, college, or university by the College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB). These CEEB codes are issued by the Educational Testing Service (ETS). These 4 to 6 digit codes are used in college entrance exams such as the SAT and ACT. Many universities use these CEEB codes on their applications. You choose these codes while you are registering online or when you send your Scores. If you need your CEEB code number for study and scholarship programs, test centres or secondary schools, use the CEEB, ACT, SAT code search link at: at: Federal School Code: In case you're thinking about getting help to fund your education, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), you want the information sent to the schools you want to attend so that you need to enter the Federal School Code for those schools on your application. The FAFSA is basically a need analysis form to help the Department of Education determine your eligibility for financial aid and the amount. Number (SSID) Many California colleges and universities ask for the (SSID) as part of their admissions process. Students attending a California K-12 public school receive a Statewide Student Identifier assigned by CSIS (the California School Information Services). This unique 10-digit number allows the Department of Education to meet federal reporting requirements. As a student progresses from year to year and from school to school, this number is not used in the admissions process; it helps universities to support federal requirements for reporting student training over time. Students can obtain their Statewide Student ID through their school counselor, registrar or their school staff. It is also printed on high school transcripts. California State University (CSU) SAT Score Release Code In case you use the College Board's online score reporting service, you direct your SAT scores to all campuses at California State University by choosing the CSU Mentor code number 3594 Q: I have an SSN through DACA, do I put it on my DREAM application or should I just list all the zeros? A: If you have an SSN, enter it here. If you don't have an SSN but do have an ITIN, enter that number. If you have both numbers, enter your SSN. If you do not have any of the numbers, then leave this question blank. Q: My parents have an ITIN, do they put that on the FAFSA or just all the zeros? A: For Dream Applicants, if your parent has both an SSN SSN an ITIN, let them enter their SSN. If your parent doesn't have an SSN or ITIN, enter 00000000000. If you submit an FAFSA, enter all zeros. Q: Where can I find the Statewide Student Identification Number (SSID)? Do I need it? A: You have the 10-digit SSID only if you attended a California public high school. Otherwise, leave this question blank. You find your SSID on your high school transcripts or you call your high school. Q: One of my parents was deported, and the other is still have the details of the deported parents. Q: I (or my parents) have a cash job (work under the table). Do I still need to report that income through the FAFSA/DREAM app? A: Yes, you report this information under question 88/89 from your FAFSA/DREAM app asking you to report your parents' salary, tips, ect. Q: My parents worked outside the country, do I still have to report their income through the DREAM app? What happens if I'm selected for verification? A: Income earned in a foreign country is treated the same as income earned in the U.S. Convert all figures to U.S. dollars, using the exchange rate in effect on the day you complete the Dream Act Application. You will find information about current exchange rates at www.federalreserve.gov/releases/h10/current.Include the value of any taxes paid to the foreign government in the U.S. income tax paid rule item. Q: My parents lived outside the country, and I live with my aunt. Is she my guardian? Am I independent of that? A: A foster parent, legal guardian, or grandparent or other family member is not treated as a parent for purposes of submitting a Dream Act Application unless that person has legally adopted the applicant. An adoptive parent is treated in the same way as a biological parent on the Dream Act Application. This doesn't make you an independent student. Q: I have DACA, does that make me an eligible non-citizen? A: Deferred actions can obtain a work permit. Q: Do I need to report all scholarships and grants I have received on the financial aid application? Where do I report it? A: You only need to report your scholarships and grants received on your adjusted gross income. If you did, you report this information on call 44d of your Dream Application. Q: Are work studies income taxable? Do I have to notify them about the financial support application? A: Work-study income should be reported as taxed income on demand dream app / FAFSA. Q: I was an RA last year, you will receive an email from our office to let you know the amount in dollars you need to report on your FAFSA/Dream App. You report this amount in dollars on the untaxed earnings section of the Dream Application under call 45 (g). Q: Do I need to report my current cash, savings and checking accounts? It changes every day. A: You report the amount to your savings/checking accounts from the day you submitted your Dream Application. Q: Do I need to submit a GPA verification form if I received a Cal Grant last year? A: No, you don't. For students who received Cal Grant last year, we will submit GPA verifications electronically on their behalf. Q: I'm a UCSC student who didn't get a Cal Grant last year, but I think I might be eligible this year, should I submit a form? A: Contact our office at 831-459-2963 to determine whether you should submit a form. Q: I attended high school (or another university) last year and didn't get a Cal Grant last year, but I think I might be eligible for the Cal Grant last year, should I submit a form? A: If you went to high school, you may be eligible for the Cal Grant High School Entitlement Award.
