The Estherville Lincoln Central School Board has learned about some of the plans already in place to make the environment as safe as possible for learning. Last Friday, Iowa Gov. Kim Reynolds issued a proclamation announcing the opening of schools this fall. ELC Superintendent Tara Paul said she expected more guidance from the state, probably by August 1. Under current guidelines, the school will start with face-to-face classes. We need to have 50 percent or more training in our buildings, so based on the plans we have, that's the only option we have right now, Paul said. During the meeting, Paul discussed the temperatures the students will be taken at the beginning of the school day. She didn't know either how the bus would work, but if a student has a temperature of 100.4, they cannot get on the bus. Paul said that perhaps a TA (associate teacher) will be on the bus to help take time. She said A's and secretaries can help take time out at school. In other cases, the school board ordered Paul to hire a second nurse for the year. Sandy Fandel, a member of the ELC school board, made the suggestion. Suggestion, recommends one school nurse for every 750 students, Fandel said. We're a little bit below that. Christina Dunlavy is the current nurse for the entire school district. During this pandemic, Fandel suggested that at least one part-time nurse is needed. We have parents, teachers and nervous staff, said Jeff Soper, a member of THE ELC board of directors. Another nurse could help alleviate some of these fears. Paul said that if a second school nurse is hired, the district would not hire diabetic help. The ELC Board of Directors also approved changes to the school calendar. Classes will begin on Monday, August 24 for kindergarten to Grade 12. School officials are always planning how to hold current lectures at K-8 levels before the start of the school year to limit the number of people entering schools. In addition, the four dates scheduled for parent-teacher conferences will not have an early exit. Classes will take place at 3:30 p.m.m, with the following lectures. The Board approved an increase in the pay of substitute teachers from \$100 to \$115 per day for daily substitutes and from \$135 to \$150 for long-term substitute teachers. The board approved the following hires: Lee Hansen as a high school social studies teacher, wrestling head coach and college football coach; Jesse Nitchals as head cross-country coach, Amanda Zylstra as sponsor of the student council, and Martha Greenwald as patron of dance.
