Lowest expense=1; Highest=103 Monroe Municipal School District is a comprehensive community public school district that serves students in kindergarten through twelfth grade from Monroe Township, in Middlesex County, New Jersey, USA. [3] As of the school year 2018-19, the district, comprising eight schools, had a registration of 6,829 students and 533.1 class teachers (FTE), for student-teacher ratio of 12.8:1. [1] The district is classified by the New Jersey Department of Education as being in the FG District Factor Group, the fourth highest of eight groups. The District Factor Group organizes regions nationwide to enable comparisons with the common socioeconomic features of local districts. From the lowest socioeconomic status to the highest, the categories are A, B, CD, DE, FG, GH, I and J.[4] Students from Jamesburg attended the Monroe Township High School as part of a delivery/reception relationship with Jamesburg Public School established in 1980. [6] Awards and recognition During the 1991-92 academic school year, Mill Lake Elementary School received the National Blue Ribbon Award of Excellence from the US Department of Education, the highest honor that American schools could achieve. The tribute was followed in the 1998-99 academic school year at Barclay Brook Primary School. Monroe Township can now boast that both pre-K they go through third-grade schools receiving honors. [7] Curriculum In 1996 the New Jersey Department of Education revised the core curriculum of primary schools to require language classes In mid-October 1999 the regional questionnaires to 13,000 homes on what languages to teach to basic students. The district received 458 back. 271 of those questionnaires chose Spanish, 96 of the returned questionnaires showed preference for Mandarin Chinese and the remaining 91 requested other languages that included Latin, Russian, and English itself. Stephen E. Derkoski, assistant superintendent, noted that We cannot ignore that the houses of the area have priority Spanish over Chinese by 3 to 1.
